REVIEW OF 1977 SEASON

Despite the lack of new faces this season, the three senior teams made the final four. The return to the final four resulted from the withdrawal from the competition of the RMC Club.

As has been the case in previous years, the teams did not manage to capitalise on some good performances during the season. The firsts were defeated in the first semifinal by Eastlake. The seconds fared better, but were defeated by the eventual premiers, Ainslie, in the preliminary final. The thirds made fourth position, but were well beaten by Manuka in the first semi-final.

The start of the season was not encouraging; the firsts losing the first five games. However, they improved to win 8 of the following 13 to make the "four". The most vital game for the firsts was the final home and away game against West Canberra.

This game was a must in order to make the finals and this was achieved with a 12 point victory. However, Belconnen were no match for Eastlake in the semi-final, being defeated 17.13 to 13.12.

During the season Ray Baguley, Robert Goddard and Tom Allison, in that order, played their 100th game for the Club; the only players to have reached this milestone for Belconnen.

The seconds had an excellent season and achieved a Club record by winning 11 games in succession and finishing second to Manuka on the ladder. Unfortunately, that was their final achievement for the season, being defeated by Manuka in the second semi-final and by Ainslie, the eventual premiers, in the preliminary final.

The third grade competition was depleted by the withdrawal of both Queanbeyan and West Canberra. This left six teams in the competition, which, with the resulting byes, meant that Belconnen played only 15 out of 21 originally scheduled games for the season.

Despite this, the team made fourth position, but were beaten by Manuka in the semi-final 14.20 to 6.2.

Season 1977 saw the Club with new coaches in each grade, namely, Kevin Hasset - First Grade; Winston Gregory - Second Grade and Dave Macilwain - Third Grade. At the time of going to print, Kevin has been re-appointed as First Grade coach for season 1978.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 1977 season has been one of some success, with all grades reaching the finals, but as has happened in past seasons eventuated once again, the bowing out of all teams without winning a finals match.

A talented young first grade team which defeated Eastlake twice and Ainslie once and on two occasions led this years premiership team Manuka by five goals in the third quarter, failed to produce their top form on the day in the first semi-final against Eastlake.

Our first grade coach, Kevin Hasset, has done an admirable job. The team was short on big men and two key position players. Kevin had to juggle the team on many occasions but nearly always he was proven right and coached the team to its highest ever position.

Winston Gregory's seconds looked as if they were certainties after winning eleven games on end and finishing second on the ladder, but it was not to be, they played two finals and lost both.

I believe Dave Macilwain deserves special mention for the task he performed with a team that never stopped trying but was outclassed. He maintained great enthusiasm right throughout the year.

The financial position has improved, but as in the past, too much is left on the shoulders of too few. We must not sit back and think that poker machines will be the answer to all our problems. The costs of playing three teams next season will be even larger.

Congratulations go to the Belconnen Juniors on a great season. When one looks through the three senior teams, all but a very few have been juniors and we must do our best to encourage them in every way.

Congratulations go also to our trophy winners in the senior competition.

A special mention to Peter Taylor equal WINNER in the League third grade best and fairest. Peter played most of the season in the firsts. A very good effort indeed.

The appreciation of the Committee goes to all those people who unselfishly gave their time to serve behind the catering stall at the games.

I would like to record my thanks to the Committee for their support and advice throughout the year.

I congratulate also players whose performances this year have won for them special recognition by way of awards, and Ray Baguley, Rob Goddard, Tom Allison, Steve Taylor, Mal Manson and Mick Suidgeest for reaching notable milestones in their respective careers.

All associated with the Club must at this stage be aware of a growing determination and enthusiasm towards achieving our ultimate target in bringing a senior premiership to Belconnen. Please make resolutely certain that that determination and enthusiasm is encouraged to flourish by your own active support.

Finally, might I express my appreciation to all the players for their efforts and to Mr Bill Cameron and the Committee for their support.

APPRECIATION

The Club once again takes this opportunity and, indeed, is proud to acknowledge the help given by those people who have assisted in the operation of the Club during 1977. Without this support, the task of presenting the senior teams each week would be much more difficult.

As has been stated previously, the task of writing this section of the Report is not without risk, if only for the reason that someone will be overlooked. In this event, the offended can be assured that it has occurred unintentionally.

A number of functions and special efforts were conducted during the season and these are reported on briefly hereunder.

The traditional Cup Eve Nite, highlighted by the Calcutta draw, was held for the first time at the Club premises and was organised by Bill Cameron and Jack Walding, who were ably assisted by a number of the players.

The Club once again conducted a stall at the Canberra Show, with Ray Baguley as chief organiser and assisted by the Committee, and players, too numerous to mention individually.

The reintroduction of a mid-season cabaret this year, whilst not being supported as well as was hoped, proved to be an enjoyable function. The venue was the Belconnen Way Hotel, with Ray Baguley once again carrying out the ground work.

The Club best and fairest vote counting night was staged at the Club with Jack Walding, Brian Falconer and Frank Goddard at the helm.

Thanks to the imagination and zeal of Ray Baguley, the usual Silver Circle activity was replaced by the popular Pot-of-Gold, which is continuing and will complete in December. In order that 1000 books could be sold, it was necessary for Ray to seek the assistance of a number of sellers and collectors; this he organised in his usual style.

Since the end of season 1976, the trailer raffles were conducted. The first two were organised by the late Cleve Weatherill and the third, which will be drawn late in October, by Peter Franklin. Tickets were sold in public places by players and Committee men on a roster basis.

This year's annual Presentation Ball was organised by Ray Baguley and Frank Goddard, assisted by Jack Walding and a number of the players. Helen Goddard is responsible for the typing of this report and Clive Lowes for the printing.

The Committee this year was pleased to welcome Jack Burgess, who took over the task of Team Manager of Third Grade. Frank Goddard and Arthur Wigley continued as Team Managers for the First and Second Grade teams respectively.

Special mention is made of a group of our Junior Club players for their assistance. To Dean Falconer, in particular, who carried out the function of Assistant Team Manager for the First Grade team at all games during the season. To Daryl Scotland, who together with his mates, manned the scoreboard on a number of occasions. The same lads also assisted in clearing up an often litter strewn Jamison Oval after home games.

To assist the senior coach and match Committee, Peter Bradley and Greg Watt took on the onerous task of compiling players statistics during each game. A sincere vote of thanks goes to them all. Such support from our junior players augers well for the future of the Club.

Garry Schmidt accepted the unenviable task of organising and operating the catering stall at home matches. He was supported by a willing group of workers.

Once again Reg Proctor was the Club's timekeeper for the three grades. Whilst Reg was absent on a sea cruise towards the end of the season, Jack Walding stepped up to the button and carried on the good work.

Weekly 'after the game' awards were organised by Jack Walding. The Club, in addition to the regular weekly donors, who wish to remain anonymous, was most generously supported by Harry Smith Motors of Fyshwick. Each week, a "Harry Smith Award" was presented to a selected player from each of the senior teams. The Hawker Auto Port also supported the awards by providing a petrol voucher each week to a selected First Grade player.

In addition, Kev Whittaker, the Club Manager, presented a weekly award to a selected player from the First and Second Grade teams.

This year, the Committee conducted raffles at the Club on Thursday and Friday nights, in addition to after match raffles. These were arranged by Ray Baguley, who was assisted by the players on a roster basis.

The players' end of season trip to the Gold Coast was arranged by a group comprising Peter Stubbs, Mick Suidgeest and Mick Price.

Mick Burgess was able to arrange two tree planting contracts during the year. The first of these was completed during the winter period. The work being carried out by a large team consisting of players and Committee men. Some 2,000 trees were planted. Headquarters for the operation was Bob and Moira Burgess' home at Giralang, where the hungry and thirsty toilers were very well looked after by Moira and Joan Burgess, Diane Baguley, Kay Dannock and Meryl Dawson.

The effort put in on this project netted the Club approximately \$3,500; of which \$1,500 boosted the players' end of season trip.

The second operation, which is still in progress, involves the planting of 3000 trees in the Macgregor area. It is hoped to nett \$3,000 from the exercise, half of which will be for the use of the players.

The Supporter's Group was reformed during the season, with Tom Allison as President, Tim Grant Vice-President, Don Johnston Secretary and Harry Phillips as Treasurer. They were supported by the following Committee: Jim Calvert, Winston Gregory, Bob Koehne and Barry Wight.

In conclusion, the Committee wishes to record its thanks to President Russell Brown and his Directors, to Kevin Whittaker and his staff and to all those associated with the Belconnen National Football Club for their assistance and co-operation throughout the year.
