

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



Looking back on the season there is one thing above all that stands out. The harmony between the Committee, the officials, the players and the three senior coaches has been remarkable. We trusted each other and, although on-field success was generally lacking, the spirit of the reborn Blues was higher than ever. From that spirit success will flow.

At the end of last season I told the players that we would not be able to pay them this year. All I could promise was that we would do our best to get them a good coach. They were generous in their response and, as far as I am aware, no player was lost because of that decision.

The appointment of Alex Jesaulenko was a remarkable coup for the Club. As a legend in Australian football and captain-coach of a VFL premiership team, Alex came to us with a reputation unrivalled in the history of ACTAFL.

Under Alex the seniors played their best football for several seasons. As the year progressed it became clear that no team could take us lightly and that we would not lie down and let the opposition run over us. The young players can look to the future for their laurels but I must mention a few names. David Bennett gave more than his all and was a deserved winner of the Best and Fairest, John Dess was always a true captain, Sean Michelle rucked until he almost dropped and Peter Taylor showed us the form of a genuine champion as the season went on. Where they led others followed.

Success will not come easily and hard work and sacrifice is still demanded of us all. I do not need to remind anyone how close to the rocks Belconnen has sailed, nor that there have been some unfortunates who have stood back and waited for disaster to overtake us. Due to the wholehearted effort of a few dedicated people the Blues, both as Club and team, have survived. Our financial survival has been an achievement in itself. With ACTAFL lacking a major sponsor it cost us over \$17,000 in levies to stay in the competition. We are grateful to Campbell Brede and National Capital Motors, as well as to all our sponsors, for their generous assistance in helping us to pull through this year.

Some might ask whether it was worthwhile. Others may even think that we would be better off playing a game for losers in a lesser competition. The Committee is totally dedicated to the proposition that, for the good of our code in Belconnen and the youngsters who want to play it at its highest level, the Blues must survive and prosper in ACTAFL.

Survival of the Blues depends on the continued financial and social viability of the Shed. A successful team in 1989 will help the Shed but we need more players, officials and supporters. The tried and the true will still be with us and to them all I express my warmest gratitude. To the others I can only say - join us and help make the Blues and the Shed a team and a Club of which we are all proud.

TREASURER'S REPORT



This report relates to the football operations for the period 1 January 1988 to 31 December 1988.

Sincere thanks must go to my predecessor, Michael Price, who did a superb job over a number of years and particularly during the trying period of the amalgamation. At the time of Mike's retirement, the Club was left in a position of having no football debts, probably for the first time. For this achievement alone he should feel well satisfied.

The Club this year embarked on a policy which made it, at least temporarily, an amateur organisation. This policy has helped reduce the overall expenditure budget from \$65,000 in 1987 to \$53,600 this year. At the beginning of the year we had budgeted for this figure to be even lower, however we were somewhat dismayed to find that the ACTAFL club levy had risen from \$7,500 in 1987 to \$17,600. ACTAFL are confident of acquiring a major sponsor for 1989 which should see club levies fall. The table below shows the individual income items for 1988 and their percentage of the total income.

Obviously, if some of this enormous workload could be shared more equitably, then there would be more time devoted to the preparation of each function resulting in increased income.

All in all the year has allowed us to consolidate our financial position and for the second year in a row we should go into the following year with no debts.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

FUND-RAISING

Fund raising activities conducted during the year included:

- Pre-Season Carnival Once again financially successful, the sixth Carnival raised \$3500. The Club was fortunate to secure K. G. Putt Real Estate as sponsors of the carnival thanks go to Peter Zakharoff in particular. The failure of 2 of the 6 local first grade sides to participate in this year's carnival was, however, most disappointing and detrimental to the promotion of Australian football in the ACT. It is to be hoped that the ACTAFL will take a strong stand to require the participation of all local Clubs in next year's carnival. Special thanks to David Bennett for organising and running his fifth carnival.
- Home games Sincere thanks to Judy Hynes who brought her extraordinary catering talents to bear in running the caravan at home games and providing a varied after-game dinner menu at the Club. Thanks also to Denise Molony who organised the roster of caravan helpers and to those who filled the roster. For the first time the Club received all the gate revenue from home games at Jamison Oval. The amount raised was very pleasing.
- . Car raffles Football operations income will include the profits of one of the two car raffles conducted by the Club in 1988. The importance of the car raffles lies in their minimal use of the Club's resources as well as in their providing nearly 20% of the football budget. Thanks again to Peter Jonas for organising the car raffles and congratulations to Eric and Lesley Goodrum for continuing to co-ordinate ticket sales so successfully.
- . Sponsorship Apart from the direct financial benefits, the appointment of National Capital Motors as our major sponsor will prove to be a key factor in determining the future direction of the Club both on and off the field. We are very fortunate to have a close relationship with our major sponsor and we welcome Campbell and Jenny Brede,

the staff of National Capital Motors and their families to our Club. A number of other significant sponsorships were arranged this year directed, in particular, to providing high quality weekly best player awards. Our sincere thanks go to Kinh Do Restaurant, Bacchus Tavern Restaurant, George's Seafood and Steakhouse, The Fishing Village Restaurant, Macquarie Service Station, Macquarie Owl Food Barn, Evatt Butchery, GIO Insurance, American Express, Reg Proctor, Paragon Printers and K. SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

The social calendar for 1988 has been filled with a wide variety of well-run and generally well-attended functions. Thanks in particular to David Bennett, Lesley Daw, Robert and Helen Goddard, Peter Jonas and Kerry Sanders for the time and effort they have devoted to ensuring a year of successful social events.

The recent decision by the ACTAFL that each Club will play at least 10 Saturday games next year will give a boost to the Club's social program, as well as to fund-raising in general.

Functions conducted during the year included:

- Reunion Ball held on 5 March with 180 people celebrating the 'Rebirth of the Blues'. The Ball was held at the CCAE Refectory and was a memorable night: Alex Jesaulenko was introduced as Senior Coach, Life Memberships were presented to David Bennett and Michael Price and National Capital Motors were introduced as the Club's major sponsor.
- Quiz nights have proved popular and enjoyable although inevitably dominated by the Attorney-General's Department.

LIFE MEMBERS

Three people were awarded life membership during 1988: David Bennett, Michael Price and Judy Hynes.

David Bennett

'Curly' has a long and distinguished playing career with the Club, starting with the Juniors in 1971. During his junior days he won ACTAFL's Best and Fairest award in the Under 17s Div 2 in 1974. In 1975 he won the T.A. Wharton Trophy for league Best and Fairest in the Under 19s. During his 14 years playing service with the Seniors (equalling the Club record) he has won the First Grade Best and Fairest in 1980 and 1988 and been runner-up in 1977, 1981 and 1983. In addition, in 1984 and 1985 he received the Best Clubman award.

Clearly, from such an impressive record David's commitment to football has been outstanding. But his contribution to the Club does not stop on the field. He has been a Committeeman for nine years, with four years as Vice-President. He has been an extremely active Committeeman taking on many of the time-consuming, behind-the-scenes jobs that many take for granted.

There could be no more worthy a recipient of life membership than David Bennett.

<u>Michael Price</u>

Like David, Michael has made outstanding contributions to the Club, both on and off the field. He joined Belconnen in 1976 from East Perth. Of his 108 games with the Club 103 were in First Grade. He missed just one match during this time and was awarded Most Consistent Player in 1977.

Michael was a Committeeman for six years with two years as Treasurer. He temporarily, we hope, stood down from the Committee for 1988 to set up in business.

For most of his years on the Committee Michael was directly responsible for raising in excess of \$40,000 each year. This bears testimony to his ability as an outstanding administrator. In 1983 he won the Best Clubman award in recognition of his efforts.

Life membership is a reward thoroughly deserved by one of the Club's hardest-working and most effective contributors.

Judy Hynes

Judy has been a stalwart of both the Belconnen South Junior and the Belconnen Senior clubs for more years than she probably cares to remember. She has been involved with the juniors since her sons started playing and is a former president and long serving committee member of that club. When her sons graduated to senior ranks she extended her involvement to the senior club, while still retaining her links with the juniors. Even now, with her sons retired from football, Judy is still active on the committee of the licensed club. Over many years Judy has worked tirelessly as a function organiser, co-ordinated the catering at hundreds of games, run many shop stalls and done odd jobs that must run into the thousands. She is probably most fondly remembered by the players, parents and supporters alike for the hours she has spent in the kitchen preparing meals and snacks for functions, players teas and dinners at the club after games. The Club would like to show its appreciation for all of Judy's efforts by bestowing this life membership on a most worthy recipient.

BEST CLUBMAN

The 1988 Best Clubman, Paul Kelly, began his association with the Club as a player in 1972-1973 but now leaves the physical side of things to his son Robert.

In his first year of involvement with the administration of the Senior Club, Paul has shouldered a heavy workload with great efficiency and good humour. As First Grade team manager he has attended more training sessions than most players and ensured the smooth functioning of team administration. Paul also gave great support to Alex Jesaulenko as a member of the Match Committee. Throughout the year Paul also bore the burden of a variety of other tasks such as managing the collection of home gate revenues. Paul has been an invaluable acquisition to the Club as an administrator and we thank him for his efforts this year.

I faced my return to Canberra and football with a great deal of excitement but also with more than a little trepidation. I came with my eyes wide open, fully aware of Belconnen's difficulties on the football field in recent years and the loss of key players. I must say that I was made particularly welcome at the Club right from day one and the excellent attitude of the players on the training track made my job so much easier.

At the start of the year I set just the one objective — to be competitive each week. Now at the end of the season I can say that while we did not quite achieve that objective we were not far from it. The potential of some of our younger players became increasingly evident as the season wore on. We have a wealth of exciting prospects for 1989. However, to get the most from our younger brigade we need that core of experienced players. It is important that we retain as many of our old hands as possible for our assault on 1989. Recruiting for next season is also important for a side as young as ours. Already significant efforts have been made, with players in the Albury and Wagga areas as well as the VFL being targeted. I am confident that we will succeed in gaining the services of some experienced key position players for next season.

Continued growth in confidence and maturity of our younger players, blended with our few experienced hands and several key recruits will, with effort, undoubtedly enable us to realise next year the goal I set at the beginning of this year. However, it is not going to fall in to place. Hard work is needed. Pre-season weight training for seniors, Under 19s and Under 17s will commence before Christmas. Normal pre-season training will commence in February.

I would like to thank the players for their efforts over the season and congratulate David Bennett, John Dess and Jeff Dunne, as well as all the other award winners for their successful year. Besides the players there are many people to thank. In particular I thank John Dess for his leadership as captain and his valuable contribution as a member of the Match Committee. The thankless task of Manager was taken on most efficiently by Paul Kelly. As if that was not enough, Paul also gave me great support as a member of the Match Committee. I also thank Greg O'Neill for his support and contributions to the Match Committee.

Our trainers, Andy Anderson, Gary Schmidt, Geoff Hawker, and Kym Austin have put in many hours of effort for nothing more than the 'honour and glory' this year. Their role is a crucial but often overlooked one. For their dedication and efficiency I say thanks. I also thank Steve Walding and Les Williams for their time and effort in the challenging role as fitness coaches.

While 1988 has not been the most successful of seasons, I am optimistic that 1989 will see the beginning of the re-emergence of Belconnen as a force in ACTAFL football. I am confident that the patience of our supporters will be rewarded next year.

RESERVE GRADE



Season 1988 for Reserve Grade was similar to many that have gone before. We promised a lot at times and had some noteworthy wins against the top teams. But, as in the past, we faltered toward the end of the season. For a side that finished fifth but should have gone further, the season was disappointing.

I know that many Reserve Grade footballers treat their football as a social outing as much as a competitive team sport. This is particularly evident from the very poor attendances at training for much of the year. I am convinced that as soon as the players decide to really give it a go - and by that I mean a solid commitment to training - the results will fall into place. We have the talent - we certainly had it this year - but we fail to take proper advantage of it. That is a truly disappointing and frustrating position to be in. A competitive Reserve Grade side means a competitive First Grade side and a strong club.

Despite the disappointments, there were some noteworthy performances over the season. In particular, I congratulate Greg Gill on his best and fairest effort, Gerry Conway and Alan Lyall for their consistency and all the other award winners.

There are many people who gave me great support during the year and whom I thank most sincerely. They are Peter Jonas, Tim Xirakis, Paul Kelly, Robert Kelly, Frank Goddard and all the trainers - Gary Schmidt, Kim Austin, Andy Anderson, Geoff Hawker - for their various assistance in selecting, managing and generally supporting the team. I also give a special thanks to my daughter, Anna, for her help with the drinks and other tasks throughout the year.

In looking to 1989, I think it is important to consider a policy of promoting potential first grade players from the Under 19s into Reserve Grade. This will have the effect of better preparing the Under 19s for senior football as well as strengthening Reserve Grade ranks — and not just in terms of player ability but more importantly in terms of player attitude. Reserve Grade must be treated seriously. Its success is crucial to the Club's success. I am confident that greater commitment to Reserve Grade will be rewarded next year.


When I sit back and look at the year's results it is easy to contemplate each 'if only' and each 'should have' and think we could have won the premiership. But the reality is we did not go on with it when it counted.


With a late start to our pre-season preparations we began the season behind the eight ball. We went into the first game with just one practice match under our belt and with a group of players brought together from three different junior clubs. As a result the side was very disjointed and could only manage three wins from the first eight games.

Throughout the season we had operated on a simple policy of 'don't train, don't play'. By adhering to this policy we managed to maintain a good roll up at training thus creating pressure for positions while also generating a bond between the players. To maintain this policy, player depth is required and this was highlighted by the fact that through the season we had 45 players, of whom 32 kicked goals and 33 polled votes in the Club Best and Fairest voting. At about mid-season results started to show and we went on to win 9 of the last 12 games and qualify for the finals.

Although it was disappointing to bow out in the first game of a finals series when going into the match as favourites, there was great satisfaction for me in coaching a team of young men who were prepared to train hard and give their all on the field. Congratulations to all trophy winners and, in particular, to our captain Brett Matthews who deservedly won his second consecutive Under 19 Grade Best and Fairest award.

My thanks to Frank Goddard, Reg Proctor and especially Greg Weir for their help and support throughout the year.







1988 was a successful year both on and off the field for junior football in the Belconnen area.

The Belconnen South and Belconnen North Junior Clubs worked together closely, fielding combined sides in several age groups, including Under 15s and Under 17s, Divisions 1 and 2, and holding a very successful joint Presentation Day. The purpose of combining teams for the Division 1 and Division 2 Under 17 competitions was to give the more mature footballers the best possible preparation for senior football and allow the developing players to mature in their own time.

The two Clubs fielded 7 teams in the Under 12 and up age groups, as well as teams in the Under 7 to Under 11 Aussie Footy grades. Of the 7 teams from Under 12s to Under 17s, 6 made the finals and 3 the Grand Final (Under 15s and Under 17s Divisions 1 and 2). The highlight of the year was the Grand Final victory of the Under 17 Division 1 side.

1989 holds a number of challenges for the junior and senior clubs:

- the need to develop a long-term strategy for channelling the continued strength of our junior clubs into producing successful senior sides and channelling the large base of junior parents into support for the senior sides and our licensed premises;
- the need to establish an effective identity as the sole ACTAFL Club in the Belconnen area and to discharge our responsibility for Australian football throughout Belconnen, including the West Canberra juniors and Radford College;
- . the need to rationalise further the administrative arrangements between our junior clubs.

The Belconnen Football Club sincerely thanks Greg Watt (President, Belconnen South) and Terry Stewart (President, Belconnen North) and their committees for their efforts during the year. 1988 also saw the appointment of Mick Burgess as the Club's Junior Development Co-ordinator. Mick's enthusiasm and expertise was greatly appreciated by junior parents and players and he provided an important link with the Senior Club. Thanks also to Tony Stubbs and his helpers for conducting school clinics during the year.

1988 MILESTONES AND NOTEWORTHY PERFORMANCES

PREFACE

It is hoped that readers will not think of this Section as just a lot of dry-as-dust statistics. It is intended as a very small history, recording the Club's progress over eighteen years and the success of some of the players who took part during that time. It records also all the players who helped towards the well-being of the Club during the current season - not only those who are naturally gifted and successful but also those who despite hours of conscientious training are never sure of being selected from week to week. Without the latter no club exists.

Pride of place in 1988 goes to David Bennett. He is the first player who has completed 200 First Grade matches for the Club. After winning the League's Under 17 (Division 2) Best and Fairest Trophy in the Juniors in 1974 David had a season in the Under 19 competition in 1975 together with a few games in Reserve Grade. In that season he won the Under 19 T.A. Wharton Trophy (but missed the Club trophy which went to Peter Taylor). By mid-1976 he had cemented a place in First Grade and so liked the experience that he recorded 109 consecutive First Grade games before he missed a match through injury in 1982. This was the first game in which he did not compete for the Club since his senior debut in 1975 - 135 consecutive matches. Although he has been less indestructable since 1984 he has missed only 16 appearances in a fourteen year career, this despite a continuing back problem that, at times, has made the playing of football less than fun. Although a natural half-back flanker he has shouldered a key defensive position to meet Club requirements for most of his career (probably the major reason that he has made only two ACT Representative appearances, both in 1979). He has won the Club First Grade Best and Fairest twice and has been Runner-up on three other occasions, was named in the 'ACTAFL Football Record 1988 Team of the Year', and, with his hard but fair style of play, has never incurred the displeasure of the League Tribunal. With the support of his wife, Lesley, he has been involved heavily in Club administration and is the type of Clubman that officials dream about but never believe they will experience.

The above record underlines the difficulty of being accepted into the League's '200 Club' but, this season, it has been achieved also by Peter Taylor with 191 Club First Grade and 16 ACT Representative matches. Space, at this stage, precludes a summary of his career but your statistician looks forward to 1989 when he will have the pleasure, hopefully, of describing the feat of Peter reaching the magical figure of 200 First Grade Club matches.

No less important are the achievements of Frank Southwell in completing 200 Club matches and increasing his Reserve Grade record, the 100 Club matches of ex-Junior Geoff Lyall, the record 54 Under 19 games of Tony Monaghan and the 50 First Grade matches by Tony Stubbs.

PLAYER SERVICE

1988 saw the return of a few old hands. Tony Hills, who left football in 1979 for a very successful and continuing badminton career after playing in the 1978 and 1979 Reserve Grade Grand Finals, had a full and impressive season in First Grade. To help out in Reserve Grade appearances were made by Dave Korda, Noel O'Neill (member of the League '200 Club' and top goalkicker), Mick Pledge (88 First Grade games), Frank Southwell, Dave Tompsett (Best and Fairest Under 19 winner 1978 and First Grade runner-up 1979) and Steve Walding. Stan Widera played twice in each of First and Reserve Grades. Three players are worth additional mention. Frank Southwell with abundant



loved playing which explains his few appearances in First Grade. Yet he provided valuable service to the Club as he was one of the backbones of Reserve Grade for many years and played in the 1978 and 1986 Reserve Grade Grand Finals. He won the J. McNamara Trophy in 1981. He was Club Reserve Grade Best and Fairest in 1983 and 1984 and Runner-up in Under 19s 1977 and Reserves 1981. Steve Walding played in the very first Belconnen First Grade match in 1971 when he was 15 and holds the record for the Club's youngest First Grade player. A member of the 1974 premiership Under 19 team, he played in the 1979 Reserves Grand Final after four years studying away from Canberra and in the 1986 Reserves Grand Final. With his appearances restricted through injury he has done much valuable work in special skills clinics with the Juniors and fitness coaching for the seniors. Stan Widera made a first appearance for the Club, briefly, in 1972 in Reserves at 14 (a Youngest Player record), was a member of the 1974 Under 19 side and, except for one year playing in Tasmania, was a regular First Grade player from 1975 to 1979. He also cemented a place in the ACT side and reached his pinnacle with his best-on-the-field in the famous victory against the VFL in 1979. He won the Club Best and Fairest in 1978 by a record margin and was Runner-up in 1975. He sent some old hearts fluttering with some not forgotten skills in his brief appearances in 1988. Steve Bayer, Gerard Conway and Greg Gill appear for the first time in 'Years of Playing Service'. Well done! Of note it is probable that Graeme Wilson has hung up his boots for the last time. In his younger days he made the big time with South Melbourne. He first played for the Club in 1983 and again from 1986 to the middle of this season when he left for Paris. His enjoyment of football wherever he was required to play, his goal-sneaking ability and the quiet smile will be much missed.

REPRESENTATIVE HONOURS

Pride of place goes to Ben Aulich in being the third Belconnen Junior to win an Australian jumper. This he did at the Australian Schoolboys (U16) Championships which, due to the large number of games played in a short period, is the toughest competition in which to win such an honour. In the following week he appeared in the Shell Cup (U15) Championships although, he admits, not quite up to his own high standards. Perhaps ten championship matches in seventeen days had something to do with it! The Belconnen area (Belconnen North and South, Radford College and West Canberra) had good representation in the various Junior championships and members should watch the following names for the future:

At senior level before transferring in their jobs Geoff Hocking (his sixth year of representative honours) and Rogan Sharp (his first inter-State game) played for the ACT in the Bicentennial Carnival. Tony Stubbs was rewarded for his consistent form with selection in the Under 23 team.

BEST AND FAIREST

There was no disagreement between umpires and Club voters regarding best and fairest players. David Bennett completed a dream season by streeting the field and winning the Club award by 33 votes and gained a mention in 15 of his 19 matches. He was equal eighth in the Mulrooney Medal (a top result in a losing side) and third in the CBS Award. For the Club there was a tight finish for the other placings with John Dess and Jeff Dunne (from only 13 matches) tied for second place two votes ahead of Tony Stubbs.

Greg Gill got the honours in a tight finish in Reserve Grade for some very solid and consistent performances, was second in the J. McNamara Trophy and equal fourth in the T.W. Sherrin Award. One point behind, Gerard Conway (a top performance from a player not usually that far up the list) tied with Peter Wallensky who earned his equal second place from only six matches gaining votes in all of them.

In Under 19 Grade a most impressive performance came from Brett Matthews. He retained the Club trophy he won in 1987 getting votes from 10 of 13 matches and missed a tie by one vote for the T.A. Wharton Trophy where he earned votes in 11 matches including seven first placings. One wonders what was the cost of an indiscretion at the end of last season which earned him a late start to 1988. Clear second was Dave Williamson — a top effort from a player who after gave away centimetres in a key defence position — followed by Ian Donlan, another key defender. In the Juniors James Watson (R) won the Geoff Smith Trophy (U17(2)) whilst Robert Arranz (R) and Ben Aulich (B) were in a three-way tie with Marcus Sheridan of Manuka Weston. The latter is the son of Bryan Sheridan, the Club's successful Reserve Grade coach of 1978, 79 and 81.

GOALKICKERS

As in 1987 the Club possessed no consistent goalkickers and teams needed to rely on good defence for results. Rod Symons was best in First Grade with 24 goals and added a devastating 18 goals in 3 games in Reserve Grade. Brendan Scotland showed some promise with 17 goals in 6 games but, unfortunately, was injured for much of the season.

In Reserve Grade only 'Stan' Trevaskis and Rod Symons scored more than 10 goals. 'Stan' used his goal-sneaking abilities to top the count with 23.

Individual players in Under 19 Grade tended to go from feast to famine with Andrew Tattersall the most consistent with 36 goals. Ten other players reached double figures.

In the season there was one goal worthy of note. Defenders rarely kick goals consistently. This probably accounted for the extra enthusiasm of Peter Jonas when he landed the final goal in a Reserves match against Tuggeranong on 30 July. In a career covering ten years and 125 Reserve Grade games he brought his total to 5 goals 6 behinds. He broke a drought that has lasted since 22 April 1984 when he scored 1 goal 2 behinds in the first quarter of a match against Eastlake.

In the not-to-be-remembered records a much-depleted Reserve Grade side scored an all-time club low in a 0-3 to 26-21 loss to a strong Queanbeyan combination. What should be remembered however are the efforts of 15 players who chose to salvage Club honour and their own respect by playing the match rather than take the easy way out and give a walk-over.

JUNIORS

The results in the Juniors bode well for the immediate future. Three of the four teams in Under 17 Grade Grand Finals came from the area. In Division 1 Belconnen South beat Tuggeranong comfortably whilst in Division 2 Radford College in their win against Belconnen North became premiers and champions.

In Under 15 Grade in the major finals, Belconnen were beaten Grand Finalists after winning against their close rivals West Canberra in the Preliminary Final. Radford College in reaching the Grand Final of the minor finals, although losing, made an outstanding effort to get there by winning against teams who had beaten them throughout the season.

The greatest successes by West Canberra came in the lower Grades where they took out the Division 1 premierships in Under 13s and Under 12s.

OTHER PERFORMANCES

Brett Allison, the first player from the Club to gain a permanent spot in the VFL, had a good second season at North Melbourne. He gained a first grade position at the beginning of the year and held it throughout the season. He attracted media attention, often being named among his team's best players. He earned 7 Brownlow votes and, it is rumoured, came sixth in his Club's Best and Fairest - not bad for a relatively young and inexperienced player.
