

A WORD FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT....

In July, when I accepted the Board of Directors appointment as Football Vice-President I believed that the club was at a crucial stage of development. As a result of extensive pre-season recruiting several new players had joined the club and the challenge to improve our 1977 position was still present.

I was very pleased with the manner in which all players responded to the mid-season appointment of Neil Conlan as Senior Coach. New confidence and spirit soon developed and our steady approach towards our objective of making the Finals was highlighted by our historic first win against Manuka on 4 June. Our progress was jolted by a bad loss to Eastlake on 9 July and temporarily halted by the sudden death of Neil Conlan on 22 July. During Neil's short time with the club his great contribution was to convince our players that they had the ability to beat any team in the competition.

To succeed a coach like Neil Conlan is not an easy task, but Max Gibbs accepted the challenge and gradually players adjusted to their third coach for the season and rejoined the Finals race. Unfortunately we did not make the Grand Final but concluded the season loosing to Eastlake in the Preliminary Final, after defeating all teams in the competition and defeating Queanbeyan in the Minor Semi-Final. The first, 1st Grade final series win in the history of the club.

On your behalf I thank players and coaches, for their performances during this, the most disrupted season in our brief history.

While we were not able to enjoy the thrills and excitement of the 1978 1st Grade Grand Final we can look forward to 1979 with loads of confidence. I trust that in 1979 a fit Robert White, selected recruits and the experience of two 1978 finals will strengthen our team, lead us to a 1st Grade premiership and ensure that we can continue our efforts to establish the Club as a power in ACTAFL.

1978 was a tremendous year for the 2nds and the efforts of many were rewarded with our first 2nd Grade premiership. To those involved, the ultimate success makes all the work and effort worthwhile. I formally record my thanks and congratulations to those involved and I hope the taste of success spreads throughout the Club.

In conclusion I thank the Football Committee and our Secretary/Administrator who have assisted me so much in the busy job of Football Vice-President; the Board of Directors who have helped tremendously; and you the Club supporters who without your loyalty, encouragement and support our development as a football force would not be possible.

A WORD FROM THE COACH....

It was with a certain amount of apprehension that, in July of this year, I undertook the duties of Senior Coach of Belconnen in most unfortunate circumstances. For players to be faced with the prospect of a third coach within one year would have been a traumatic experience in any circumstances.

To continue the progress that had been started by past coaches and to ensure that the team was given every opportunity to succeed on the field to the best of its ability was the main task confronting me at the time. However, aware that I had the support of the Football Committee and faced with the need to do my best for the team and the Club, the task presented a great personal challenge.

Although not successful in our ambition to win a First Grade premiership I feel that the season ended on a high note and the foundation is there for a more successful season next year. The performance of the side in many games showed that the ability and spirit is there. We have taken the first step towards establishing ourselves as a top ACTAFL club. It must be the aim of this club to finish in one of the top two positions at the end of the home and away games next season. Players and Administrators must learn the lessons from this year; that the season does not start with the first game but, for successful clubs, many months before that with offseason training, a successful recruiting campaign and a well planned pre-season build up.

I would like to offer my personal thanks to all these people who showed their faith in myself and the team by working so hard in supporting roles. I refer to Team Managers, Trainers, Selectors, Runners, Football Committee Members and the many supporters who gave me encouragement during the latter part of the season. With the assistance of people of this type the club must go on to bigger and better things in the near future.

THE SEASON



The concentrated build up for the 1978 season was aimed at establishing Belconnen as a force in ACTAFL. Pre- season recruiting was extensive and early hard pre-season conditioning was intended to ensure that we picked up a number of early season wins which eluded us the previous year.

After a number of trial games, where many new recruits displayed their abilities we went into the first game full of confidence - the outcome, a 10 goal defeat by Queanbeyan came as a tremendous shock, however a great deal of confidence and self esteem was restored the following week by a magnificent win against Ainslie.

The following five weeks were reminiscent of the old Belconnen with wins over ANU and West Canberra and losses to Manuka, Eastlake and Queanbeyan. These losses led to a series of player and committee meetings to critically assess the team's performances and a number of changes resulted - a new Vice President-Football, Coach, Match Committee, Captain, Vice Captain and Football Committee.

The Club's first game after the changes resulted in a close loss to Ainslie 15.7 to 13.14 and over the next few weeks the team made steady improvement, recording an historic first win against Manuka on June 4 (by 9 goals after leading by 13 goals at three-quarter time). At this time players and supporters were talking about 'finals' with a confidence not previously seen at Belconnen. To everyone's surprise on 9 July we were jolted 'back to earth' by an 8 goal defeat at the hands of Eastlake. However we recovered brilliantly and the following week defeated Queanbeyan by 15 goals, with Chris Bowman kicking a new Club goal kicking record of 10 goals 6 points. Then came the death of Neil Conlan on 22 July.

This second upheaval in the Club in a few weeks was more than most players and Clubs would experience in a lifetime, and it was not surprising that a 5 goal loss to Ainslie and a 10 goal loss to Manuka followed. The 'regrouping' for the third time was difficult to say the least, however after trailing West Canberra by 3 goals at half-time on 5 August we turned 'the corner' and finished with a 9 goal win - our first win for the season at Phillip Oval. From there we went from strength to strength and concluded the minor round with a strong 2 goal win over top team Eastlake.

The preparation for the finals was first class and the boys played magnificantly to win the 1st Semi - Final against Queanbeyan by 27 points (17.14 to 13.11). The Club's first success in a Major Round.

The enthusiasm and dedicated effort continued over the next two weeks in preparation for the Clubs first Preliminary Final.

The first quarter of the Preliminary Final was exciting stuff; our boys played will and led by 2 goals at the first change - a lead they retained until the time-on period of the 2nd quarter when four quick goals gave Eastlake a 3 goal lead at the long break.

Inaccurate kicking in the 3rd quarter (5.5 to 4.1) meant that we started the last quarter trailing by 10 points. A determined effort early in the last quarter took us to within 2 points, however a costly miss from close in proved crucial and while we briefly gave ourselves a chance Eastlake steadied their game and played a very strong last quarter to run out winners by 7 goals.

Our failure to reach the Grand Final was a disappointment, however it is pleasing to record the Clubs most successful season was achieved under extremely difficult circumstances.

THE PLAYERS

1978 was Belconnen's first serious attempt to obtain recruits to supplement players already with the Club. After finishing 4th in 1977 very few senior players left the Club. Those who did included Ken Duryea (Southern Districts NSW - after 42 games), Graham Moss (ANU, after 30 games), John O'Dea (ANU, after 67 games), Peter Falconer (West Perth, WA, after 12 games), Greq Burgess and Mark Wigley.

During 1978, 41 different players took their places in a Belconnen 1st Grade side. Players who did so for the first time included:

- Laurie Moloney, the former Essendon backman who spent 1977 with Mayne, Qld played serviceably for the Club in a number of positions.
- Bob Randall, from Oakleigh and Fitzroy, Vic, quickly became an important cog in our team and achieved ACTAFL selection.
- . Max Johnston, from University High School Old Boys, Vic, fitted well into the team with his strong marking, intelligent ruckwork and handball.
- Andrew Bowden, a former Glenelg 2nds Captain and coach of Brighton High Old Scholars, SA, proved a valuable acquisition to the club as a rover or centreman.
- . Trevor O'Riley from South Australia, was unfortunately limited by persistent leg injuries to a few games, but showed his great ability in the final series.
- Chris Bowman, a top forward from ANU, finished the season as our top goal kicker and established a Club goal kicking record against Queanbeyan (10.6).
- . Joey Box, a young ruckman from Griffith, NSW, took a while to settle into the Club and much bigger things are expected of Joey in 1979.
- . Mal Crawford, from Melbourne and Tongala, Vic, was limited by injuries to 14 games, but showed strength and determination which should see him play many more games in 1979.
- Colin Milburn, a forward from Flinders Park, SA, took some time to settle in but made the most of his opportunities on a half-forward flank.

- Brian McCann, a backman from Albury, NSW, was just settling into the club when he was transferred in his employment.
- . Barry Slade, a backman from Whyalla, SA, fitted well into the club and played an important part in winning the 2nd Grade premiership.

Some of our younger brigade were given their first taste of 1st Grade football and all showed great promise. These included John Dess, Dave Tompsett, Andrew Brown and Tony Hills. These young fellows will each help to mould the Belconnen of the future.

Players who returned to the Club after an absence with other Clubs included Mick Chinnick (Surfers Paradise, Qld), Robert White (Wycheproofe, Vic) and Kim Birch (Ipswich, Qld). Unfortunately Mick and Robert received severe injuries which limited their number of games. Mick's consistent injuries robbed him of Captaincy and resulted in his retirement. Robert's injury, sustained whilst playing for the ACT, robbed us of our top rover and his presence was sadly missed in the final series. Hopefully, exercise or an operation will strengthen Robert's knee and he will be back again as good as ever in 1979.

A number of our regular players achieved a great deal in 1978, these include:

- . Stan Widera's clear cut win in our Best and Fairest, his selection in the ACTAFL sides and his typical strong game in the 1st Semi-Final.
- . John and Mal Manson played many brilliant games and both achieved ACTAFL slection.
- . Peter Taylor followed his 1977 win of the T.A. Wharton Trophy for 3rd Grade, with Runner-Up in the Club Best and Fairest. A great performance in his second year of 1st Grade Football.
- Noel O'Neill, for his best season since joining us from Ainslie.
- . Bob Randall, for his selection in the ACTAFL representative side.
- . Tom Allison, for his contribution to the Club since he came from North Melbourne in 1971. Tom, coached and captained Belconnen (and ACTAFL) during our early years, won our Best and Fairest in 1971 and 1976 and has coached junior sides over the past three years, for three premierships. Injuries and work finally caught up with Tom and he retired as a player during 1978. Thanks Tom for your tremendous service to the Club as a player and coach. It is hoped that Tom's administrative experience is available to the Club for many years to come.

The response of players to the coaching of Neil Conlan was quite remarkable; his strong discipline, tremendous knowledge and experience soon had players and supporters excited about our prospects for the remainder of the season. The sudden death of Neil dealt a severe blow to our finals chances and many felt we were 'gone'.

The despondence in the Club made the task of Max Gibbs extremely difficult, however Max's efforts were rewarded by our win over Eastlake, the 1st Semi-Final win over Queanbeyan and our performance in the Preliminary Final.

THE FOOTBALL COMMITTEE RECORD THEIR THANKS TO THESE THREE COACHES WHO EACH CONTRIBUTED THEIR BEST IN THE INTERESTS OF THE BELCONNEN FOOTBALL CLUB.

2nd GRADE

There were a number of reasons why there was a great deal of confidence amongst 2nds players early in 1978; we had finished Minor Premiers in 1977 (although unsuccessful in both finals appearances), and many recruits and juniors had strengthened our side.

The highlights of a good first round included a 10 goal win over Manuka (who defeated us in the 1977 finals), 20 goal wins over ANU and West Canberra and an 8 goal loss to Ainslie. The second round was not as successful and included a 6 goal loss to Ainslie, a 23 goal win over West Canberra, an unexpected loss to Manuka and and autrocious goal kicking effort against ANU - 3.19 to 4.1.

Following our third defeat by Ainslie early in the final round we proceeded to play some of our best football. The type of game developed was a credit to all and greatly assisted the preparation of players for 1st grade.

Our 2nd position on the ladder at the end of the minor round was a fair reflection of the season, but good late season form meant that there was an air of confidence in preparation for the Major Semi-Final. The record shows that our confidence was not misplaced, and after trailing by 8 goals early in the game a strong second half resulted in Ainslie's first defeat for the season and Belconnen moving straight into the Grand Final - the Club's first.

The Grand Final will live long in the memory of every player, the coach and every supporter who watched the game. The first quarter (7.1 to 2.3) included some magnificent football and was a tremendous start toward our first premiership.

The second quarter was even in terms of goals, but Ainslie successfully curbed our brilliance and trailed by 26 pts at the long break. Ainslie's good work continued through the 3rd quarter and although we made many changes our lead had been reduced to 7 pts at 'lemons'.

The last quarter was desperate football. Ainslie kicked two early goals which took them into the lead and for the first time we looked in trouble. But then it all happened. The boys accepted the challenge and with a superb team effort piled on the goals. The excitement which developed was tremendous as players and supporters sensed our first premiership. 7 goals in that great last quarter took us to 16.5 against Ainslie's 11.12, and we had achieved the ultimate finale to the season - THE ACTAFL 2ND GRADE PREMIERSHIP.

Congratulations and thanks is conveyed to all who helped in any way to make the 2nd Grade premiership possible; to our ACTAFL representatives Pat Sheedy and Peter Stubbs; and to all trophy winners, particularly Paul Butterworth for his Best and Fairest win.
