

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The amalgamation between West Canberra and Belconnen has now been finalised after a year of experimentation. The formula is simple. Both licensed premises retain their own identity while supporting the Belconnen Football Club to field senior teams. The teams wear the West Canberra colours in the Collingwood format and preserve the Magpie logo. Its shape is slightly altered to signify a will-to-win attitude reminiscent of the aggressive local magpies with which Canberra residents are familiar in spring and with which rival teams in future will become accustomed. The popular name already adopted by press and supporters is 'Belconnen Magpies' or simply 'Maggies' and our victory song, derived from something Mick Burgess sang in the past, is already well known.

Our football operation is controlled by a composite committee drawn from the members of the two former football committees with the exception of myself as I belonged to neither. The full committee has met on seventeen occasions and the executive met at regular intervals for express purposes. Our deliberations were harmonious and constructive and we all learnt a great deal from the year's experience. Amalgamation, involving as it still does the operation of separate licensed premises, could not proceed without difficulty. I am grateful to all the members of the committee and to Brian Read and Geoff Reid - Presidents of the licensed premises - for their co-operation throughout the year.

Financially the whole operation was unsuccessful due in no small measure to the false expectations held by some supporters and players that if we doubled our resources we doubled our money. What was actually at stake was our doubling the effort put in, which meant more involvement from generous workers. That did not happen. The same few did the same things. With Michael Price as an indefatigable, conscientious and highly competent treasurer, disaster was avoided. Bernie Pocock, with the assistance of a generous band of helpers from both West Canberra and Belconnen, kept catering as our major source of revenue and to those people we are immensely indebted. No sponsorship was forthcoming principally because I was not able to persuade a sponsor to support a venture which, because of the one year decision on amalgamation taken at West Canberra, appeared to lack stability. Hopefully the recent decision on amalgamation will change that but in the meantime the economic climate has also changed, we were unsuccessful as a senior team and consequently sponsorship will not come easily. The message is simple. We need a group of active supporters who will form an effective fund-raising committee. Unless they are forthcoming our budget has to be halved with consequent serious effects on the football arena.

Congratulations to the Under 19's and the Reserves and to Mick Burgess and Noel (Noddy) O'Neill who brought them through to Grand Finals when, on the day, they went down to superior teams. The Reserves brought great credit to the amalgamation and the 'old-timers' who blended with younger players will long be remembered and particularly in the preliminary final when they overwhelmed ADFA. They were a credit to the Belconnen Magpies. The Under 19's proved two things. First, there is a wealth of

talent amongst our juniors which gives promise for the future. Second, players who wear the black and white of the Belconnen Magpies must learn to be winners, which means 120 minutes of allout effort. With that - win or lose - we always come out with our heads high.

Our Monaro team with Tassie Van Diemen as coach, and practically everything else, also made the Grand Final to go down to a superior Harman. Our congratulations to Tassie and we express the hope to have much closer relations in 1987 with the Monaro team.

The three junior organisations fielded six premiership winning teams. We congratulate all coaches, players and parents. The appointment of John Dess as Junior Development Officer means that the young footballers in Belconnen will be assisted in their development by the senior organisation in all possible ways in the future.

For me the senior team in 1986 was summed up in one moment when I walked into the rooms after the last game against Tuggeranong and saw the stricken look on the faces of Norm and the players. was all there. Early and seemingly well-founded hopes in the pre-season carnival and first round, the loss of key players, an under-manned back line, a loss of concentration at vital stages and finally the bad luck of football. Thank you Norm for striving all the year against the odds and never giving up and for your generous step in passing on the mantle to a playing coach now currently being sought by your Recruiting Committee. To the players, young and old, I express my gratitude for one precious thing. You put on the black and white - for some an uneasy step - and you worked and played together harmoniously and generously. In so doing you have set a tradition for the years ahead. From it will grow success; Mal Manson, who donned the black and white, won the League goal kicking and our Best and Fairest award is a fitting prototype of the Belconnen champion of tomorrow.

There are so many I need to thank that I run the risk of a tedious list of names. Some must go in the record. Greg Matthews began with great purpose and generosity until illness forced his resignation. Terry Lewis worked tirelessly almost to the end of the season when again ill-health struck. We wish you both a complete recovery. Ray Baguley never gave up on a whole range of activities and above all never lost faith in the amalgamation while David Bennett, on and off the field, proved to me that the great tradition of Australian mateship brings victory out of defeat. To all those - to the women in particular who worked with Bernie, on the Ball Committee and in endless other ways helped us - I express my thanks.

Finally to those who read this report I say only - stop being negative - get up and give something of yourselves and make the Belconnen Magpies victorious in 1987.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This report relates to the football operations for the period 1 January 1986 to 31 December 1986.

The fund-raising target for the year was \$68,000. However, due to unsuccessful attempts to attract a major sponsor and the limited number of people involved with fund-raising, the Committee was able to raise only \$44,000.

This was made up of catering (50%); player sponsorship (16%); carnival (10%); Pot of Gold (1%); functions (4%); raffle (3%); ACTAFL grant (4%) and other income (12%).

Many thanks to all those involved in fund-raising, in particular Bernie Pocock, Ray Baguley, Joy Dunn, David Bennett, Jeff McCaskill and Joy Maloney.

Football expenditure was again well controlled with player insurance and the ACTAFL levy being the only items to exceed their budget. The overall expenditure budget for the year was \$72,000. The income shortfall for the football operations was met equally by the two licensed premises.

It is my view that the Club over-committed itself on player payments this year. The match payment scheme for 1987 will need to be reviewed to reward players for their success and to ensure that payments are within the Club's capacity to pay.

If football operations are to be financially successful in 1987, more support is required on the committee, especially in the area of fund-raising. With our large combined football following it is unfair to continue to leave the work to the same few people.

Belconnen is your Club and it desperately needs you to become involved.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

FUND-RAISING

The 1986 football fund-raising program, although it did not achieve its target of \$68,000, was successful given the failure to obtain a major sponsor and the extremely limited resources involved.

During the year, it became apparent that too many supporters and players thought that the amalgamation would bring with it 'money trees'. As a result many people were reluctant to become involved in fund-raising activities. This was reflected in the overall program where eight of the ten fund-raising budget items did not achieve their target. This is no reflection on those involved, who always did their best with very little assistance.

Belconnen thanks all those involved in fund-raising during 1986 and looks forward to greater involvement next year from members, supporters and players not already involved.

Fund raising activities conducted during the year included:

- Pre-Season Carnival this was Belconnen's fourth carnival and the most successful, realising a profit of over \$4,000. This would not have been possible without the efforts of the organiser, David Bennett, and the support both of the sponsors, Expert Systems Pty Ltd (Australia) and Aristocrat, and of the Clubs that participated. The Club appreciates their efforts and support. Appreciation is also extended to those who assisted with activities on the day. The Carnival has established itself as a popular and important part of the ACTAFL calendar.
- Catering Sincere thanks to Bernie Pocock for his constant efforts in co-ordinating and running the catering. Without Bernie's efforts the football operations may well have been under continual financial pressure throughout the year. Thanks to Joy Dunn, Joy Maloney, Jim Peile and Perc Matthews for assisting Bernie and to all those who assisted by working during the year.
- Player sponsorship In 1986 there were 33 player sponsors. Their support enabled the Club to raise \$7,000 to assist football. The Club extends its appreciation to each sponsor and to Ray Baguley for his efforts in co-ordinating this promotion. Thanks also to Jeff McCaskill for assisting Ray.
- Pot of Gold This year's Pot of Gold was extremely disappointing, realising only 5% of its budget. The Pot of Gold received very little overall support and to prevent any further waste of time and resources it will not be continued in 1987.

UNDER 19 GRADE

In the home-and-away matches the team won 13, lost 5 and missed second place only on percentages. In the finals, Belconnen was the losing Grand Finalist to Manuka Weston. With the exception of Ainslie, which it defeated for the first time in a nail-biting Preliminary Final, Belconnen beat every other side at least twice.

Despite the disappointment of the Grand Final loss, the team overcame substantial difficulties to get that far.

The greatest disruption was the number of injuries sustained throughout the Club. Although it gave the Selection Committee a major problem, it had the advantage of giving opportunities to more young players than usual. Of the Under 19 list, five players won permanent First Grade places and a further eleven gained open-age experience, mainly at the top level.

Within the team the early loss of Jeff Dunne for half the season and the car accident to Captain Scott Reid started an injury trend which meant that at no time, including the Grand Final, did the team field its strongest side. Despite these problems, the top results demonstrated the basic strength of the team. Its competitiveness was helped by the support given by some talented members of the West Canberra Under 17 team. The difficulties of the season underline the worth of a good coach and, for the second successive year, Mick Burgess brought a team to the Grand Final against the odds. His experience combined with his enthusiasm, time and effort despite his family and business commitments was a major factor in the team's success. The support he received from his wife, Anita, should not be forgotten.

As Captain, Tim Xirakis, who also had his injury problems, succeeded Scott Reid who continued his support from the sidelines. The ever-present 'Stan' Trevaskis was Vice-Captain. Of the awards, Mark Garrity was a clear winner of the Best and Fairest. In his first season of football, except for some schools matches, he had an outstanding year and his loss from the Finals through injury was a sad blow. The ever-reliable Michael Molony was Runner-up and narrowly but deservedly won the Player of the Finals award. Although neither Darren Cain (Most Consistent) nor Emil Milat (Most Improved) were outstanding in their Under 17 days they both showed what hard work can do. Darren developed into a valuable utility player and 'Camel', as his confidence grew, was a key member of a strong half-back line. The Coach's Award went to 'Stan' Trevaskis for his 100% effort for the team both on and off the field.

Finally, this report records its appreciation of the support team: to Managers Gerard Conway and Glenn O'Sullivan, the Club trainers (with a special 'thank you' to Gary Schmidt), the runners (especially Brett Allison), timekeepers Paul Gunn and Reg Proctor and the latter's attention to some of the necessary paperwork, the Under 19 First Graders for their valuable help at training and at matches, Jeff McCaskill for his aid and advice and, last but not least, to that small band of supporters who followed the team throughout the season.

MONARO LEAGUE

The Belconnen side that competed in the First Division of the Monaro League improved substantially during the season and proved that it was easily the next best side to Harman. We were the only team to improve our results against Harman on each occasion we played them before the finals and we deserved to be the team that played Harman in the Grand Final. Congratulations to all players, officials and supporters on making the Grand Final and thank you for your support.

The season consisted of fifteen rounds with the six teams in First Division playing each other three times. I was appointed coach about six weeks before the season began, which didn't give a lot of time for the necessary pre-season work. I also had a group of players with varying degrees of skill, fitness and experience. The first round of the season highlighted our lack of preparation. Our skill level, fitness and team work were still below average. However, we managed to win two of the first five games. For me, the best game of this round was against CCAE. The team, 42 points down at the last change, showed what it was capable of in losing by only a handful of points. The players who excelled in the first round were P. Dellamarta, B. Foster, T. Atkinson, M. Ryan and K. Ryan.

The second round of the season began with a big loss to Harman. Although I felt we had improved greatly, player attitude was a problem as defeat was being accepted too easily and losing was becoming a habit. To everyone's credit, the side pulled together and began playing a classy but tough brand of football in defeating ADFA (17 goals), CCAE (20 goals), ANU and Ainslie. We finished the second round in third position, with a healthy percentage, and only one game behind CCAE.

The last round began with the team's best game of the season. Although not fielding our strongest side, we harassed, chased and tackled well and played tough, aggressive football to take Harman right down to the wire. After that loss, the side again won its next four games to finish the season in second position, with our percentage bettered only by that of Harman. Players who stood out in the last round were D. Pocock, P. McGregor, S. Blundell, J. Lynch, R. Pocock and M. Ryan.

The finals were a mixed bag - two losses and a great win in the Preliminary Final. In the Second Semi-Final against Harman we had most of the play early on but failed to capitalise and Harman powered away to win comfortably. Our best players were P. McGregor, K. Glossop, J. Lynch and P. Dellamarta. The players were very nervous before the Preliminary Final against CCAE but two early goals settled them down. The match was close until late in the third quarter when our determination, class and aggressive tackling eventually saw us run away with the game. Best players were K. Ryan, S. Blundell, G. Reid, J. Lynch and P. Dellamarta. In the Grand Final Harman was, simply, the best side and deserving premiers - too fast, too strong and more disciplined than we were. To our players' credit, they battled the game out to the final siren, particularly P. Dellamarta, S.

Blundell, J. Lynch and Z. Paterttini. I hope that the players learnt that day that a side needs self-discipline, team discipline and preparedness to do the hard work (run, chase, tackle and talk constructively) to win the big games.

I would like to thank sincerely the following people for their help during the year: John Geary, for undertaking the difficult job of team manager; Julie Ryan, a tremendous effort helping out in many areas but most importantly as statistician,; Ian Delaney, for being our runner during the year and Peter Dunn for doing the job in the Grand Final; Barry Reid, for his support to me and the side late in the season; Gary Schmidt, for being our trainer for the finals and when he could help out during the season; all the supporters; the Belconnen and West Canberra licensed premises; and my wife and best friend Nicky.

Special mention must also be made of David Pocock, who won the Monaro League Managers' Award for First Division and was less than three votes short of winning the League Best and Fairest. Others to poll well in the League voting were R. Pocock, P. Dellamarta, M. Ryan and K. Ryan.

Finally, I thank all the players for putting up with me during the year. I have made a lot of friends and I especially thank you for the opportunity of playing probably my last game of football in a Grand Final. I wish the Belconnen Club all the best in season '87.

PREFACE

Above all, Club records reflect the loyalty, careers, and success of players. The Committee believes that it is important to preserve, as far as possible, the records of the two Clubs that now form the Belconnen Football Club. The records presented below will be expanded as more information becomes available.

The outstanding milestone in 1986 was the achievement of Noel O'Neill in reaching 200 ACTAFL First Grade matches. After his early games with Ainslie, he has been a consistent performer with Belconnen since 1977 and was the League's leading goalkicker in 1983. Not far behind in achievement was David Bennett who gained the Belconnen First Grade record and completed 200 Club matches. To underline the difficulty of the performances it took Noel 14 years and David 12 years, the latter despite making a massive 135 consecutive Club appearances before missing a match through injury. With 10 years service, Steve Lancaster has totalled 138 first grade matches.

This accentuates the durability of ex-Belconnen Captain-Coach Ken Grigg who, with Tuggeranong this season, beat the previous ACTAFL First Grade record of 280 matches and, rumour has it, now has the 300 mark in his sights!

Durability could be applied also to Dennis Hopkins. After a long and distinguished career with Queanbeyan he recorded 51 First Grade matches with his 'new' Club, was admitted to the ACTAFL 200 Club and then 'retired' to Reserve Grade where he currently has played 58 games.

In the missed milestones category Frank Southwell is on 199 Club matches but has the compensation of gaining the Reserve Grade record. Pleasingly, eleven of the sixteen players listed above are ex-Juniors.

REPRESENTATIVE HONOURS

Geoff Hocking, who captained the successful Fosters Shield side, and Peter Taylor represented the ACT once again and were joined by Brett Allison and Don Oliver. Brett, at 17, followed in the footsteps of his father, Tom, who played for and coached the Representative Team in the early 1970s.

Peter McMenamin, Brett Matthews, Sean Michelle, Rogan Sharp and Jamie Smith all played for the ACT Colts with Brett also being a member of the ACT Teal Cup (Under 17) team.

BEST AND FAIREST

Although Club voting was clear cut, no player managed to catch the eye of the umpires consistently.

In First Grade, Mal Manson gained the Club award by seven votes from Peter Taylor. This was an outstanding performance as, traditionally, full forwards are given scant regard by voters. His last success was in 1974 when he won the T. A. Wharton Trophy (Under 19 Grade) and was runner-up to his twin brother in Club voting. This season he did best for the Club in the Mulrooney Medal in what was a meagre poll of votes.

In Reserve Grade, John Broekhuyse crowned a top season in winning by 17 votes from Peter McPhan and Grant Martin, although he played in only 12 of the 18 matches. Twenty players gained votes in the League's J. McNamara Trophy with Steve Walding best on 10 votes from 11 games and equal eighth.

In Under 19 Grade no wise bookmaker would have taken odds on the Club result. Mark Garrity in his first full year of football won by a massive 39 votes although missing four matches. Five votes covered the next six places with Michael Molony on 32 gaining runner-up by one vote. Jeff Dunne's effort of 30 votes from six matches was outstanding. In the T. A. Wharton Trophy, 18 players won votes with Brendan Trevaskis doing best. Astonishingly, Mark Garrity, with an excellent playing attitude, failed to get a mention.


The ACTAJFL Under 17 Grade, Division 1 award went to Jason Gregory of Belconnen South who won by a substantial 13 votes. (His father, Winston, who holds the Belconnen Reserve Grade goalkicking record, coached the Under 17 side.)

GOALKICKING

In First Grade, Mal Manson was the League's leading goalkicker for the second successive year. He scored 62 goals in 15 matches although he played in defence in four of those matches. He kicked six goals or more at least once against each other side in the competition with a best of 9.5 against Queanbeyan. With 9 goals in two Pre-Season Competition matches and a further 9 in a Reserve Grade game, he scored 80 goals in 18 games for the season. His First Grade career total is 534 from 158 matches at an average of 3.38. In Reserve Grade, Noel O'Neill led with 36 goals in 13 games (49 First and Reserve Grade goals in 22 matches) and was well supported by Graeme Wilson with 31 in 18 matches. Robbie Walker, with 28 goals from 15 matches, was best in Under 19 Grade but although the team scored well generally throughout the season, it lacked a consistent striker.

OTHER PERFORMANCES

Steve Walding, back again after retiring in 1983, has the unique distinction of being the only player still competing who appeard in Belconnen's first First Grade match in 1971. He holds the record for being the youngest First Grader to complete for that For the first time since their inception, the Cock of the North Trophy and the Neil Conlan Memorial Trophy graced our trophy cabinet (briefly) at the same time. Regrettably, they were back with Ainslie and Manuka respectively by the end of the In the not-to-be-kept-as-a-permanent-record category, our combined losing margins in the Grand Finals in the Reserve, Under 19 and Monaro competitions totalled more than 350 points. In consolation, at least we made the final day of the season. the Juniors, of the 22 teams entered by the three Junior organisations in the competitive Under 11 to Under 17 Grades, 15 reached the Finals. Seven of these were Grand Finalists with As an indicator for the flow of Juniors to the four winners.
