#### REVIEW OF 1976 SEASON

A season that for the Firsts at least, contained much that was unexpected, ended on a distressingly familiar note with Belconnen's defeat in the elimination final. The Seconds also disappeared from the hunt for a Premiership at that stage. The Thirds, by virtue of a forfeit, advanced a stage further but were defeated in the first semi-final.

The season began in an encouraging style. Eastlake were defeated by the Firsts in the opening game, 13.16 to 8.20. It was the first ever win over Eastlake, and late in the season it was repeated, just as handsomely, 12.16 to 6.18. The first win over Eastlake was followed by three more victories and at the end of May, Belconnen and Queanbeyan met as the only two undefeated sides. Belconnen lost, 12.7 to 15.15, then proceeded to lose five more games in a row, culminating in a defeat by West Canberra 17.11 to 10.9 in what was Belconnen's 100th senior game.

A revival followed, in which not only were Eastlake beaten for the second time, but the Cock of the North trophy was won from Ainslie with a 20.8 to 15.12 victory. The crucial game for entry into the Final Five was won against ANU with a splendid second-half recovery. 10.5 to 5.8 down at half-time, Belconnen kicked 7.4 to 2.3 to win by four points.

That marked the end of success for the season. Another loss to West Canberra followed, then in the elimination final, a half time score of Queanbeyan 13.13 Belconnen 1.1. told its own tale. The final score was 18.24 to 8.12.

During the year important players were lost to Belconnen. John Manson was unavailable, Stan Widera and Robert White left the club, Bill Quade and Bob Koehne were injured for long spells. All proved impossible to replace.

The Seconds found it difficult to match the "Big Three", but had one good win, 14.10 to 10.13, over ANU Seconds. Their value lay in the provision of players such as Whennan, Wigley, Falconer and Dannock who became established first-team members by the season's end.

The Thirds, called upon to provide players to fill gaps in both Firsts and Seconds, took advantage of weaker sides, but found Ainslie, Eastlake and Manuka too strong, although they ran Manuka close on one occasion, going down by only 5.7 to 6.5.

## VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 1976 season started with new coaches appointed to all three senior grades and with the hope that this year would be an improvement on our efforts of last year. However, we received some early set backs when some of the more experienced footballers from last year decided not to continue this year. This factor, together with the departure of Stan Widera to Glenorchy and Robert White to Wycheproof did not help a great deal. On the brighter side, we recruited some new players, the best of them being Robert Dawson, Michael Price and Steve Whennan.

As a result of an early start to the training program and the dedication of Cleve Weatherill, the players were fitter at the start of the season than in previous years. This fitness was generally maintained throughout the season and if we had a couple of tall players who could take the big mark around the ground, I am convinced that we would have advanced further than to the elimination final in both the first and second grade competition. Until we get players who can dominate in the air and at centre bounces, I am afraid that we can expect an early finish to each football season.

Along with fitness, the teamwork and dedication of our players improved this year. But dedication is the key; the greater the dedication the greater the fitness and teamwork.

I extend my congratulations to Cleve Weatherill for the success that he has achieved this year. Noteworthy were our two wins over Eastlake, a team we had not previously beaten in first grade competition. I also congratulate Barry Wight and Bill Cameron for their successes with teams which invariably had to be changed on the day of the match because players, through lack of dedication, failed to attend the match for which they had been chosen to play.

My congratulations also to Les Scotland and his committee for their efforts throughout the year, especially for the work to introduce our game to the schools in the area.

This year saw the introduction of a system of match payments to non-contract players based on service to the Club. These payments would not have been possible without the assistance of the Supporters Group, capably led by Bill Mandle and well supported by his committee.

Our financial position is better at the end of this season than it has been at the conclusion of any previous season, but much more money has to be raised through the summer months if we are to obtain the players we require.

I wish to place on record my appreciation of the work done by the ladies who conducted the catering stall at our home matches throughout the year. I thank you ladies! Thanks also to the ladies who laundered football jumpers through the year.

#### FIRST GRADE COACH'S REPORT

The team showed early season form by winning the first four games in convincing fashion including a victory over Eastlake by four goals. In our fifth game - against Queanbeyan - scores were level at the half way mark of the last quarter but Queanbeyan broke away and won by four goals. We then went on to lose our next five games. In all of these games, we played patches of excellent football but could not sustain the effort for a full game. During this period we experimented with positional changes and developed a pattern of play to suit our skills and lack of height. Our next win was against RMC and this preceded comfortable wins over Queanbeyan and Ainslie. We were then defeated by Manuka but registered two great wins against Eastlake and ANU only to be defeated by West Canberra in the last home and away game.

We finished in fifth position and played Queanbeyan in the elimination final. In the first half of this game, Queanbeyan, playing with greater determination and purpose, used their skills and superior speed to great advantage. When we gained possession around the ground, we were under such pressure that our passes rarely found other team mates. Our confidence was completely shaken and by half time Queanbeyan had scored 13.13 to our 1.1. With Queanbeyan lacking the same purpose and pressure in the second half our game developed. However, Queanbeyan were able to stay with us and maintained most of their first half lead to the end. Final scores were 18.24 to 8.12. This was a very disappointing finish to a season which included some notable achievements. We defeated Eastlake twice and Ainslie once - in previous seasons at best we could only manage one win against any of the "Big Three". The highlight of our season, however, was our win over ANU towards the end of the season, to consolidate fifth position. We were down six goals in the third quarter but through concentration and disciplined play we bridged the gap to win by four points. Our players must learn to maintain this attitude for the entire period of all games, and not to lapse as they so often did during the season.

Most of our team put great effort into their training both before and during the season, but this is only part of having a more professional approach to their game. Some of our players would be much sharper at training and during games if they cut back on their 'high living'. Until they are prepared to make sacrifices and work on their game, they will not improve.

Eight of our regular players this season were under 21 years of age and this augers well for the future. But we badly need marking power around the ground and the ability to win the ball from the centre bounce for more than 50% of every game.

I have been fortunate to receive such able assistance from colleagues Barry Wight and Bill Cameron and to receive Brian Falconer's advice on the bench during games; his advice proved to be a great benefit. Our captain Jim Calvert, vice captain Bob Koehne and Chairman of Selectors Tom Allison have all given me loyalty and great cooperation throughout the season and, through their efforts on the field, became the backbone of the team.

In conclusion, I thank Don Johnston and his committee for their support during the season as well as Team Manager Frank Goddard, together with Trainers Andy Anderson, Dave Macilwain and Col Enright for presenting me with a well prepared team each week.

Special recognition is made of the work of Gary Schmidt, Michael Goynich and Peter Bradley who recorded statistics for me during each game.

Although we did not retain our position on the premiership ladder, after being third in 1975, I was nevertheless pleased with our efforts in 1976.

Of the seventeen minor round matches played, we won eight to finish fifth in the competition. In the Elimination Final we fielded a good combination of youth and experience. Although we battled hard, we were not up to the task of beating Manuka, losing 15.21 to 9.6.

During the season a total of forty-eight different players participated in Seconds games. Twenty of these played their first Seconds games, fourteen played in the Firsts and eight were still eligible for Thirds.
