

#### A WORD FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT....



1978 had been a difficult, but relatively successful year and the outgoing Football Committee were convinced that with selective recruiting and a playing coach the progress made in 1978 could be continued in 1979.

I was pleased with the manner in which all players responded to the appointment of Norm Smith as Senior Coach. The challenge to succeed in 1979 was foremost in Norm's mind and approach and the team showed very early in the season that when the players 'put it together' they were a very capable side.

History will show that in 1979 we beat each team in the competition on two or more occasions and played in the Club's first 1st Grade Grand Final. The excitement of 10 consecutive wins and a place in the Grand Final was followed by the disappointment of a clear cut Grand Final defeat. Ainslie never allowed us into the game and we were unable to reproduce the form that had carried us to our great 2nd Semi Final win. I think we all learnt something from that Final.

On your behalf I thank players and coaches for their performances during this the most successful season in the Club's brief history.

1979 was also another successful season for the 2nds with wins in 18 minor round games and the 2nd Semi Final. Unfortunately they were unable to reproduce their 1978 Grand Final performance and we had to be content with Runner-up. I thank and congratulate Bryan Sheridan and the players who helped keep our club at the top - a team is only as good as its reserves - our reserves have proved exceptionally good over the past three seasons.

1980, our 10th year offers many challenges - in the last two years major steps have been taken to develop the Club as a force in ACT football. The budget and the effort required have increased three-fold and if we are to continue our progress we must build on the foundation laid. In these difficult economic times it is important that we pull together and support our Club and teams - building on that foundation will not be easy. There are three areas where we must improve our previous efforts:

- 1. We must all contribute ideas and support to utilize and develop the potential of the 'Hibiscus room' of the Club.
- 2. We must all be prepared to become directly involved in the administration of the football operations of the Club too much is falling on to few.
- 3. We must develop our links with the Junior Committee and seek to involve them in the Club its their Club as well as ours.

To all players, Bryan Sheridan, selectors, trainers, officials, runners, committee, members and supporters that have helped me throughout the year to achieve the success that we did I personally thank you for all your efforts.

I look forward to your support, through bigger and greater efforts to obtain that ultimate success for the Belconnen Football Club in 1980. "The 1980 season has started now".

#### THE SEASON



The 1979 season commenced early in February without many of our 'top players'. Pre season training and conditioning was hard and the rewards for those who did the work were in evidence during our trial games against Balmain and Turvey Park and in our first game against Eastlake. Our 22 point win over the 1978 Premiers was a good start to the season and gave supporters an indication that the players were very fit and the Club had the potential to continue the improvement shown in 1978.

This first win was followed by our 'cricket score' of 39.24 (258) - a Club record - against Sutherland for their first defeat since joining the ACTAFL First Division.

Unfortunately the remainder of the first round of matches suggested that the team was similar to many previous Belconnen sides, with wins over ANU, West Canberra and Queanbeyan and losses to Ainslie and Manuka. The second round of matches was not much different with losses to Ainslie and Queanbeyan and with wins over Eastlake, ANU, Sutherland and Manuka.

Our strong last quarter win against Manuka at Phillip to complete the second round of matches was our turning of the corner. From there we went from strength to strength. Winning all remaining minor round matches to set a Club record of nine (9) straight wins and a place in the 2nd Semi - Final, for the first time in the Club's history.

During this sequence of wins our greatest glory was the 12 point win over Manuka in the last minor round game to grab the double chance and second place in the Chandler Craven Mild Club Championship.

The string of wins resulted in a great deal of confidence and enthusiasm amongst players and supporters and this was carried into the 2nd Semi Final against Ainslie at Phillip on 9th September.


The game and the result go down as the Club's greatest win in our brief history - our 10th consecutive win, winning players all over the ground , 34 scoring shots to 17, a 37 point winning margin and BELCONNEN IN ITS FIRST GRAND FINAL.

The spirit and support in the Club was tremendous and the indicators were that we could win our first premiership. Injuries to key Ainslie players in the Preliminary Final against Manuka added to our confidence.

But our first premiership wasn't to be. In fact our performance in the Grand Final turned out to be one of our worst with very few winning players on the day, 19 scoring shots to their 35, a 46 point loosing margin and defeat in the Club's first appearance in a 1st Grade Grand Final.

Even though we were greatly disappointed with our Grand Final defeat history will show that there were a number of 'firsts' recorded during the season:

- Won all games against Eastlake (3 out of 3)
- Won majority of games against Manuka (2 out of 3)
- · Won ten (10) consecutive matches
- · Kicked Club's highest score 39.24 (258) V Sutherland
- · Highest position on ladder 2nd at end of minor round
- · Highest number of minor round wins (won 16, lost 4)
- · Club played in first 1st Grade Grand Final
- · Highest winning margin (198pts) V Sutherland







#### THE PLAYERS



In order to continue the improvement shown in 1978 the Committee considered it was important to hold the players already with the Club and recruit a playing coach, a ruckman, a rover and a wingman.

Efforts to recruit a ruckman intensified in February 1979 when Bob Randall returned to Melbourne - unfortunately our efforts were unsuccessful. Our ability to succeed without recrutiing a ruckman says a lot for the efforts of Max Johnston and to a lesser degree, Joey Box.

Robert White's knee injury prevented him playing in 1979, but our roving was bolstered by the signing of Brian Eagles and Peter Searle, while the recruiting of Colin Graham from Melbourne gave our centreline the needed lift.

Our signing of Norm Smith as Playing Coach was a major recruiting success. Norm's dedication and enthuasism was infectious and soon players were prepared to make the sacrifices necessary for success. Norm's playing ability was vitally important in our string of successes and our reaching the Grand Final.

Few players left the Club after our successful 1978 - those who did included Andy Bowden (overseas), Mick Chinnick (back to Southport), Mal Crawford (to Queanbeyan) Jack Conlan (back to Manuka) and Dennis O'Malley, Mick Suidgeest and Roger Dannock (into retirement).

During 1979, 39 different players took their places in a Belconnen 1st Grade team. Players who did so for the first time included:

- · Brian Eagles from Scorsby, Vic., became an important cog in our team, polling 27 votes in the Mulrooney Medal. Brian will be remembered for 'assisting' Bill Quade become the first in the Club to kick 100 goals in a season.
- · Colin Graham, a brilliant winger from Melbourne Football Club, who after a settling down period become a valuable member of our team.
- Peter Searle from ANU quickly settled into the team and the Club, achieved ACT representative selection and added strength and vigor to our roving division.

- Ken Tucker from South Australia unfortunately was restricted by persistent leg injuries but showed his ability and experience on many occasions.
- · Ian Mackinlay from Papua New Guinea, a determined full back who was just returning to his brilliant best when he suffered a broken collarbone.
- Steve Juniper from South Australia took awhile to win a first grade position - unfortunately after a couple of good games Steve lost his position through injury and was unable to regain it.
- . Harold Turner, a high flying forward from Narrandera who thrilled the supporters with his spectacular marking was unfortunately slowed by a mid-season illness. H. never recovered his early season form but we expect to see him at his brilliant best in 1980.
- Greg Crawford from ANU showed his potential in his few games with the Club - big things are expected of Greg next season.

Other players who were not fortunate enough to play 1st Grade but who made significant contributions during the season include:

- Robert Lipp from Eastlake, undoubtedly the unluckiest player in the Club in 1979. A top player and clubman who missed seven games through injury and car trouble and lost the 2nds B. & F. on a countback, the ACTAFL Reserve Grade Medal by 1 vote and failed to win a 1st grade game after many top 2nd Grade performances.
- Steve Walding who returned to the Club after a few seasons away. Steve turned in many good games and his continued efforts when things looked black won him a place in the Reserve Grade Grand Final.
- Tony Cibiras from ANU who took a little longer to settle into the side than expected. Tony will no doubt show his real ability in 1980.

Some of our younger brigade were given a taste of senior football in 1979 and all showed great promise. Wes Maloney and Tony Hills had 1st Grade games, Danny Erickson, Andrew Brown, Chris Althaus, Mick Dwyer and Mick Horan had 2nd Grade games while many juniors had games with the 3rd Grade team.

#### TEAM LEADERS:

Norm Smith moved from Corowa to Canberra as Captain Coach and led the 1st Grade team into its first Grand Final in his first season. Norm's leadership was a crucial factor in our success and his strong play was inspiring. Congratulations and well done, Norm.

Mal Manson, our Vice Captain again proved a valuable player with his strong marking and creative forward play. His 65 goals from CHF is the second highest in the Club's history - beaten only by Bill Quade's record of 114 goals.

Steve Whennan was Captain of our 2nd Grade team and although he missed the Grand Final through injury he had a very good season and again proved a good leader and a valuable player.

Chris Althaus our 3rd Grade Captain led the team into the first Semi Final and capped a good season with 18 votes in the ACTAFL 3rd Grade Best and Fairest Award.

#### CLUB COACHES:

During 1979 Belconnen's senior players experienced a much more demanding approach than in previous years. Players soon learnt that mistakes earnt push-ups and non attendance at training earnt fines. Many players had large biceps at the end of the season and a few players had suffered for not attending training.

Norm Smith our Senior Coach worked hard and long both on and off the field to prepare players for matches. The building of team spirit and confidence in each other was an important part of Norm's approach and our success. The task of getting to know players, gaining their confidence, contributing to the effort on the field, planning tactics and understanding personalities is the joy of a Captain Coach. Norm Smith accepted these challenges and performed exceptionally well in all facets of the game.

Bryan Sheridan our 2nd Grade Coach was again very successful. He cooperated extremely well with Norm and always had players playing well when they were required for 1st Grade. The problems associated with coaching a 2nd Grade side are significant with players going up and coming down each week, but Bryan was able to maintain great team spirit, despite the turnover and almost repeated his history making effort of 1978. A premiership in 1978 and runner-up in 1979 are the result of two good years from Bryan.

Ray Green our 3rd Grade Coach did extremely well to make the finals with a side which was always short of numbers and which did not receive the level of support from the Club that could be reasonably expected. Ray's opportunity to develop players was restricted by the numbers training and Ray is congratulated for maintaining his efforts during a very difficult season.

#### 2nd GRADE



The 1979 season which promised so much (Premiers in 1978 and favourites for the entire season to make it two in a row) ended in disappointment.

Highlights of the minor round matches were the new Club record of thirteen (13) consecutive wins, some very strong scoring efforts - bettering 25 goals on seven occasions and setting a new 2nd Grade record score with 36.21 (237), and two good wins over our arch rivals Ainslie.

Manuka proved a troublesome side over the season beating us on two out of three occasions. The edge our team had over its rivals during the minor round was clearly evidenced by our very high percentage of 284.6.

The record will show that the 2nd Semi Final resulted in a meritorous win for our side. After trailing midway through the 2nd quarter and not playing well, the lads took control especially in the later part of both the third and last quarters to win by 26 points and go straight into the Grand Final for the second year in a row.

The Grand Final was a sad day. We only had to maintain our form to win the premiership, but we were beaten by a better team on the day.

The first quarter was probably the most crucial, we kicked with a strong breeze but were not able to put the goals on the board. At quarter time we trailed 3.7 to 6.1. Bad kicking for goal and some loose defence were the major reasons for our bad position. But to their credit our boys showed great fighting spirit to hit the front about 10 minutes into the last quarter. Had we continued on to kick the next goal the result could well have been different, however Ainslie kicked a lucky one and with Lipp and Strongman off the field injured, Juniper and Goddard carrying injuries and with our Captain and Vice Captain in the grandstand, Ainslie were able to steady and ran out winners by 21 points.

Bryan Sheridan and his team are congratulated on their efforts throughout the season and providing we learn from our mistakes we can be sure that the 1980's are going to be good years for Belconnen.

Individual plaudits go to coach Bryan Sheridan, ACTAFL representatives Peter Stubbs, Steve Juniper and Les Calvert, all trophy winners, particularly Barry Slade and Robert Lipp and that grand Captain Steve Whennan.

#### 3rd GRADE (UNDER 19)



In a competition where most teams showed a general improvement over the previous year our Thirds won 9 games lost 12 and finished fourth, 24 points behind the third team, Manuka. In the 1st Semi Final we were comprehensively beaten by Manuka who went on to win a close Grand Final from Eastlake.

Our team always lacked numbers and operated from a list of less than 18 players. Thanks to the efforts of Ray Green and the support of Colts coach Geoff Girvan and younger players there were only four occasions when the team had to start a match with less than 18 players. In fact 49 different players took the field throughout the season.

Some players came from other sports to help the team on a single occasion, others appeared but after finding their determination or ability lacking quickly disappeared. The main support came from the Colts team and the U 15's - many of whom played two games in a weekend. Several of these players took the step into a higher grade in their stride and won a regular place in the team in the later part of the season.

Our Third Grade list contained many players of above average ability, unfortunately some of them were not prepared to train and our lack of fitness was evident in the pressure matches - especially against Manuka, Ainslie and R.M.C.

Despite these disappointments the relative success of the team which was never settled, underlined the ability of the regular players. Chris Althaus and Mick Dwyer, who both polled well in the ACTAFL Best and Fairest, and Wes Maloney and Andy Brown, who had a close contest in the Club Best and Fairest, lead a group of players who with dedication and determination can make their marks in open ranks.

On the debit side the lack of pre-season planning and/or interest contributed greatly to the early problems in fielding a team. This trend has been evident over the last few years and if we are to have a strong Third Grade team we must endeavour to overcome this problem. The fact that only 12 players in our two Grand Final teams had come through from our juniors indicate that more effort and attention must be given to getting players through the transition stage.

With this in mind we are greatful for the hard work and loyalty of our small band of Third Grade team officials and supporters whose strong views in support of the Thirds have not always made them popular.

#### **JUNIORS**



Belconnen junior football continued to expand in 1979. Under Harry Souter (President) and Jim Watt (Secretary) a hard working committee, coaches and managers were able to field 15 teams in all grades from Under 7 to Colts, with two teams in several grades.

Six teams made the Grand Final - U7 Sth., U8 Sth., U11 Sth., U13, U14 and U15. The Under 7 South team was the most successful side winning the Club's only premiership in 1979. The U14 team however won the junior competition at Leeton on the June long weekend and the Belconnen U 11's defeated the North Melbourne team in the VFL little league in Melbourne.


