President's Report



If winning premierships is what a football club is all about, Belconnen has had its most successful season. Our two senior premierships - the Under 19 and Monaro Grades, are a first for the Club.

In 1992, we were able to field four senior teams, three in the ACTAFL and one in the Monaro competition. The First Grade team, although failing to qualify for the final series, did record many fine performances, including our first wins over Southern District and Weston Creek, plus a memorable four point loss to Queanbeyan.

The Club has been impressed with the performance of new coach Maurice Wingate, not only with the First Grade team, but with the total senior Club. Maurice has been re-appointed as the First Grade coach for the 1993 season. This appointment will allow the Club to promote a more structured pre-season programme and address the inportant issue of recruitment.

Leigh McPhan's Reserve Grade team was eliminated in the first semi-final. The team played well, but failed to reproduce the consistency of 1991. I would like to thank Leigh for his efforts, both on and off the field. Leigh has been an excellent Clubman since joining Belconnen in 1991.

Under 19 premiers - what a great victory. After the disappointment of 1991, I was more than relieved by the performance of a team that really evolved as the season progressed. Brian Read's patience in allowing players to set their own training programmes was commendable, but this is an area that must be addressed in 1993. The Club should promote players to train to the highest level, so that they can develop a more mature approach to football and practise their skills under consistent pressure. Congratulations to all the Under 19 players. The Grand Final was a great exhibition of Under Age football, with every player contributing to a total team effort. The Club owes a great debt to Brian Read. His interest in the development of the junior talent available at Belconnen has been a telling factor in the Club's progress over the past three seasons.

The Monaro team was also successful in winning their Division 2B premiership. Initially, the Club experienced difficulty in recruiting sufficient players to field a Monaro team. It was only through the efforts of Peter Pocock, Neville Hickmott and Paul McCaskill that the team was formed. Peter, in particular, promoted the Monaro social concept and enticed several players out of premature retirement back into active participation. The Grand Final was a great team effort, with Belconnen being far more desperate than their opponents.

I would like to thank on behalf of all Club members those support staff who have assisted our football teams this year. To all trainers, managers, timekeepers, those who assisted with Club catering and the children who manned the scoreboard, I say thank you.

I also recognise the contribution of junior development officers Ian Macaulay and Evan Hourigan to the development of Australian Football and, in particular, the Belconnen Football Club through the schools within the Belconnen zone. A fine effort.

To all members of the Committee, I thank you for your efforts in 1992. The Committee operation is crucial to the future development of the Club. The new Committee must address the allocation of functions and responsibilities, so that we can expand our workload and involve more members in contributing to the Club in 1993.

The Ladies Auxiliary has been a major contributor to the Club this year. They have provided weekly awards, conducted functions, assisted with the catering at home matches and contributed to our budget. We appreciate your efforts this year.

On a personal note, I was approached in November of last year by Rob Goddard, to stand for President of the Belconnen Football Club. After the initial shock, I accepted. It is a decision I have since regretted for three reasons. First, I disqualified myself from my greatest enjoyment in football - coaching. Secondly, my health suffered because of the workload in a hectic pre-season and thirdly, because as President of West Canberra, I have found that it is impossible to serve two masters.


The Belconnen Football Club and the West Canberra Football Club are very different in developing strategies to achieve their goals. This, combined with the negative approach to planning by the ACTAFL, has led me to my decision to stand down from the Executive of the Belconnen Football Club in 1993. I will offer my time as a member of the Committee and I will assist in developing our sponsors.

The affiliation of the two Clubs has continued to develop. On the field, the combined playing resources of our two junior Clubs is being used to develop the Belconnen Magpies into a competitive force in the ACTAFL. If we are to achieve the maximum potential of our juniors, we must recruit three or four experienced senior key position players to assist in their development.

Off the field, the biases between Belconnen and West Canberra have all but been eroded. The opportunity now exists to develop a more co-operative relationship in 1993 and subsequent years.

Our congratulations go to David Bennett, who announced his retirement this year after having served the Club with loyalty and dedication for 18 years, both on and off the field. David amassed a total of 302 games for the Club. A truly great achievement. We hope to see David around the Club for many years to come. In the meantime David, enjoy your well-earned rest from football.

Thankyou to all for your efforts and support - 1992 has been a difficult year. With better planning and more involvement in 1993, Belconnen will continue the improvement shown in 1991-2.

Treasurer's Report



This report relates to the period 1 October 1991 to 30 September 1992. Financially, the 1992 season was another difficult year for the Club. The emphasis was on maintaining a balanced budget, which was achieved.

With the major portion of the financial support pledged by the West Canberra Football Club on affiliation not forthcoming, the Club has found it extremely difficult to progress. It was necessary to adjust the budget by seeking additional fund-raising opportunities and significantly reducing expenditure further than was ideal.

My deepest regret, the product of the expenditure cuts, was the Club's inability to maintain a player incentive payment scheme. I am confident that such a scheme will be in place for the 1993 season.

The decision by the Lotteries Office to grant approval to the Club to recommence conducting car raffles proved to be both critical and timely. Without the funds raised by the car raffle, the Club clearly would not have survived the year.

The Club experienced significant cash flow problems throughout much of the year. Given the extremely tight economic conditions, the Committee was probably too optimistic in setting some income targets.

The income target for the year was \$63300, with the actual figure being \$51600. A breakdown of funding is as follows:

At the present time, like many other Clubs in Canberra, we are finding it difficult to make ends meet. The Club has great spirit and deserves a taste of success, both financially and on the football field. Support your Club and become involved to ensure its future success. The Club's audited accounts will be available at the Annual General Meeting scheduled for 23 November 1992.



First Grade



I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Belconnen Football Club first for giving me the chance to coach and secondly, for making my family feel so welcome.

Unfortunately, my goal of finishing in one of the top two positions on the ladder was not realised. However, providing the Club can retain our present group of players, develop and further extend our junior players and recruit one or two experienced key position players, then that goal is certainly achievable.

The second round loss to Queanbeyan by four points was significant. The Senior side struggled from that point on to consolidate and further extend themselves. The combination of injuries to key experienced players and the interrupted draw made it very difficult to maintain momentum. The Club suffered some serious injuries throughout the year, which stretched the resources of all sides and consequently, the selectors were unable to select an unchanged side all year. Some of the hurdles encountered this year included the challenge of extending and realising the potential of some of our junior and less experienced players and also raising the self esteem of the players. On some of our performances this year, no player should feel intimidated by opposition Clubs. For two-thirds of the year we were more than competitive. The switch of training venues from Aranda to Kippax was a tremendous success. The upgrading of the lights, together with the already great playing surface, has given the Club an excellent facility which is also accessible to the Social Club.

Congratulations to the Under 19 and Monaro teams for winning their respective premiership flags. Well done Brian Read and Peter Pocock. The Under 19's Premiership was a great Club performance. A number of the Under 19 players did not qualify for the Grand Final, because they had played too many Senior or Reserve Grade games. This enabled a number of Under 17 players to come up and get their opportunity.

I am thrilled to have been reappointed Senior Coach for season 1993. In many ways, I see next season as more of a challenge than 1992. I honestly believe that the Club is about to make its mark on ACTAFL with a Premiership. The Club's concentration on Junior development programs has been very successful and is now providing the Club with depth. However, as I have often said to the players, our best weapon on the field is our ability to team and combine together. If the players, the Club and supporters can extend themselves further and capitalise on the foundation that has now been laid, then the Club will achieve the success it deserves.



Juniors



Belconnen:

As in past years and as we can expect to be the case in the future, the Belconnen Junior's emphasis and extensive effort remains to attract players to the sport and to retain their interest in the game. This effort during 1992 resulted in the Club fielding 11 teams (220 players) in the ACTAFJL Competition. Although slightly down on previous years, it was still an excellent result and can be attributed to an intensive effort by the Committee in publicising and conducting the registration activities, a very energetic and talented group of coaches, the efforts of some parents in individual schools, the involvement of senior footballers in team activities, particularly Paul Netting (Under 15's) and Sean Walsh (Under 14's) and the development work in the schools and community by Evan Hourigan. In Evan's case, it is difficult to measure in terms of new participants the results of the large number of skills clinics that he conducts in schools, but the Junior and Senior Clubs agree that the work is worthwhile, as it heightens the awareness of the game and the Clubs in the community.

All our Aussie Footy teams (Under 7's to 12's) performed well during 1992. Improvements in both individual player's skills and the teams co-ordination, were particularly evident. In the older age groups, the Under 13's, 14's and 15's contested the Final series. The Under 15's, coached by Ron Quarmby, were unfortunately plagued by injuries and lost in the Semi-Finals, while the Under 13's, coached by Jim Calvert, and the Under 14's, coached by Ossie Terron, contested the Grand Finals. The Under 14's won well and the Under 13's lost narrowly. The interesting aspect of these results, including the Under 17's, coached by Mike Danaher who performed creditably and the talent permeating down into younger teams, is that if these players' interest in the game can be maintained, Belconnen has a strong base of football talent for several years to come.

The list of people associated with Belconnen Juniors who contributed to its success in 1992, is endless. At the forefront, there can be no doubt, are the coaches. Two special thank you's go to Helen Read and Pat Brazel, who have a long association with junior football and whose sons have now progressed to the senior ranks. Special mention also of the efforts of Ossie Terron and Neil Baker, who were both granted Life Membership of the Belconnen Junior Club at its recent AGM. A warm welcome and thankyou to Digital Equipment for their sponsorship in 1992.

It was pleasing to see a strong commitment to the Club at our AGM. Planning is now underway to achieve a similar outcome for 1993.





The 1989 Annual Report included notes on the sporting lives of Cleve Weatherill, Reg Proctor and Neil Conlan, after whom the Club's perpetual trophies are named. Below is a brief statement of the contribution each made to the Club's development:

First Grade Best and Fairest - Cleve Weatherill Memorial Perpetual Trophy - Cleve was one of the Club's hard workers in its early years, winning the Best Clubman award in 1972. He took over as Reserve Grade coach in the 1974 season and guided them into the Finals series (their first ever), a success he repeated in 1975 and with the Firsts in 1976. He died in early 1977 after a short illness.

Under 19 Grade Best and Fairest - Reg Proctor Perpetual Trophy - Reg was the Club's Football Treasurer from 1972-1977 and was on the Football Committee for that period and also in 1980 and 1981. He was the Club's timekeeper from 1972 until 1991 and has kept the basic historical records during that period from which the annual statistics included in this report are produced. He was Under 19 co-ordinator in 1981-1986 and has maintained a support for this team throughout most of his involvement with the Club. He won the Best Clubman trophy in 1973 (shared) and 1979, the Club's Merit Award in 1980, was appointed a Life Member in 1985 and was awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.




