


PRESIDENT'S REPORT



1982 was a year of real development for the Belconnen Australian Football Supporters Club Incorporated. Important and significant improvements were achieved in the financial and administrative areas while in other areas the Club has further consolidated its position.

The BAFSC was incorporated in June 1981. In November 1981 members of the BAFSC elected a committee of ten to administer and finance football operations. This was the first time in Belconnen's history that more than one representative has been <u>elected</u> by members to perform an active role in football administration. I consider this to be a significant achievement in its own right.

Shortly after taking office, the new committee (Ross Byrne in particular) set about reorganising the BAFSC administrative network. One of the decisions taken in the context of this reorganisation was to place a far greater emphasis on finance and fund raising than had occurred previously. Budget and finance recording statements were introduced and despite some initial teething problems are now used frequently to assess quickly and accurately the Club's financial position at any time. This is obviously beneficial to the decision-making process.

Another function of the administrative reorganisation was to identify and then allocate the multitude of routine but nontheless important jobs to committeemen or to the various sub-committees. This has minimised duplication of effort and has in the main ensured that these duties are performed.

The appointment of a member of the Committee (Harry Souter) to liaise with the Junior Club has led to increased and more effective communication between the BAFSC and the Juniors. This is obviously beneficial to the Club as a whole in assisting our unified development. I thank Harry, in particular, for his efforts in this area. I hope that the understanding and communication achieved this year will be further developed and strengthened in future years.

I believe that "our house is now in good order". The revamped organisation has assisted this development but it is mainly due to a lot of hard work from many dedicated individuals.

In July and August of this year the BAFSC circulated among local and national businesses based in Canberra a promotional package on sponsorship. The purpose of these approaches was primarily to obtain financial and material resources to assist our football operations in future years. I am confident that, as a result of this initiative, our revenue from sponsorship will increase and I trust that the Club will be able to secure a major sponsor.

Our Club is at a considerable disadvantage when compared with other ACTAFL Clubs, as we do not receive any financial support for football operations from the licensed Club (Belconnen National Football Club Incorporated). This is most disappointing considering the support given by the football community to the BNFC. I believe that unless significant changes in this regard occur in the near future it will be necessary for the BAFSC to reappraise its involvement with the BNFC.

On the football field our firststurned in many creditable performances during the year. The highlight was the second win against Queanbeyan at Queanbeyan in round nineteen. We were in positions to win matches against both Manuka and Eastlake but lapsed at crucial stages of the game. As one more win would have secured a place in the finals, we paid dearly for those lapses.

I congratulate Laurie Moloney, who has performed his job as Senior Coach in a most energetic, dedicated and creditable fashion. His encouragement of and faith in our younger players in particular has led in no small way to their current status as senior players.

The quantity and quality of youth in our Club is amazing. If future coaches and committees can set an environment for these players to perform to the utmost of their potential the success that we all desperately want will be ours.

The reserves had a mixed season and were severely restricted by injuries to, and the unavailability of, players throughout the year. They played very well at times as was evidenced by their courageous one point win against Manuka in round fifteen after being five goals behind at three-quarter time. Robert Goddard has coached his side in fine style all year and has also given tremendous support to Laurie and the senior side.

I believe that Belconnen's prospects are particularly bright and we can look to 1983 and future years with a great deal of optimism. Our policy of developing talent that already exists at Belconnen has clearly paid dividends. We also have people who possess very good administrative skills and, providing they are not over-loaded, will supply the leadership and support the players need.

Of course, there is still much work to be done but the challenge is there and I urge you to take up the challenge as I am sure you will find the rewards worthwhile.

On your behalf I thank all players, coaches, trainers and other team officials, for their performances during the year. I thank also the members of my Committee and the sub-committees for the tremendous support they have given me. To you, the members of the BAFSC, and to other Club supporters, thank you, for without your loyalty, encouragement and support the continued development of our Club would not be possible.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

POT OF GOLD



The Pot of Gold has again been successful thanks to an enormous effort from many people. However, due to the adverse economic situation and an unexpected 20% decline in ticket sales by the senior club, the anticipated number of ticket sales was not reached. Fortunately, sales by the support clubs increased by 35%. The potential of the Pot of Gold as a fundraising activity still has not been fully realised and with a bigger effort from all, the Club is confident that a record result can be achieved in 1983.

The Pot of Gold Committee (Mike Price, Ray Baguley, Ross Byrne and Peter Wren) began meeting in January and books went on sale in early April, three months earlier than in previous years. The decision to bring the 1982 Pot of Gold forward to coincide with the football season was taken to increase the competitiveness of the Pot of Gold with similar promotions run by other clubs and to maximise ticket sales and interest. The decision proved to be very rewarding. The drawing of final prizes was conducted as part of an enjoyable social gathering held in September.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT



This year the Committee considered it very important to address regularly and systematically the overall development of the Club at both the junior and senior levels. The main purpose behind this initiative was to enhance the development of Belconnen as a homogenous and united football club with a unique and praiseworthy identity. Harry Souter, the committeeman responsible for development, was also the Club delegate to the ACT Australian Football League and his dual role ensured that he was able to represent the Club effectively at the League level.

One of the prime thrusts of the development policy this year was to establish and maintain sound liaison with the Belconnen Junior administration and so ensure that the Juniors were informed of, and their views sought on, all matters of concern to them. As a result, the committee gained a thorough understanding of the Juniors' policies and problems and was able to take these matters into account when considering football development at both the Club and League levels.

Assistance provided to the Juniors this year was primarily in the form of coaches for the junior teams. The Committee is committed to providing additional assistance to the Juniors and has asked the Junior Committee to put forward proposals.

Other important issues concerning Club development that were addressed during the year were:

- junior matches during half-time breaks of senior games;
- . Club sponsorship;
- ground facilities;
- . leasing and development of Jamison Oval; and
- . pre-season Australian football carnival featuring local and interstate teams.

The direction of our future development is of major importance to our Club. This year the Committee essentially only recognised and began to tackle issues; future committees must devote more and more time and resources to addressing this important area.



SERVICE AWARDS



BEST CLUBMAN (Clair Jones Perpetual Trophy)



Ross Byrne transferred to Belconnen from the Manuka Club in 1972 and went on to play 73 games with Belconnen reserves. He also backed up for the firsts on three occasions, when injuries created vacancies in the senior team. Historians from both the Belconnen and Manuka Clubs are unable to recall the amount of the original fee or for that matter, who paid it.

Jokes aside, Ross is one of Belconnen's finest administrators. His intelligence, integrity and creativity, coupled with his ability to organise and communicate have been of immense value to Belconnen in each of the many football administrative functions he has undertaken. Previous recipients of this award have shown great loyalty to Belconnen and Ross is most worthy of joining their number.

This award recognises his contribution to the Club over a number of years and, in particular, during 1982.

MERIT AWARDS

Mick joined Belconnen from Ainslie in 1972 and has given the Club tremendous support since then. This support is typified by his performance this year as under nineteen coach, a job he has approached with great enthusiasm, dedication and loyalty. He has played 70 first grade and 102 reserve grade games for Belconnen (the Club record) and has coached junior sides for a number of years. This merit award recognises both his contribution to the Club over the years and his particular efforts in 1982.

Robert Dawson

'Dirty' played his 100th first grade game for Belconnen in round one this year. He has also served on the football committee as the players' representative since 1980. One of the Club's characters, Robert has been a true contributor and a very fine clubman and player. It was pleasing to see him poll very well in the 1982 Best and Fairest voting. He thoroughly deserves this merit award.

Brian Falconer

Brian began his association with Belconnen in 1970 and was the Club's first Football Vice-President. He has held a variety of positions since 1970 including Treasurer, Reserves Coach, Junior Coach, Selector, Chairman of Selectors and Recruiting Officer. He is also a more than useful addition to any boat race team. Brian's three sons, Peter, Rowan and Dean have all played first grade football for Belconnen. Brian has made a great contribution to the Club over many years and is a very worthy winner of this award.

Robin Maloney

Belconnen was fortunate when 'Penguin' transferred to Canberra from Melbourne a couple of seasons ago. The 1982 committeeman in charge of management of the senior teams, Robin is a most able administrator and possesses an outstanding ability to get the job done with a minimum of fuss. The senior coaches and players greatly appreciate his efforts on those many cold evenings at Aranda Oval. Robin has given outstanding service to the Club this year and is a deserving recipient of this award.

Garry Schmidt

Garry began his association with the Club as an under nineteen player in 1970 and has also played from time to time in the reserves. He turned his attention to the medical and trainers' sphere in the mid-seventies and it is in this area that he has become one of Belconnen's most valuable personnel, regularly attending matches and training sessions for all senior grades. This merit award recognises his outstanding service to the Club.

TREASURER'S REPORT



The BAFSC achieved a profit of \$618.00 on this year's operations. Fund raising still in progress (two trailer raffles) is expected to realise \$5,275 further profit. This means that the deficit carried over from 1981 has been reduced by \$5,893 to \$8,595. This is the first time Belconnen has recorded a profit over a year without also reducing expenditure.

I congratulate the many fund raisers, in particular, Ross Byrne, Peter Taylor, Michael Price and the members of the Ladies' Committee on a truly remarkable effort. They have approached their task in a most imaginative, energetic and professional manner and have contributed greatly to the Club's relatively healthy financial position. Thank you also to Harry Phillips who was our Treasurer until June 1982 for his efforts during this year and last year.

I was particularly pleased with the restraint exercised by the Club officials responsible for expenditure. I would also like to express my gratitude to our suppliers and creditors, in particular Noel Short, Clive Lowes and another who wishes to remain anonymous for their neverending patience.

One area of concern this year was the sale of Pot of Gold tickets. Overall, the level of sales in 1982 was similar to that in 1981 but the distribution of sales between the BAFSC and the support clubs changed. BAFSC sales dropped by about 20% which resulted in a loss of revenue of approximately \$4,500. Every effort should be made in 1983 to reverse this situation.

CHAIRMAN OF SELECTORS



This year's selectors for both first and reserve grades were Laurie Moloney, Rob Goddard and Brian Falconer. We continued with the policy of looking in the first place to under-age players to fill vacancies in the first grade team and this saw juniors Mike Brazel, Bruce Burke, Haydn Daw, Mark Killer, Sean Michelle, John Phillips and Darrel Scotland gain valuable experience.

Notable performances by youthful members of the reserve grade team could not be overlooked which meant that Wayne Agnew, Peter Bradley, Wayne Crumblin, Ian Currie, Mick Dwyer, Rowan Falconer, Russell Forster, Graham Maher, Mark Rayner, Gary Ryan, Frank Southwell and Andy Stuart were given opportunities to prove themselves in the higher grade.

New senior players Don McMichael and for the first half of the season, Paul Butterworth helped to offset the loss of Robert White, John Manson, Bill Quade, Nigel Brennan and for the first half of the season, Wes Maloney. The return of John Dess after injury was most welcome towards the end of the year.

The first grade team won eight games and recorded 84.4% compared with seven wins and 87.7% in 1981 and again finished in fifth position, equal on points but with a lesser percentage than Queanbeyan. In 1981 the team had finished three wins and percentage short of the fourth position.

While the team's ability to win the ball compared favourably with that of opposing teams, possession was often wasted. The team lacked penetration in moving the ball forward and averaged only 79 points in its six matches against Ainslie, Eastlake and Manuka. This probably cost it fourth position. Under these circumstances, Noel O'Neill's 77 goals to finish third highest goal scorer in the League was an excellent performance. It was also the second best goalkicking effort in the Club's history.

The highlights were all too infrequent but the two wins against Queanbeyan and the courageous effort in the final round against Eastlake are most worthy of mention.

Peter Taylor had an outstanding season to add to his already impressive record. Peter finished equal third in the voting for the Mulrooney Medal only four points behind the winner, represented the ACT in Escort Cup matches, won the Club's Best and Fairest award for the second time and shared the Canberra Permanent Player of the Year Award. In addition, Peter was a lively participant in the Club's administrative and fund-raising activities.

The reserve grade team was unsettled this year, due primarily to demands placed upon it for first grade players and also because some players became unreliable with their availability. It is to coach Rob Goddard's credit that he overcame these difficulties. The team only narrowly missed fourth place. Rob led by example, winning the Best and Fairest award for the second season in a row, polling most votes for the Club in the League Reserve Grade Best and Fairest award and representing the ACT on two occasions. The memory of the last quarter efforts to win against Weston Creek and Manuka should be uppermost in our minds in approaching next season.

The third grade team was constructed and held together by Mick Burgess in an outstanding personal effort. Apart from providing senior players, the team helped Rob Goddard on a number of occasions when his numbers fell away. Congratulations to Geoff Lyall who won the Best and Fairest award.

Mention should also be made of John Dess and his Under 17 team which established this year a much closer identification with the senior level. There is a lot of talent in that team which needs to be carefully developed.

The selectors are grateful for the valuable support received from our donors and for the help of Dave Rannard and his staff behind the bar in conducting various functions. This season the Ladies' Committee built up further their much needed contribution to the depth of our Club.

As Chairman of Selectors, I pay great credit to Laurie and Rob for their skilful, enthusiastic and dedicated handling of difficult jobs. To go beyond the call of duty is normal for them and this could only be achieved with the support of Lynme and Helen, and with Mick the support of Anita. It was my pleasure to work with them and the others who made up the overall team: the runners, the managers, the trainers, the time-keepers, the scoreboard attendants, the statisticians, the club doctor, the committee members, the ladies' committee and, last but not least, the players.

Finally, I wish to single out 'Bruiser', 'King', 'Prog' and 'Skeeter' who stuck with the Club through thick and (mainly) thin.

1st GRADE



Any consideration of the 1982 season must take into account the loss of several senior players from last year, three of whom had been ACT representatives. Balancing this against the fact that we had only one recruit who played the whole season makes the effort of winning one game more than in the previous year a very good one.

Our improved showing may be attributed to several factors. However, I believe the major reasons to be our improved team spirit and morale, the continuing improvement of last year's "baby brigade" and the successful injection of more Belconnen juniors.

There are many people whom I wish to thank for their support and assistance during the year. They are, in no order of priority: the Match Committee (Rob Goddard and Brian Falconer), Rob Goddard and Mick Burgess for their coaching assistance, the BAFSC Committee (also the ladies and finance committees), all the managers and training staff (including Penguin's new recruit "BP"), Dr Peter Fricker, timekeepers (Reg Proctor), Dave Rannard and his staff for their co-operation and patience, Neville Gill and Max Gibbs on recruitment, our weekly award donors, Ben Lane, Roscoe Byrne and Jim Calvert for their assistance at training, our runners (Jim and Neville) for the first grade, and lastly my family for their support.

Congratulations to Peter Taylor for his efforts of equal third in the Mulrooney Medal, equal first in the Canberra Permanent Player of the Year Award, and also his State selection; to David Bennett for becoming the "most senior" senior player (in games); to John Dess for a hard-earned and courageous come-back; and to all the players who polled well in our Best and Fairest. Best wishes go to Dean Falconer on his venture to Melbourne - he will be greatly missed.

This year has been another of consolidation and development. I believe the time is now for the infusion of new experienced players to assist in the future development of our juniors and our team as a whole. Hopefully the Committee, after consideration of finances, etc., will see this as our future path.

2nd GRADE



Reserves had a mixed year in 1982. The season started poorly with many players unavailable for the majority of the first round of matches. Nevertheless, by the beginning of the second round the side was well-placed and had every prospect of making the finals. However, as the season progressed, the number of players unavailable, injured or ill remained at around eight each week. As a result, we never really became a settled combination. In my view, this was a key factor in our loss to a very settled Weston Creek side in the last round.

My philosophy this year was to emphasise team work and play-on football. We showed flashes of this in many games but failed to maintain it for sufficient periods, perhaps reflecting the unsettled nature of the side. In addition to the all-too-few passages of handball, to me the highlights of the season were the gutsy wins against Weston Creek and Manuka - both games we had to win and in both we came from behind in the last quarter.

I congratulate Steve Taylor and Andy Stuart on their performances this year and thank all players who stuck with the side to the end of the year. In particular, I would like to thank Peter Jonas, Skeeta Trye, Bruiser Karey, Matthew (Kingsley) Victory and Alan Austin for their dedication. Special thanks also go to the Under 19s for their support.

There are many others to whom I owe a great deal this year. The support of Laurie, Brian and my Vice-Captain Frank Southwell, made things a lot easier. I also thank Max and "BP"; Andy Anderson and Garny Schmidt; John Petersen; Jim Calvert; and the statisticians, Helen and Frank Goddard, for their assistance.

This year's side is probably the youngest Reserve Grade side to turn out for Belconnen. Despite finishing outside the four, I believe Reserves can look forward to greater success in future seasons. To improve is vital, as the long-term well-being of the Club is largely dependent on a strong and successful Reserve Grade side.

3rd GRADE



The team won one match and lost fifteen and finished last in the competition. However, these results do not reflect the team's efforts during the year. Season 1982 was always going to be a difficult one. A month before the first match there appeared a great danger that the Club would not be able to field a Third Grade team, as the League decision to schedule matches on Saturdays precluded the use of Under 17 players to make up numbers on a consistent basis. A late influx of players rescued the situation. Some of these had only played other sports and some very little sport at all.

Not surprisingly, many of the early games, with players learning both individual and team skills, were disasters. It says much for the team spirit of the side that, despite the depressing results, they got together after matches, supported Club functions as a group and undertook social functions of their own. This attitude, together with training was rewarded with a marked improvement in performance late in the season and was climaxed in the last match with an unlucky three-point loss to Sutherland - who reached the Preliminary Final.

Above all, one person got the act on the road and kept it on course. As coach, Mick Burgess found the additional players to make up the team and maintained their spirits in defeat. Rarely did he show his disappointment when the team failed to perform up to potential but, with his straight-forward instruction and advice, improved their play throughout the season. The club owes him a great debt for the time, energy and skill that he put into constructing and coaching the side. His job was made easier by the active support of his wife, Anita, who brought both efficiency and charm to the thankless job of Team Manager, and by the presence - as trainer - of Wayne Bolton (or his more than useful deputy (!) Garry Schmidt). [As always, the Third Grade Coach also had the luxury of being able to rely on the interested and energetic involvement of Reg Proctor as Team Co-ordinator - Editor.]

Despite some dire predictions, Saturday matches were a success. Aside from other advantages they engendered a far better inter-team feeling with the Colts side, whose players doubled up for a second match whenever required. Their support from the sideline also was much appreciated, as was the appearance from time to time of senior players and officials and other supporters.

Bruce Burke, Haydn Daw, Sean Michelle and John Phillips all gained First Grade selection and, on occasions, played for the Reserves after Saturday matches - as did Doug Grant, George Kohler and Chris O'Brien.

Geoff Lyall with his consistent skill and courage was deservedly Best and Fairest, whilst Bruce Burke, as Runner-up, picked up his form after a mid-season slump to be the outstanding player of the team in the latter part of the year. As Most Consistent Player, it was difficult to go past Sean Michelle - he never had a bad game, was rarely beaten in the ruck and his work rate around the ground was phenomenal for a big man. In a very competitive field, Glenn O'Sullivan won the Most Improved Player Award. In conquering an initial lack of confidence in his ability he applied himself to become a strong and reliable full back. In another difficult decision, George Kohler gained the Coach's Trophy for his consistent and determined play, his general attitude and the contribution that he made towards team spirit.

Although predictions are dangerous, next year should see a full list of players for the team - the first time this has happened for a long while - and a very competitive side on the field.

COLTS (UNDER 17) - DIVISIONS I AND II

Belconnem fielded teams in both Under 17 divisions in 1982. The Division I side did well to finish third in a very even competition after losing the preliminary final against Ainslie by two points. Mike Brazel (Runner-up Best and Fairest), Mark Killer (Best and Fairest) and Darrel Scotland all gained First Grade selection. Other trophy winners were Craig Watt (Most Consistent), Alec McGee (Most Determined), David Low (Most Improved), Luke Dummett (Best Clubman), Andrew Greenhill (Coach's Trophy) and Grant Woodbridge (Goalkicking). The Club thanks John Dess, Rod Jessup, Pat Brazel, Reg Proctor, Andy Anderson, Wayne Bolton, Geoff Girvan and Garry Schmidt for their efforts during the season.

The Division II side consisted entirely of Under 16 players and finished fourth after losing the first semi-final to Weston Creek. The Junior Club's policy of players graduating by yearly steps from the Under 15 competition through to the Under 19 Grade has given the side good experience for Division I next year. Congratulations to David Heitel (Best and Fairest), Scott Simon (Runner-up Best and Fairest), David Girvan (Most Consistent), Mark Hellyer (Most Determined), Paul Bink (Most Improved) and Andrew Smith (Best Clubman). The Club thanks David Millie, Ray Smith, Sandra Simon, Kevin Carter and Peter Conway for their contributions during the year.

The general standard of the Under 17 teams this year shows that the hard work of the Junior Club in fostering football in the Belconnen area over a long period is beginning to reap the reward that the many dedicated workers so richly deserve.

JUNIORS



Season 1982 started a new era for the Junior Club. In anticipation of the continuing growth of the code throughout our zone the old club administration divided into two 'clubs' - Belconnen North and Belconnen South - under the guidance of a Board of Directors. The new system was also aimed at doubling the number of administrators to ensure that our 23 junior teams would be administered in the Belconnen way of fostering junior footballers and so continue our growth as one of the most progressive junior clubs in the ACT. Some teething problems have occurred, as with any new system, possibly the major one being achieving total communication through both clubs; but the problems have been noted and will be improved on for 1983.

On the football scene, we maintained our team numbers of 1981 with 23 teams, many of which had six or more extra players, giving us total registrations of 530 players. The initiative and hard work by the Committee in fielding two Colts teams came to fruition this year with both sides making the finals, and more importantly creating a vehicle for 50 or so 16 and 17 year-old boys to proceed into Under 19 football, an area which our Committee felt has been sadly neglected over the years. The Club gained four premierships - Under 9 North, Under 9 South, Under 12 North and Under 14 South. Again, as in 1981, two of our teams played each other in a grand final, Belconnen East lost to Belconnen North by one point in the Under 12, Division II competition. Rogan Sharp (Under 15 South) won the Junior League's Under 15 Best Player Award.

On the representative scene, Belconnen was well to the fore: Teal Cup (Under 17) - six players; High Schools (Under 16) - six players; Under 15 Championships - five players; Under 13 Representative Team - four players; Primary Schools Representative Team - two players - a great credit to our hard working junior coaches and managers.

The most pleasing feature this year has been the vast improvement in Junior-Senior relations in all areas, due mainly to Harry Souter's efforts. Our thanks also go to Ray Baguley, Ross Byrne, Michael Price and Laurie Moloney for their assistance over the season.

The greatest reward for any junior club is to see its products fully utilised and be able to show that achievement with pride to those with the desire and ability to "make it". The last two seasons have seen no less than eight juniors given the opportunity to play with our senior team. The future for our total Club looks extremely bright — this year has seen the start of what is shaping up to be a very successful Belconnen era.

GOALKICKING


Noel O'Neill kicked 77 goals in 1st Grade - a total that has only been bettered by Bill Quade's 114 goals in 1979.
