OBITUARY

The Club records its deepest sympathy at the death of our esteemed trainer Robert "Andy" Anderson, who passed away in July of this year. To Margaret Anderson, we extend our deep regret at the sad loss of Andy.

During the funeral service, David Bennett read the following eulogy on behalf of the Committee and Members of the Belconnen Football Club:

" In 1963 when Robert Anderson was part of the medical staff at the Royal Military College, Duntroon, he was visited by Ken Jones and Jack Sheahan from the Turner Football Club. They quickly succeeded in their objective of recruiting a head trainer for the Club. So began a continuous 31 year association between the Turner Club, its successor the Belconnen Football Club and Robert Anderson, or "Andy" as he was affectionately known in the football world. Andy applied his medical knowledge and skills as a trainer in the service of the Club and its players for 31 winters of up to three games each weekend and regular duty on training nights.

His eminence in his field was recognised with his appointment as Head Trainer for ACT Representative teams. His devoted service was justly recognised with the conferral by the Belconnen Football Club of Life Membership in 1984 and the conferral by the ACT Australian Football League of its Certificate of Merit in 1985. Andy also served as a member of the Monaro League's Disputes Tribunal. At Belconnen, he guided the next generation of trainers.

Of course, as time went by, Andy and his trade-mark wet towel were not always the first to arrive when injury struck on the football field. But when the injury was serious, there was never any more reassuring sight, than Andy jogging out to take control with his calm and assured manner.

In his involvement with the Football Club, Andy did much more than minister to the body. As in other areas of life, his service was special because it came with warm friendship, with the open pleasure he found in life and his friends, with cheerfulness, enthusiasm, loyalty and humility and with loving care and concern for each person. Whether the game had been won or lost, Andy would be in the changeroom afterwards with a pat on the head and a word of support - before removing the strapping tape from arms and legs, which, I might add, even Andy couldn't do in a pain-free manner. If the injury was serious, Andy would be on the phone early the next day to make sure his instructions for treatment were being followed.

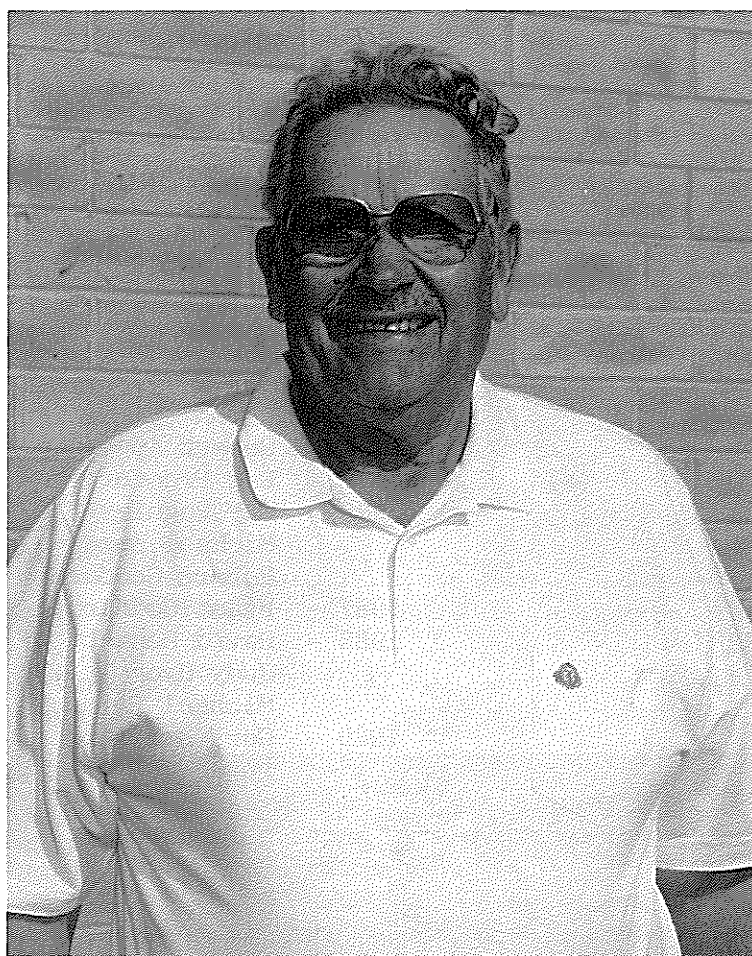
As the players at Belconnen grew older, so Andy's clientele each weekend grew younger. In between performing his official duties as trainer, Andy was called upon to tend to the growing number of players' children - diagnosing an outbreak of chicken pox or measles, removing splinters, patiently dressing assorted cuts and abrasions. All delivered with a hug from the man the kids knew as Andy.

We will each have our special memories. One of mine is to picture Andy in the changeroom before each game, calling to the players throughout the years "Listen to the Coach" and joining in the jogging on the spot in the pre-match warmup. Andy was always involved, always supporting.

Andy remained involved to the end. He was still on duty as a trainer with the Club this year, on a bitterly cold night two weeks ago, he

took his turn at training and his cheerful voice welcomed me across the oval.

We give thanks to God that we were touched by the life of Robert Anderson - a wonderful friend, a kind and gentle man. We give thanks to God for Andy's life of faithful service and extend to his wife Margaret, our loving sympathy and support"

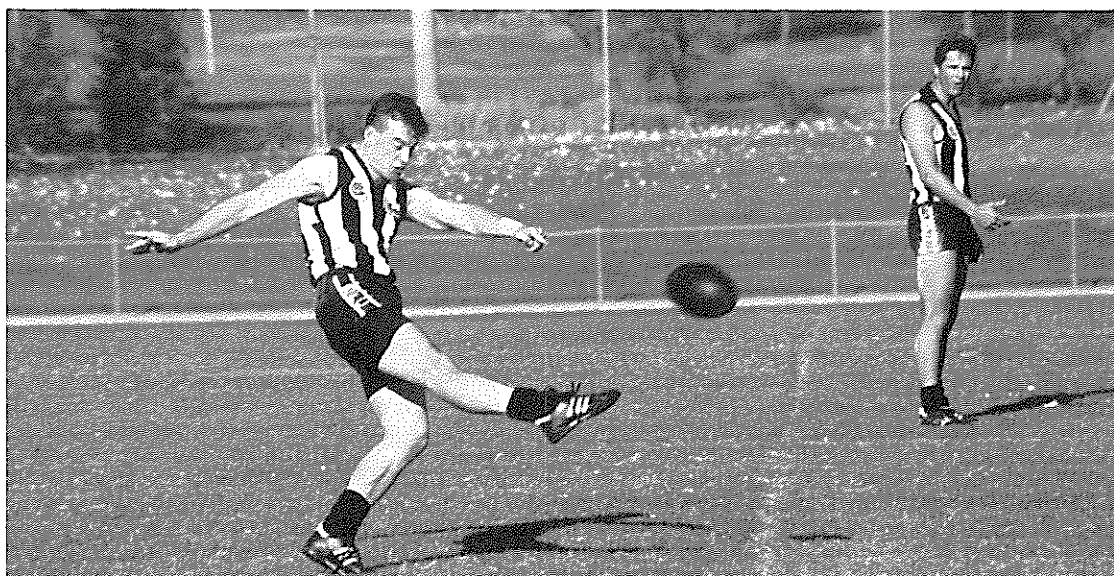

Chairman of Selectors



The members of the 1994 Selection Committee were David Bennett (Chair), Peter Taylor (who also served as a selector for the ACTAFL Representative team), John Harper (Senior Coach) and Marc Housley (Reserve Grade Coach). The two coaches were new to their positions in the Club, as were the other two selectors. The Committee was appointed towards the end of a promising and well-conducted pre-season program run by the Senior Coach, John Harper.

During the early part of the season, the Selection Committee addressed the role it should play within the Club. The Committee considered that it had an important task beyond the mechanical selection of the senior teams from week to week. The Club's history shows a frequent turnover of coaching staff and selectors. Against that background, the Committee sought to affirm an approach within the Club to the management of our players the continuity of which need not depend on the identity of the occupants of particular positions. The essential principles guiding the Committee were:

- . all players should be required to meet the same standards of discipline and team commitment and observance of this requirement should be apparent to others;
- . no player should be typecast according to particular performances in the past but should be judged on form and, where possible, be given a fair opportunity to demonstrate further capacity;
- . each player should, over the course of the season, be aware of the Selection Committee's expectations - in particular, players who move out of the First Grade team should be told why and, along with lower grade players who seek First Grade selection, should be told what areas of their game should be developed;
- . use of the interchange bench should reflect an attitude fostered amongst all players and the Club generally that a team has a resource of 21 players to be used flexibly throughout a game rather than 18 preferred players plus 3 reserves. Similarly, players should be encouraged to accept changing roles and strategies from game to game.

The Committee found it necessary to have in place proper structural arrangements in order to make an honest attempt to adhere to these principles. At least three of the four selectors were present at nearly all training sessions. Communication with players could not be left on an ad hoc basis but had to be systematically planned. The two non-playing selectors designated the after-match evening at the Club as one regular time for discussing matters with different players each week. In future, there will need to be far greater encouragement given to players in all Grades to raise matters with the selectors-it is better for there to be early discussion of concerns and, in view of constraints on the amount of time that it is fair to expect from individual selectors to devote, it is not reasonable for players or others to complain about lack of communication where this is left solely to the initiative of the selectors. By the end of the year, the Committee's increasing familiarity with players also meant that greater diligence was required to avoid unintended typecasting. However, although conscious that the selectors (in a largely amateur Club) did not always have the time to meet players' expectations, the Committee was, by the season's end, reasonably satisfied with its level of compliance with the standards it had set.

In the 1994 season, 45 players were selected for First Grade games. This reflected the Committee's endeavour not to typecast players, either by position or by Grade, and to have as much information as possible to assist selection of the best sides by finals time. Selection decisions from game to game were therefore made with longer term strategies in mind. The Committee also sought to ensure that players brought up from lower grades were given a reasonable opportunity to establish themselves in the team. Inevitably, there were a few players who would nevertheless feel, perhaps justifiably, that the opportunities which they were given fell short of this goal.

A particular concern of the Committee as the season unfolded was the distancing of the Colts players from the senior teams. This was in part a result of the draw for the Colts games which fostered division rather than unity and is an area which the Club must address with the ACTAFL. Another factor was the Club's unfortunate but forced decision not to field a side in the Monaro League in competition with the team fielded by West Canberra. This led to considerable pressure to play open-age rather than Under 19 players in Reserve Grade. The Committee did seek to spread its resources appropriately by designating one selector (David Bennett) to attend the majority of Colts games and another (Peter Taylor) to attend opposition First Grade matches. However, the Committee accepts responsibility for the failure to adequately integrate the Colts players into the senior grades and has made recommendations to the Club Committee which would rectify the problem in 1995. Indeed, the recommendations extend to including the Under 16, 18 and Colts teams in the development of a cohesive Club approach to style of play, team discipline and selection policies.

Another area which the Selection Committee has addressed is the need for a significant improvement in communication and interaction throughout the Club during the off-season. The Committee plans to initiate a number of off-season activities, including meeting with individual players from the three senior teams to review performance in the 1994 season and discuss plans and development needs for 1995, providing a training program to each senior player for the off-season and organising a number of social activities involving the whole Belconnen Football Club community.

The Committee found its responsibilities to be very time-consuming. We were each surprised at how much we had to learn about the role of selectors notwithstanding our considerable collective experience as players but, by season's end, felt comfortable in the role as members of a supportive team. We are confident that greater rewards will eventuate in the years to come from the work of this season's Committee.

The Committee extends its thanks to all those who gave freely of their time to assist it in the fielding from week to week, in particular Graeme Wilson (First Grade runner), Frank Goddard (Registrar), all the trainers (Peg Townley, Kym Austin, Steve Ryder and Andy Anderson), Neville Hickmott and Michael Sek (senior team managers) and Daniel Thomas (videoing of games). Finally, particular thanks to those on whom the greatest burden fell - Colleen, Lesly, Regina, Sonia and our children.

At the beginning of the 1994 season, my goals as senior Coach were to see the Club make the final four. As a result of the players hard work in the early summer months and continued work rate throughout the season, the First and Reserve Grade sides were successful in being part of the Final series. Even though the First Grade side was defeated by Weston Creek in the First Semi-Final, I believe that as a group, we will learn a lot from the experience and become stronger as a Club in the future.

We are a very young Club in terms of senior playing and Finals experience. To have all three Grades participating in the Finals this year will be of great value to the progress of our Club.

As coach, I was extremely pleased with the attitude and commitment of all players throughout the year. I believe the players ability to follow the game plan introduced this year can and will get better and improve with the same commitment and perserverence in season 1995. The nucleus of players that has developed into First Grade this year can only see our Club becoming stronger at the senior level. It is worth noting that six players from last year's Under 19 Premiership side played in this year's Semi-Final against Weston Creek.

This year, I believe the players ball handling improved as a result of my introduction of more balls at training and drills incorporating more decision making, which are similar to match conditions. For our performances to improve on the playing field, we need to develop a higher level of efficiency at the drills carried out at training.

I believe the greatest resource that a football club has is its players. In our Club, we have some very good Junior Grade players, who, with appropriate guidance and coaching, will develop into senior players.

The First Grade side played a total of 45 players during the year. A number of these were virtually in their first full year of senior football - David Bugg, Damien Carmichael, Stephen Mahar, David Mair, Jason Moore, Paul Netting, Brenden Read, Daryl Read, Adam Ryder, Rohan Schlesinger, Matt Walsh and John Williams. All of these young men were valuable contributors throughout the year in the First Grade side.

The performance of Paul Netting this year was excellent. He was a worthy winner of the Club's First Grade Best and Fairest Award. Paul is a fine young man, who works extremely hard at his game. He has definite leadership qualities and is a very good role model for our up and coming junior players to follow.

The Club had a number of players selected to play Representative football for the ACT this year. The players, who are mentioned in the body of this Report, all performed well and were a credit to the Belconnen Football Club.

I would also like to acknowledge the efforts of our training staff - Kym, Steve, Peg and Andy, who play a vital role in the Club's football operation.

I believe that as a Club this year, we have laid a sound foundation on which to build for season 1995. To every player, official, administrator and training staff member, your efforts throughout the

year have been well received by myself and the coaching staff.

The first and most important step towards success is feeling that we can succeed. As long as we remain focused in our efforts, we as a Club will succeed.

Congratulations to our representative players on their selection: Matthew Black - a dual representative, back from injury in 1993 to be selected in the Commonwealth Bank Cup and the Under 16 Schoolboys teams.

Adam Ryder - a good 1993 season, an excellent 1994. Adam was a member of the Commonwealth Bank Cup team and on return from Perth, was selected in the First Grade side.

Neil Davill - the skilful Neil, also made the Commonwealth Bank Cup team.

Matthew O'Brien, Chris Lambert, Jason Kilgower and Brad Hammond were all members of the successful Schoolboys team in Adelaide.

Players who performed with commitment and competitiveness in every game this year were Damien Brazel, Trent Gourgard, Kieren Bennetts and Scott Hammond. Unfortunately, due to injuries, these players were unable to complete a full season. Players who did complete a full season without serious injuries were Robbie Gilbert, Justin Lalor, Shane Deane, Brenden Read, Matt Kimball, Adam Ryder, Ben Danaher and Stephen Monahan. The Club needs more players of this calibre, all of whom performed well this year.

Injuries to players ranged from minor to major and my thanks go to our trainers, Peg and Steve, for their assistance and support to me and to the players, in assisting their recovery - be it medically or mentally. Some players during the season became very versatile, which enabled them to play in different positions, when required. Whilst it is easy to fill a position, a player has to be both mentally and physically

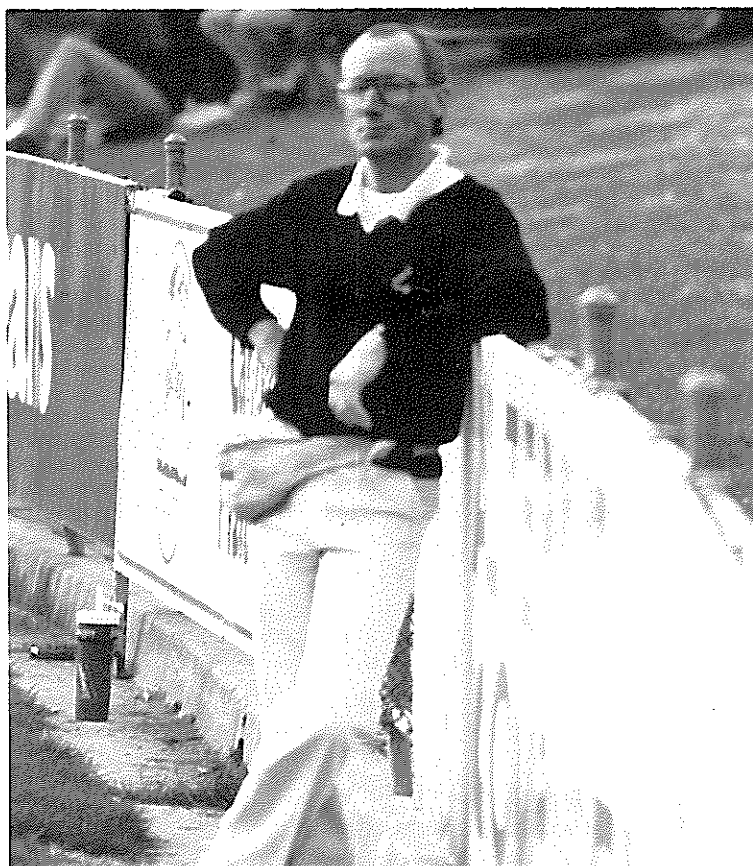

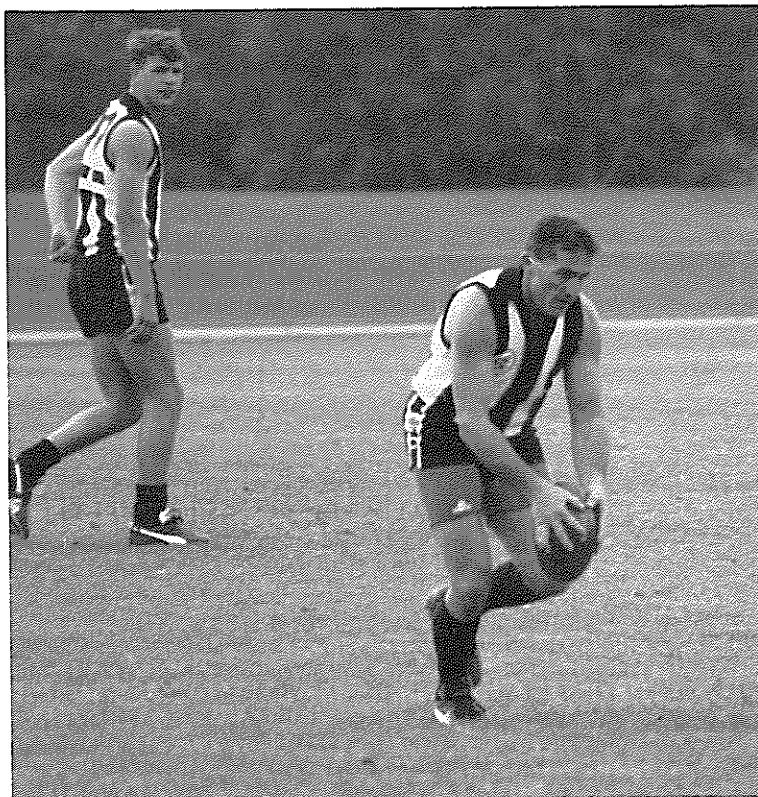

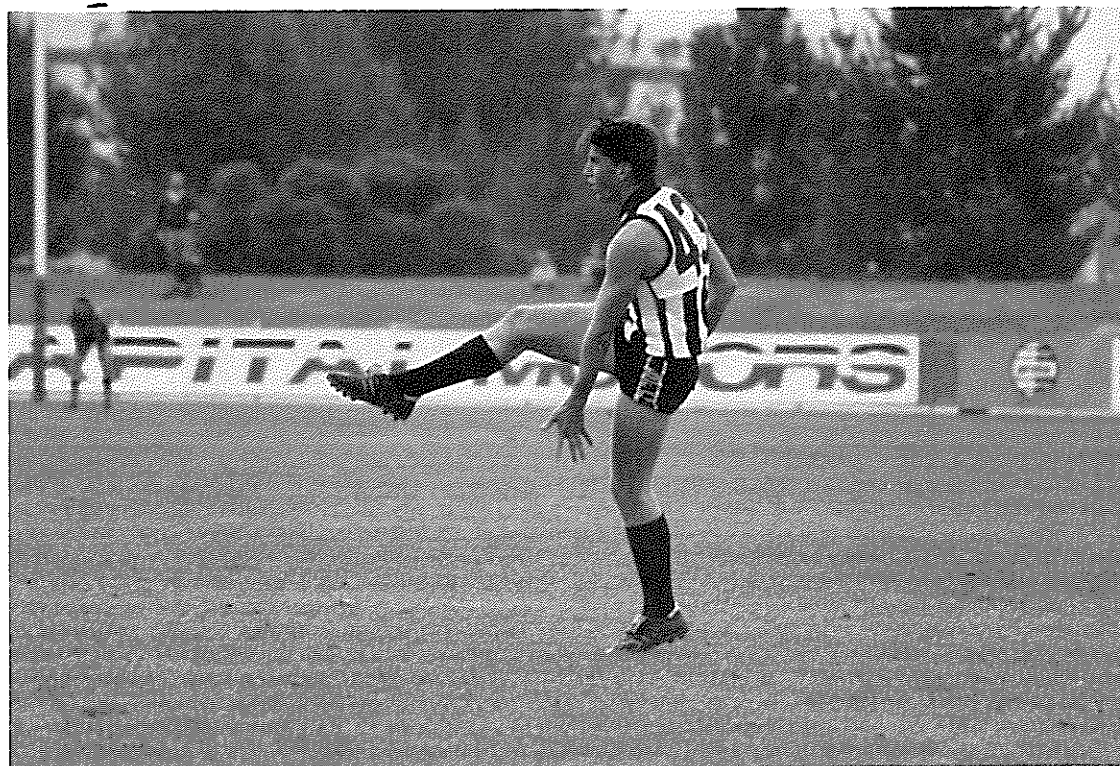

By any standards, Marc's has been a magnificent achievement. Marc has been re-appointed Reserve Grade non-playing coach for season 1995.

Between 1984 and 1986, John played with Essendon, including 63 Reserve Grade games under the tutelage of Kevin Sheedy, Kevin Morris and Robert Shaw. He was voted Most Consistent in 1985 and twice was well-placed in the Reserve Grade Best and Fairest award. During his period at Essendon, John conducted coaching clinics for the then VFL and the Bombers, at selected primary and secondary schools.

John moved to South Australia in 1987 and played 90 First Grade games with West Torrens under Paul Weston and Andy Bennett. Whilst at West Torrens, he was eighth in the Club's Best and Fairest and Runnerup Best Clubman in 1987. He was also fourth in the 1989 Best and Fairest award and was Best Clubman in 1989. After Captaining West Torrens' Reserve Grade team to the Flag in 1990, John transferred to Central Districts in 1992 where he played four First Grade games.

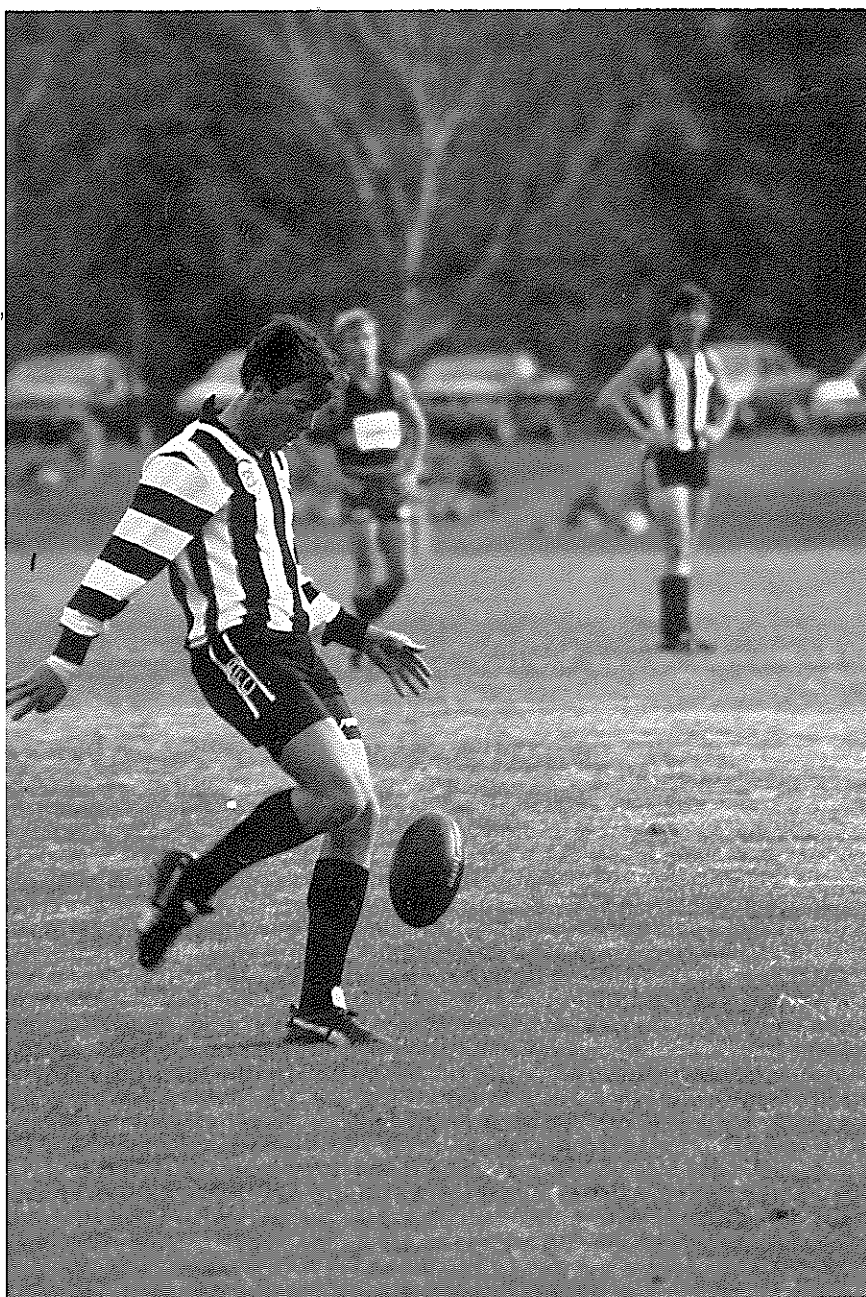

The 1989 Annual Report included notes on the sporting lives of Cleve Weatherill, Reg Proctor and Neil Conlan, after whom the Club's perpetual trophies are named. Below is a brief statement of the contribution each made to the Club's development. In addition, the Club this year has initiated a Memorial Perpetual Trophy to honour Andy Anderson's 31 years of dedicated service to the Club. The Trophy will be called the Robert "Andy" Anderson Memorial Perpetual Trophy and will be awarded to the Most Consistent First Grade player.

First Grade Best and Fairest - Cleve Weatherill Memorial Perpetual Trophy - Cleve was one of the Club's hard workers in its early years, winning the Best Clubman award in 1972. He took over as Reserve Grade coach in the 1974 season and guided them into the Finals series (their first ever), a success he repeated in 1975 and with the Firsts in 1976. He died in early 1977 after a short illness.

Under 19 Grade Best and Fairest - Reg Proctor Perpetual Trophy - Reg was the Club's Football Treasurer from 1972-1977 and was on the Football Committee for that period and also in 1980 and 1981. He was the Club's timekeeper from 1972 until 1991 and has kept the basic historical records during that period from which the annual statistics included in this report are produced. He was Under 19 co-ordinator in 1981-1986 and has maintained a support for this team throughout most of his involvement with the Club. He won the Best Clubman trophy in

1973 (shared) and 1979, the Club's Merit Award in 1980, was appointed a Life Member in 1985 and was awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.

First Grade Most Courageous and Best First Year Player - Neil Conlan Memorial Perpetual Trophies - Neil Conlan coached Belconnen for two months in 1978 before his sudden death, aged 42. He had a long and illustrious career as a coach and player in Tasmania and later with Manuka in the ACTAFL. In 7 years he coached Manuka to 5 premierships. Neil was one of Canberra's outstanding players and coaches.

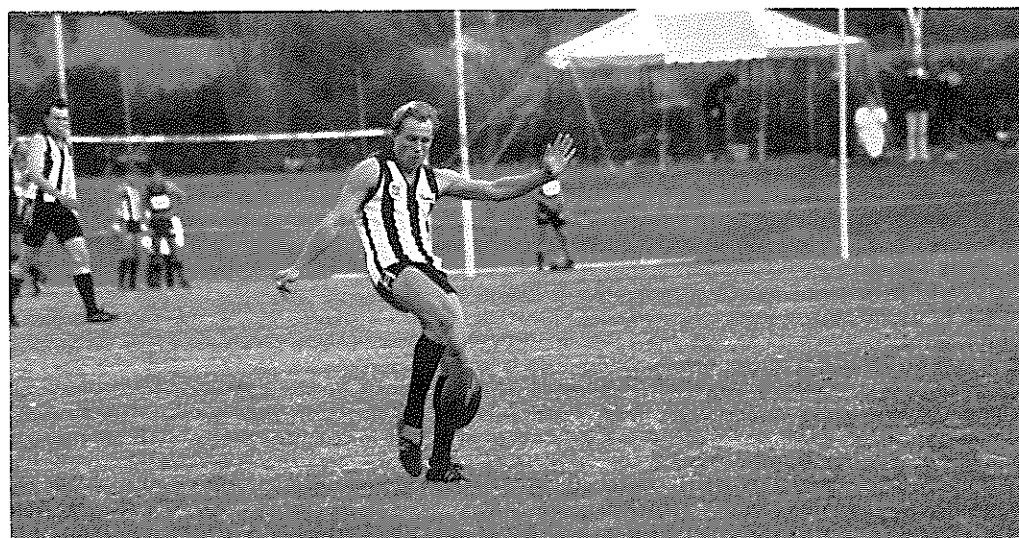

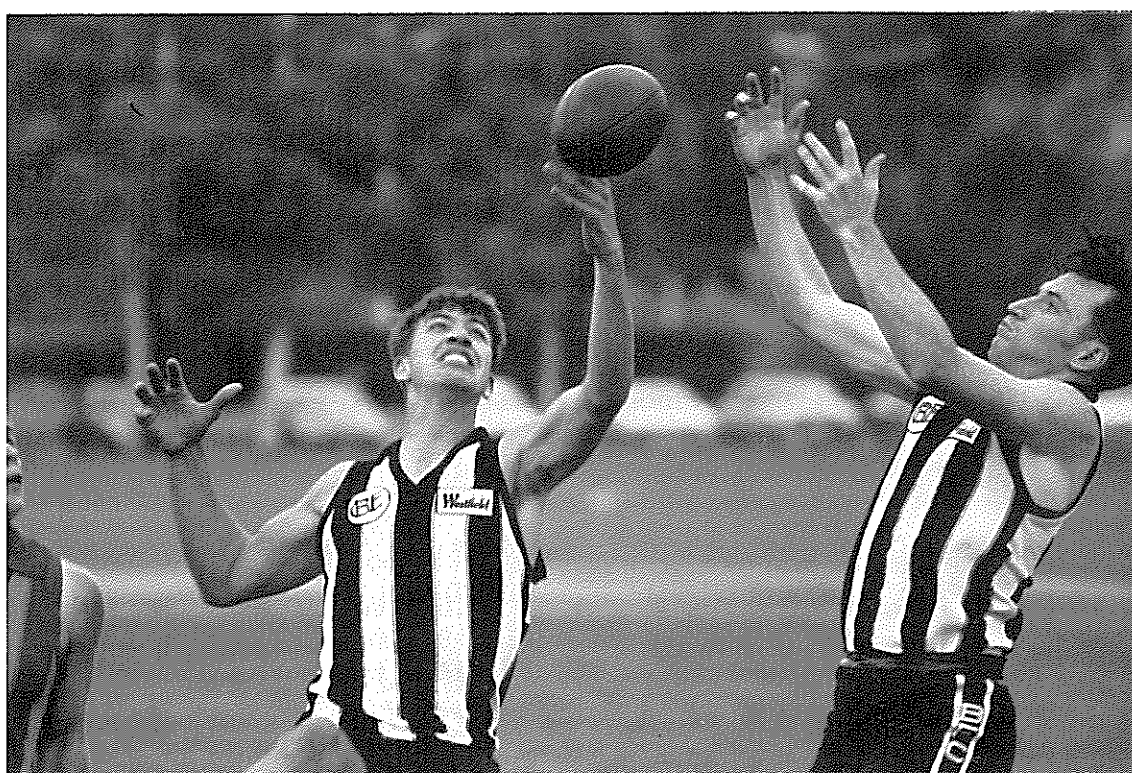
