

TREASURER'S REPORT

This report relates to the football operations for the period 1 January 1987 to 31 December 1987.

The fund-raising target for the year was \$49,000. However, due to the downturn in spectator support at ACTAFL games during 1987 and the limited number of people involved with fund-raising, the Committee was able to raise only \$28,000.

This was made up of catering (40%); player sponsorship (21%); carnival (14%); functions (3%); raffles (12%) and other income (10%).

Many thanks to all those involved in fund-raising, in particular Sonia Thomas, Kaye McCaskill, Denise Molony, Anne Matthews and Leanne Weinert.

Football expenditure was again well controlled with equipment purchases and the ACTAFL levy being the only items to exceed their budget. The overall expenditure budget for the year was \$65,000. The income shortfall for the football operations is to be met equally by the two licensed premises.

Again this year the overall fund-raising programme lacked enough support and the results were most disappointing.

With ACTAFL under financial pressure, mainly due to lack of sponsorship and spectator support, Belconnen and other ACTAFL clubs can expect levies to increase significantly in 1988. This will mean a bigger fund-raising effort by more supporters than ever before.

The club is going through an extremely difficult period and a genuine and united commitment from everyone is required.

FUND-RAISING


The 1987 football fund-raising program, was made more difficult due to the lack of spectator support at ACTAFL games, the limited success of the teams and an insufficient number of people involved.

Thanks to all those who assisted by working during the year. It is unfortunate that very small crowds at games severely restricted catering profits this year.
- Player sponsorship In 1987 there were 29 player sponsors. Their support enabled the Club to raise \$6,000 to assist football. The Club extends its appreciation to each sponsor and to Sonia Thomas for her efforts in co-ordinating this promotion. Thanks also to Jeff McCaskill for assisting Sonia, and Elaine Wise for the signwriting of the photos.
- Raffles Thanks to everyone who assisted with the raffles during the year, especially, Henry Posch and Jeff McCaskill. The Club's profits totalled \$3300.

FIRST GRADE

UNDER 19 GRADE

The Under 19 Grade side had a mixed 1987 season. In terms of games won success was limited. However a number of players achieved berths in the First Grade side and this will provide experience and some foundation for next season.

The team started the season with a resounding 168 point win over Queanbeyan followed by a 48 point win over Ainslie. We then lost the next eight games. However twelve players from the first game were unavailable due to First Grade selection, injury or other commitments. Five of the eight losses were by less than a goal. After regrouping mid season the gauntlet to make the final four was thrown down. A finals berth was achieved with a strong win in the last game over Tuggeranong. Disappointment was to follow with our elimination by Ainslie in the first semi-final. Although the wet conditions did not suit our style of play it appeared that we lacked commitment and endeavour to win under the conditions.

During the year 42 players were given games, including seven Under 17s one of whom, Ross Howe, completed the season as a regular First Grader. Of the 42 players, 27 (excluding the Under 17s) are still eligible for Under 19 Grade next season.

Those whom I consider displayed consistency and endeavour were John Kennedy, Richard Truesdale, Matt Hunt, David Hanley, Stan Trevaskis, Mick and Glenn Hassett and Max Kinmonth. JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT

Early in the year a Junior Development Committee was formed, comprising members from each junior club - Belconnen South, Belconnen North and West Canberra. With the help of this committee we were able to conduct a number of exercises throughout the year which, I am sure, will prove beneficial to the future development of the Club.

Peter Taylor has joined the small band of players who have achieved 200 Club matches. Like all those who have had the satisfaction and enjoyment of reaching this target, it has taken years of determination, club loyalty and sheer hard work. That his efforts have been rewarded with success is indicated in some of the following paragraphs. Both Peter and David Bennett, who extended his Belconnen First Grade record to 191, are seven matches short of gaining entrance to the ACTAFL 200 Club. It seems that one good double act is guaranteed for 1988. Amongst those starting out on this long road is Tony Monaghan who has achieved the rare feat of playing 40 Under 19 matches although he qualifies for this grade for one more year. One hopes that if he stays the distance he gets the same enjoyment and success that Peter and David have done.

REPRESENTATIVE HONOURS

Geoff Hocking, as captain, and Peter Taylor again represented the ACT whilst Jamie Smith won the top honours for the first time. Geoff has represented the Territory in each of his five seasons in Canberra. Peter holds the Club record with sixteen representative appearances. Marcus Emmerton, Dennis Grubb, Ross Howe, Robert Kelly, Michael Sloan and Phil Smith were members of the ACT Teal Cup (Under 17) team.

BEST AND FAIREST

As well as their representative honours Geoff Hocking and Peter Taylor had a two-man battle for the First Grade Club Best and Fairest with Peter winning eventually 84 votes to 81. In his eleven years in First Grade Peter has won the trophy four times

and has been runner-up on three occasions. Geoff won in 1983 and 1984. Most pleasing was the forward showing of the younger players. Rogan Sharp polled heavily in the latter half of the season for a deserved third and was followed closely by Tony Stubbs, who bounced back after a frustrating, injury-ridden 1986, and Kyran O'Shaughnessy who won his votes in thirteen of the fifteen matches. Unfortunately few players caught the eye of the umpires for the Mulrooney Medal.

Brian Diamond earned the Reserve Grade award for a consistent, hard-working season missing the votes in only one of his ten matches and also gaining votes in three of his five matches in First Grade. Last year's winner John Broekhuyse was runner-up six points behind and had the distinction of equal sixth place in the League's J. McNamara Trophy.

In Under 19 Grade Brett Matthews got home by one point from Tony Monaghan with David Hanley and 'Stan' Trevaskis close up in equal third place. Brett's effort was outstanding. He scored votes in all of his seven matches and was equal third in the League's T. A. Wharton Trophy.

GOALKICKERS

The individual goalkicking totals underlined the general problems of the season. All teams lacked a consistent spearhead and only Graeme Wilson reached 30 goals for the year with 27 in First Grade and 9 in Reserves.

A typical goal sneak, he led the First Grade scorers and was followed by David Bennett with 16. Not normally associated with the 'sharp' end of the field David's First Grade career total for the previous twelve season was 24 goals!

Pip O'Brien with 26 led the Reserve Graders, with John Broekhuyse on 20. Max Kinmonth and Tony Monaghan were the major scorers in Under 19 with 23 and 22 respectively whilst Brendan Scotland recorded 14 goals from the four matches that he played.

In the not-to-be-remembered records Reserve Grade kicked 17 consecutive behinds in the 7-23 to 13-7 loss to Tuggeranong.

OTHER PERFORMANCES

Brett Allison recorded a solid performance in his first year with North Melbourne with some first grade appearances. Any disappointment at not cementing a permanent first team spot must have been sweetened by an end-of-season trip to North America.

Ex-Belconnen Jamie Pyke continued playing First Grade football with Norwood and also won himself a place in the South Australian Sheffield Shield team in the latter half of the last cricket season, producing good results as an all-rounder in the matches in which he played.
