

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS ANNUAL REPORT



CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



Last year's Annual Report told in glowing terms of the success experienced by the football operation during the preceding season. It was only a short time after that report was released that our world was turned upside down by the appointment of a receiver/manager to control the financial affairs of the licensed club.

There is no need to repeat the happenings of that time or to dwell on the resultant impact. Suffice to say that we, as the football operation, felt the full effects; particularly the freezing of our accounts at a time when we were in the process of making match payments for the 1979 season.

After a period of confusion the Belconnen Football Club Supporters Group was reformed with the intention of assisting the continued operation of the football section of the club; until such time as either the receiver was displaced or the future of the licensed club was otherwise clear. Little has changed over the year as far as the receivership is concerned and it seems likely to be some time before we know the likely outcome of the current situation.

Many players left the club before the start of the current season, some to live in other cities, some in genuine retirement and others because of the failure of the club to pay last years match payments. The financial situation did not allow any recruiting apart from players posted into Canberra for job or other reasons and obviously many of these were not prepared to become involved with a club with our sort of difficulties. These factors showed in our on field performance where wins were infrequent and the playing records of the previous season were beyond our capabilities.

Much work now remains to be done to ensure that the club is able to lift itself out of its present situation and in addition, that we can protect ourselves from similar situations in the future. The long term plan currently being considered by the Supporters Group will be critical to our attempts to make the Belconnen Football Club a force, not just in the ACTAFL, but also in the Belconnen area. The strength of the club lies in the great number of very talented and motivated junior footballers playing for the club, and this must be coupled with a strong and determined administration prepared and able to go about its task with only the best interests of the club at heart.

I offer my sincere appreciation to the people who remained and worked so hard for the club during the past season. By their loyalty they have provided the basis for the continued operation of this club in years to come. Particular thanks go to members of the Supporters Group Committee, to team officials, and to senior coaches; Robert White who undertook the job in less than desirable circumstances and although not having the opportunity to lead the club to success gave the job his all, Ken Tucker and Noel O'Neill.



From rags to riches and back again. How quickly we slid down the ladder. The problems of November, 1979 were certainly reflected in the Reserves this season. Understandably the overall drop in player strength had most impact on this grade. The normal wastage through retirement of experienced players was compounded by the need to promote many players to bolster the 1st grade team, and after all this is the primary function of the reserves. We did seem to suffer from a greater than usual flow of reserves players to the Monaro League and the number of younger players who made this move is of concern. On the plus side of the ledger were a number of players who returned to the club after a period away. It is to be hoped that some of those who were missing this year will likewise return next season.

Of those who played out the season in the reserves the general consensus of opinion seems to be that it was a worthwhile exercise that hopefully will lead to better things in the future. A number of players from this grade were rewarded with promotion to the lsts and acquitted themselves well.

A vote of thanks is due to the Under 19 players who helped out during the year, particularly those who played two games on the one day to help the club; on some occasions this necessitated a fast trip from a ground in another part of the district. A number of Under 17 players also took the field as part of the reserves team on a few occasions and much credit goes to the 'kids' involved.

Support for this team from Manny Kargas, Brian Harry, Les Dohnt and others was always of the highest order and was greatly appreciated by players and coaches. Unfortunately a severe injury to coach Ken Tucker early in the season made his role as player and coach a very difficult one, however he was able to regain his fitness and in fact play a number of first grade matches. Ken has been transferred to Sydney in his employment since the end of the season and the best wishes of the club go with him.

3rd GRADE (UNDER 19)



In a competition where once again there was a general improvement in standard over the previous season the team won 6 games (excluding one match against Queanbeyan - who withdrew mid-season) and lost 8 to finish fifth and 8 points out of the final four. Except for the Grand Final the final series was a closely fought affair with Eastlake, the outstanding team of the season, winning the premiership.

Although the team possessed some considerable talents its overall performance was disappointing. In the vital games against the teams above it in the competition it was often in a position of advantage but failed under presure, due to a loss of teamwork and concentration at crutial stages. The two basic reasons for this situation was the lack of match fitness of some of the players and the inability of the players to train together as a team. Although more players trained on a regular basis than in previous seasons, by making use of the several sessions that were available during weekdays, the fact that they were unable to train together always created problems on match days.

The final list of players in the 17-18 age group totalled twenty four, but there was no occasion when the numbers available would have ensured a full side without the loyalty of a group of Colts players (Under 17) who never failed in their support even when the prospect of two hard games over a weekend was not a particularly attractive one.

Despite the results there was a lot gained from the season. Five players gained First Grade experience and others showed, when they played in the second grade side, that they would have no trouble in achieving the standard required for open age competition. Team spirit was the best for some years and was helped to a very large extent by the time and effort that coach Noel O'Neill put into the side, despite his committments as a first grade player.

Following the criticisms in the last annual report of lack of club interest in the team the Committee created the position of Under 19 Co-ordinator, who was responsible for general team administration and liaison with the Colts side. This has been followed during the season by two special training sessions for Under 14 to play Under 19 players, operated by the Club's Senior coaches and senior players and the planning of summer training for the same age group. Such forward steps can only be of benefit and encourage more junior players to come through to the open age team.

No team operates effectively without support. Jim Watt, despite his duties as President of the Junior Club, was available with advice and help throughout the season and shared the team management duties with Manny Kargas and Brian Harry (and on one occasion with his wife Doreen, who threw herself into her job with such enthusiasm that she finished up on the injured list). The team would not have functioned without their efforts.

JUNIORS



This year the Junior Club fielded 18 teams which was an increase of three over the previous year. Our total registrations were 382 boys, who represented our club in either Belconnen North, Belconnen South or our new off-shoot Belconnen East. The policy of dividing our boys on a geographical basis has proven to be the right method, with most games between our own sides usually resulting in very even games.

The close ties and co-operation with the Senior Club saw a stronger relationship develop this year and with our great crop of talent coming through the more senior of our junior teams, the future of Belconnen as a football power is assured, but we must ensure that their interest in the Senior Club is encouraged whether their future activities involve playing, administrative roles or coaching.

The Belconnen Juniors provided 22 A.C.T. representative boys this year, won both of their encounters against our two Victorian reciprocal teams, Murrumbeena and Bennetswood, and won three Junior League premierships; Under 7, 8 and 15, with two runners-up in Under 9 Norths and 13 South.

The Junior Club is generally self-supporting in its financial operations, but our thanks go to the Seniors for their generous help in inviting us to participate in the 'pot of gold' effort once again. Thanks also to the Senior players who assisted in the school and club clinics with the junior players.

The 1980's have provided a new challenge for the Belconnen club as a whole, success does not come easily and is not everlasting. All areas of our total club must set their goals high and work towards this end - From our 382 young footballers we are with you all the way.


