#### 1975 REVIEW

Although it was a disappointing end to a promising season, the club achieved many successes. A number of records were created.

When we headed the First Grade competition after the first game of the season - against Queanbeyan - it was the first time we had done so. We held the position for four weeks.

In the third game of the season against West Canberra on April 19 we recorded our biggest win. The margin was 135 points. In the same game we also kicked our highest score. We won 29.13 (187) to 7.10 (52).

Two weeks later on May 4 we beat Ainslie for the first time. In doing so we also won the 'Cock of the North' trophy for the first time.

We created another record in the last home and home game when we beat Queanbeyan. The win gave us our highest number of wins in a season - 12.

The most popular record established would have been that by rover, Robert White. He became the first Belconnen player to win the Mulrooney Medal.

Our Second Grade created history when they became the first senior side to win a finals game when they beat ANU in the Elimination Final. They went on to become the first Belconnen senior side to play in a Preliminary Final. They also created history by beating Ainslie and Eastlake for the first time.

The Third Grade ended the home and home games in the best position of the three senior sides. They finished third. Another outstanding effort was that produced by David Bennett who won the CANFL Best and Fairest award for the Third Grade.

#### VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The success of a football club depends to a large extent upon the administration behind the players who form the teams in the various grades of competition. I have been fortunate to have good support from a number of people who have been closely associated with our club since its inception. The junior teams have been administered by a relatively new, but keen committee, which has introduced some new ideas into the club. I congratulate the Junior Committee on the introduction of 'Centre Bounce' and trust that his very worthy publication will continue to grow in size and value as our club gains strength.

This year saw the appointment of Peter Johnson as the club's second playing coach of the Firsts and my congratulations to him for the success he gained. Congratulations are also extended to Cleve Weatherill and John Stankevicius for the success they achieved with their teams.

Ours is a comparatively youthful team with a number of good young players coming up through the junior ranks. This augurs well for the future, but success will not come easily. It can only be achieved through skill, fitness and dedication. There is little doubt that we have as much skill and potential as any other team in the competition but there is a need for freater fitness and dedication on the part of some players.

Apart from the success on the field we have, through the efforts of our committee, had a successful year financially. I would be failing in my duty if I did not make mention here of the wonderful work of Diane Baguley and the other ladies who assisted with the catering stall at our home matches. Catering at these matches has been a new source of revenue to our club. Thank you also to those supporters who manned the beer stall. Our financial position is now better than at any other time in the history of the Belconnen Football Club, but this does not mean that we can relax our fund raising efforts. We should strive to build up a reserve for the future.

The committee's funds do not permit us to pay more than a few contract players and I pay tribute to the wonderful work of the Supporters Group, under the leadership of Tom Allison, for their efforts in raising money to ensure that each first grade player is paid some match payment for games played. More support here would enable the players to receive more than a token payment, as is the case at present.

I extend my congratulations to all trophy winners and special congratulations to Robert White and David Bennett on the awards they won.

In conclusion I would like to thank sincerely all members of the committee, the donors of award money and all those other people who have assisted me during the year.

#### SECONDS TEAM 1975

Mike Drekovic was our captain and Pat Sheedy our vice-captain.

The entry of 1974 Under 19 players into senior ranks gave early indications that the seconds team would be more talented than teams of previous seasons. Queanbeyan defeated us in our first game and this brought home to players that talent alone does not win matches.

For most of the season the team lacked confidence and desperation. Against Ainslie, Manuka, Eastlake and ANU our opponents built a commanding lead in the first quarter but we recovered to be within 3 or 4 goals by the end of the game. We generally had no trouble defeating other teams. We finished fifth on the ladder after putting together four excellent quarters against Ainslie - minor premiers - in the last home and away game to win by 2 goals 3 behinds.

The team had arrived and was combining skills with confident pressure football. We defeated ANU in the Elimination Final and defeated Eastlake in the First Semi-Final.

Our Preliminary Final loss against Manuka was perhaps our best ball-winning effort for the season but a series of errors in our scoring zone cost us the chance to play in the Grand Final. In the third quarter the team kicked 4 goals 5 behinds but the 5 behinds resulted from kicks no more than 25 metres from goal and several other scoring situations failed completely.

In reaching the Preliminary Final and acquitting itself so well, the team showed vast improvement and has developed depth in our club strength which augurs well for the future.
