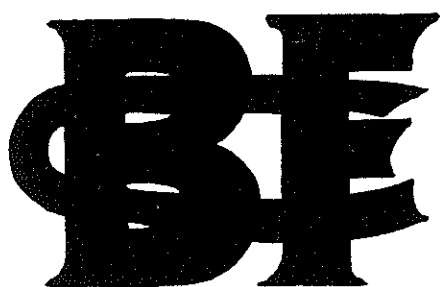

President's Report



With the departure of Julieanne and Neville Hickmott in December 1994 and President, Brian Read in February 1995, a position that was subsequently vacant for a month, the Club was facing a tough start to the 1995 season. Their departure meant that the Club had a lot of gaps to fill.

In March I nominated for and was appointed President of the Club. In this role my aim was to achieve the following goals:

- . to ensure proper affiliation and cohesion between the Football and Social Club.
- . to build a structure within the Club that would allow the work load to be distributed as evenly as possible and to prove to members that to be involved does not mean committing endless voluntary hours.
- . to make a profit throughout the 1994/95 Financial Year.
- . to develop a stronger club spirit.

Having achieved the first three goals and with individual teams having had a good team spirit, the level of the Club spirit, which is indicated by the attendance at functions and fundraising efforts, was poor. The chief indicator for this was reflected in our poor performance in the budget for these events. Without the players and supporters from our four teams willing to contribute to these, our goal of a higher degree of professionalism will be impossible to achieve. I would ask everyone in 1996 before they say no to a function, that they consider being part of the Club by attending functions, assisting in fundraising efforts and becoming a financial member of the Club.

The Committee made some hard decisions in regard to contract players at the beginning of the year, which I feel has been justified. I do not think we will ever be short of talented and skilled footballers, with the successful implementation of the Club's policy regarding its junior players a couple of years ago. The Club now has an enormous amount of youth on the verge of adjusting to First Grade football and we are now in a position where the pressure is on the players to perform.

I would like to thank all those people who have given their time and effort to supporting the Club and to keeping Australian Rules alive in the Belconnen area. To all Committee members - the Belconnen Incentive Group, the Players Support Committee, the Match Committee and the Football Club Committee, a special thanks for all their work, it has been greatly appreciated.

I would particularly like to acknowledge Michael Sek and Judy Netting. Without their dedication the 1995 season would surely not have been as successful. It is only appropriate that they are acknowledged for their efforts by being awarded joint 'Best Clubman' for 1995.

I am indebted to the game of Australian Rules, for the life long friends and life skills that I have taken with me into business and am prepared to put some time in to repay that debt.

A sincere thank you to my family for their support during the season and I sincerely hope that Dad will be keen to drive the bus again in 1996.

Treasurer's Report



1995 was a successful year in the Club's financial development. The Club is now in a stronger financial position to recruit and develop its existing player strength.

There has been clear evidence of this around the Club this year and, as a result, the BFC's improved financial position is one of the many off-field achievements in 1995.

The establishment of the Belconnen Incentive Group (BIG) and the involvement of President, Peter Taylor as Chairman, has ensured that sponsorship of the Club continues to grow - thank you BIG.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

This year, four members were awarded Life Membership of the Belconnen Football Club Inc. for outstanding service to the Club over a long period of time. The awards were presented at our 25th Anniversary Dinner on 29 July.

Tom Allison - Tom was our first and longest serving coach (4 years). He played in 109 games for the Club in the years 1971-1980. He was also the ACTAFL coach in 1973 and 1974 and an ACT Representative player in 1971, 1973-74. Tom was also active off the field, playing a major role in raising funds on the Supporters Group over a six year period. In addition, he was a member of the Committee of the BNFC in 1972-76 and 1978. He was also a member of the BASFC Committee in 1979-81.

Brian Falconer - Brian was instrumental in establishing the BFC. He was President of the fledgling Belconnen Junior Football Club in 1970. His interest in the senior Club was strong and it was a natural progression for him to take on the role of President Football, of the senior Club in 1971, a position he remained in for three years. He then continued on the Football Committee for a further three years before involving himself with the BNFC Committee for many years. Brian was also the Club's Chairman of Selectors for a number of years.

John Molony - John has been a member and supporter of the Club since its inception. His involvement with the Club in official capacities commenced in 1985 when he chaired a committee established by the Club to examine options for the future. For the next five years John was the Chairman of the Club's Football Committee, the longest period for which that office has been held by one person. He was also involved in the amalgamation with West Canberra in 1986-7 and later, with the appointment of Alex Jesaulenko as the Club's senior coach.

Brian Read - Brian also became involved in official capacities with the Club in 1985, serving as President of the licensed club for three years and then as First Grade coach for a further three years. In 1993, Brian had the pleasure of coaching the Under 19 team to a premiership. More recently, Brian has completed another two year term as Club President. During this period he has laid the foundations for a proper and close relationship with the West Canberra Football Club, the benefits of which will become increasingly apparent over the coming years.

BEST CLUBMAN

The 1995 Best Clubman trophy was awarded jointly to Judy Netting and Michael Sek.

Judy has previously been an extremely hard worker on the Ladies Auxiliary and this year, the Players Support Group Committee as Treasurer. She has been responsible, among other things, for the catering at home games, which all will agree, has been first class. Judy this year also became a member of the Club Committee, where her input has been of value to the Club. Judy is a worthy joint recipient of the Best Clubman Award.

Michael is a joint winner of the award in recognition of the amount of time, effort and dedication he has provided to the Club over the past two years. Michael has filled the role of Reserve Grade Team Manager with distinction, as well as 'filling in' on occasions as First Grade and Colts Grade Team Manager. In addition, Michael took on the onerous task of Equipment Officer this year. As the Club Secretary, I have worked closely with him throughout the last two years and am aware of the time and dedication he has put into his various tasks. Michael is a worthy joint winner of the Best Clubman award in 1995.

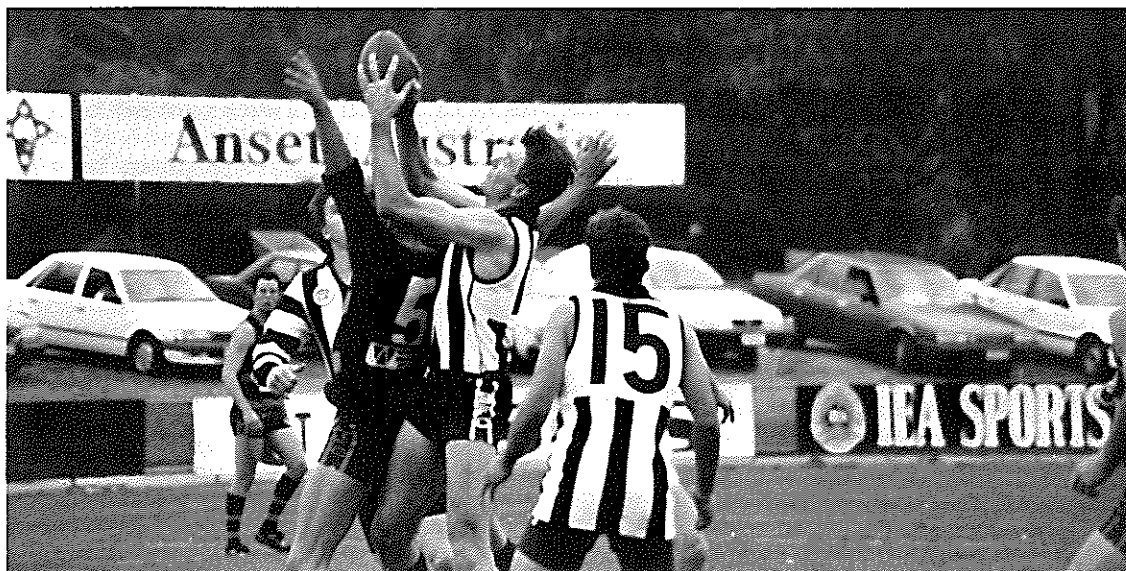

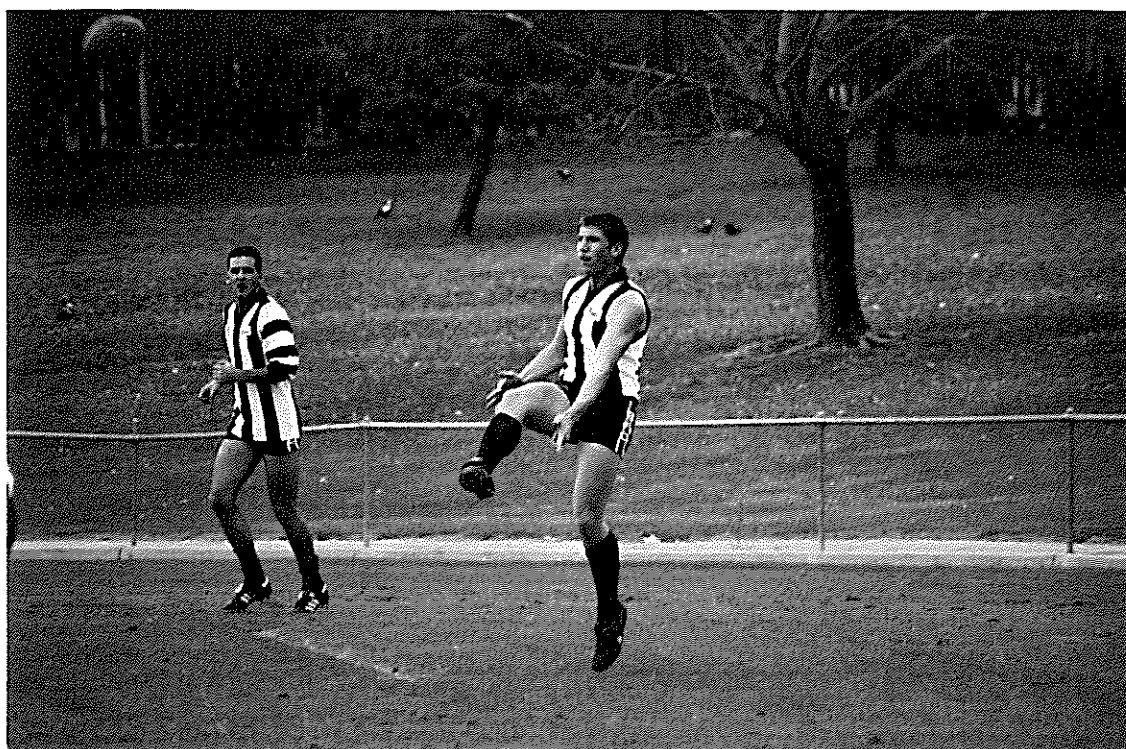

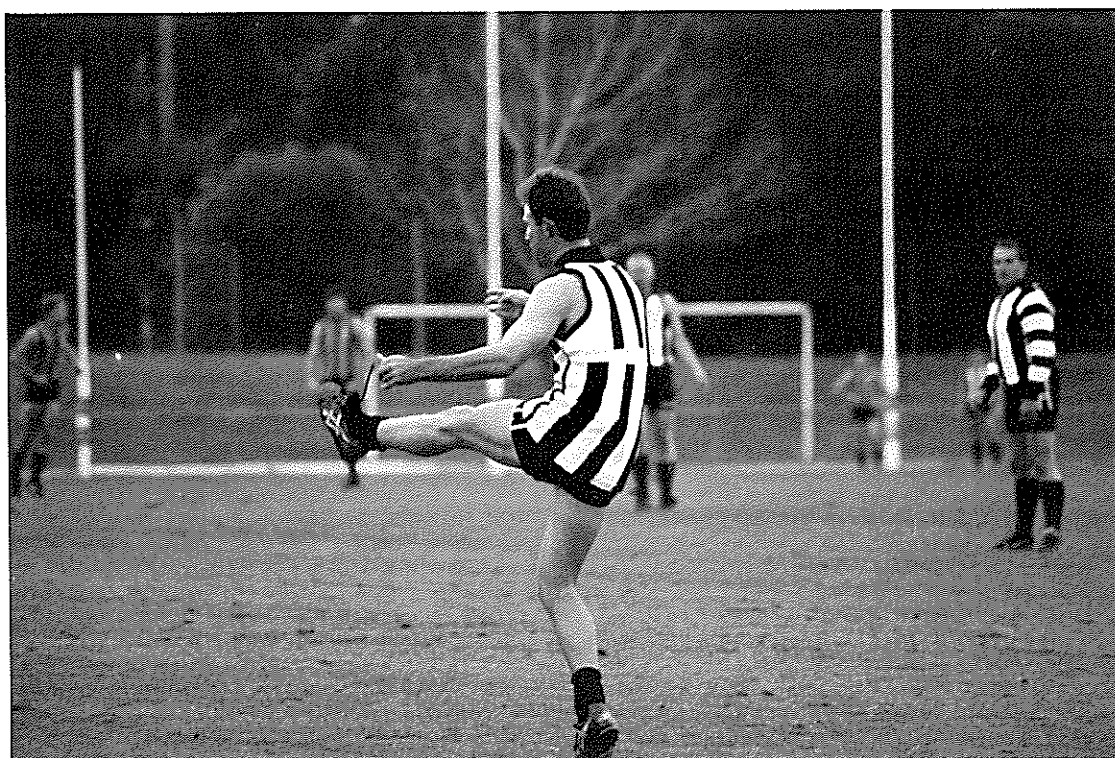

Season 1995 provided us with many experiences and lessons. Although the senior side did not have a great deal of success in terms of winning games, I believe the year was one of building a nucleus of players who will play a major role in the development of the Club's senior grade in the coming years. The team morale and comradeship throughout the season remained relatively high, despite the side not winning games on a regular basis.

At the beginning of the 1995 season, the players of the Club sat down and set a number of short, mid and long term goals for the coming season. As a result of player losses, either to interstate or through major injury, the goals we set became difficult to achieve as the season progressed. Rather than highlight the negative aspects, I believe a lot of positives came out of the 1995 football season for the Club.

The First Grade side played a total of 48 players during the year. The average age of the senior side varied from 20 to 22 years on a number of occasions throughout the season. The average number of games played per senior player was 25 to 30. These three factors alone clearly indicate how unsettled and inexperienced the senior side was throughout the course of the season. The senior development of Brenden Read, Adam Ryder, Matt Kimball, Matt Walsh, Stephen Monohan, Adam Garrett, Adam Bloom and Jason Moore is a pleasing factor in the Club's plans for the future.

Throughout the season a number of Under 19 players were also given the opportunity at senior level - Andrew Smith, Andrew McIntosh, Wes Manning, Nathan Bond, Kieran Bennetts, Craig Lambert and Tim Garrett. Each showed positive signs of becoming senior players in the future.

To have the Reserve and Colts Grades competing in their respective Grand Finals was a bonus. Even though the results did not come our way, the experience the players would have gained will prove invaluable in their football development.

The performance and leadership of Terry O'Kane throughout the season was excellent. Terry was one player who worked very hard in the summer months leading up to the start of the season and it was great to see him rewarded for his efforts by winning the Club Best and Fairest award. Terry was also the Club's sole senior representative player this year and performed with distinction.

The performance of David Mair throughout the season was also excellent. David was Runner-up in the Club Best and Fairest vote count. He also finished third in the Mulrooney Medal voting. Considering David has only played 34 First Grade games and is only 18 years of age, he has a very bright future with the Club. I have no doubt that season 1996 will be even better for him. David and Terry are fine young men who work extremely hard at their game and are excellent role models for the younger players aspiring to play senior football for the Club.

As senior coach, I was pleased with the commitment and attitude displayed by most players. However, I do believe the time has come for us to have a higher level of expectation of each other and of our own personal performances. If we as a Club are to reach a higher standard, these factors need to be addressed.

The Club has a very strong base at the Reserve and Colt Grades level. With this in mind, opportunities were given to a number of new and inexperienced players to play at the senior level. This factor alone made it difficult for the senior side's game plan and style of football to develop to any consistent winning level. As players become more experienced in First Grade games (ie 30 plus games),

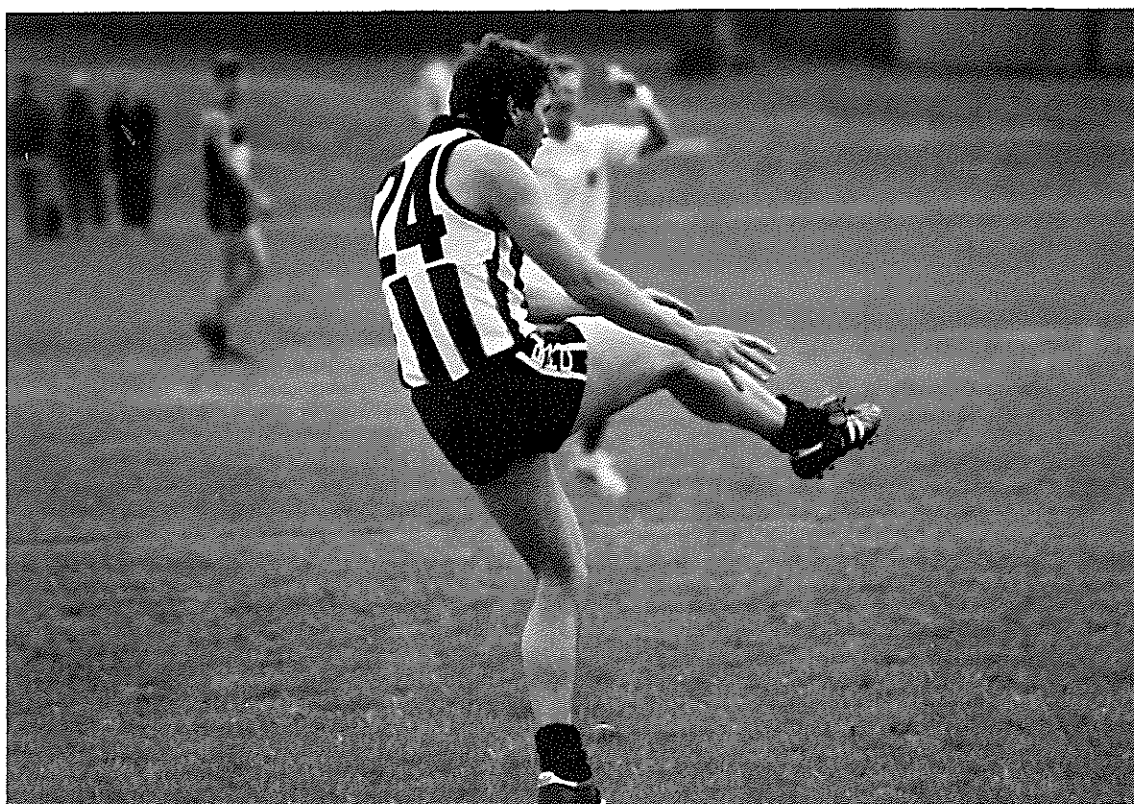
I believe our performances and style of football will develop to a stronger and consistent winning level. I believe we need to recognise the need to work even harder in season 1996 and demand more from ourselves (ie lift our expectations). With this thought in our minds we can look forward to greater success in the future.

The 1995 Season - been and gone. Now is a chance to reflect on the season that was

I believe the infrastructure of the Football Club is a vast improvement on 1994 and being involved with selection and Colts training with the First and Reserve Grade players was a step in the right direction, under the guidance and direction of our senior coaches John and Marc - thank you both.

Our form during the season was good enough for us to finish the Home and Away games in second place, due to good form leading up to the Finals. However, around July we were struggling, not with form, but with player numbers. This situation has to be addressed in 1996.

The Club and aligned Junior Clubs still need to liaise to assist and have an appropriate structure to support and develop junior players in our district to senior ranks for our Club.

The team performance this season was good. We went one better than 1994, but to lose a Grand Final is disappointing - 1996 is another step. As I have always said 'turn stumbling blocks into stepping stones' - 1996 is ours.

The need is to be more consistent, physically stronger and to concentrate for 100% of the time - these requirements are lacking in some players. A development program needs to be put in place now, to enable players to be coached to the senior level. To play at this level and above, players must be committed and be prepared to make sacrifices - this is difficult to do.

The side was again marred by injuries to our Captain Damien Brazel, Jason Kilgower, Keiren Bennetts, Mike O'Brien, Ben Knight and Sam Danaher. Keiren and Mike recovered, but the inclusion of the other players in our lineup makes it a stronger team. The long list of injuries gave the opportunity for other players to play at a higher level eg. Ian Clarkson and Neil Donlan, who both acquitted themselves well.

To the parents and supporters, thanks for your off the field support and a special thankyou to Bev Brazel for washing the jumpers each week - much appreciated.

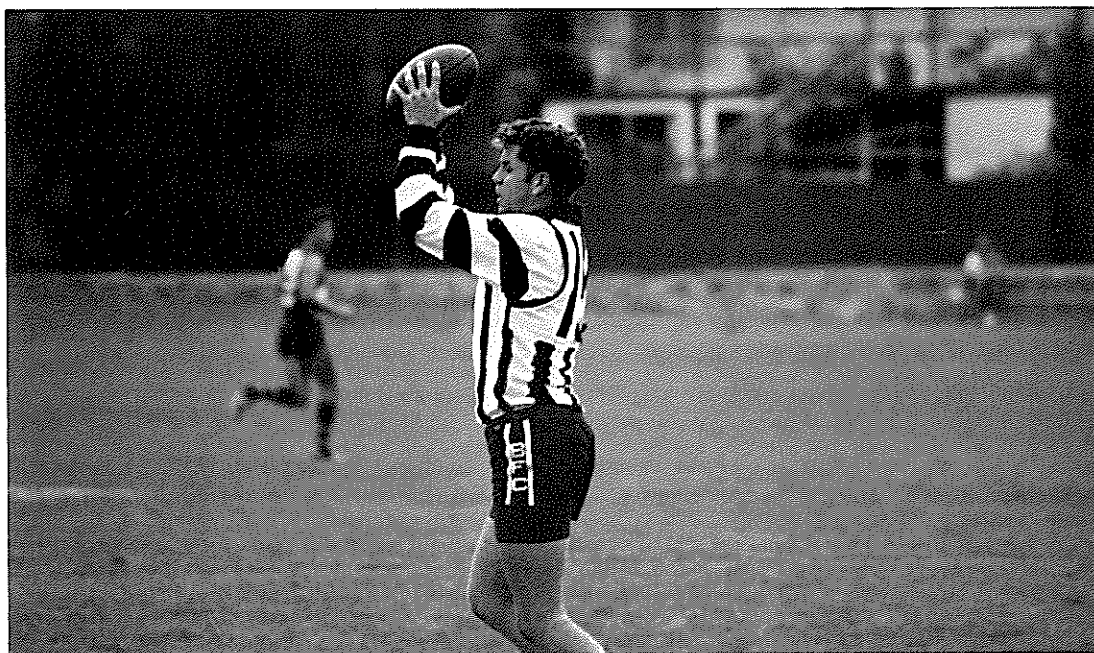

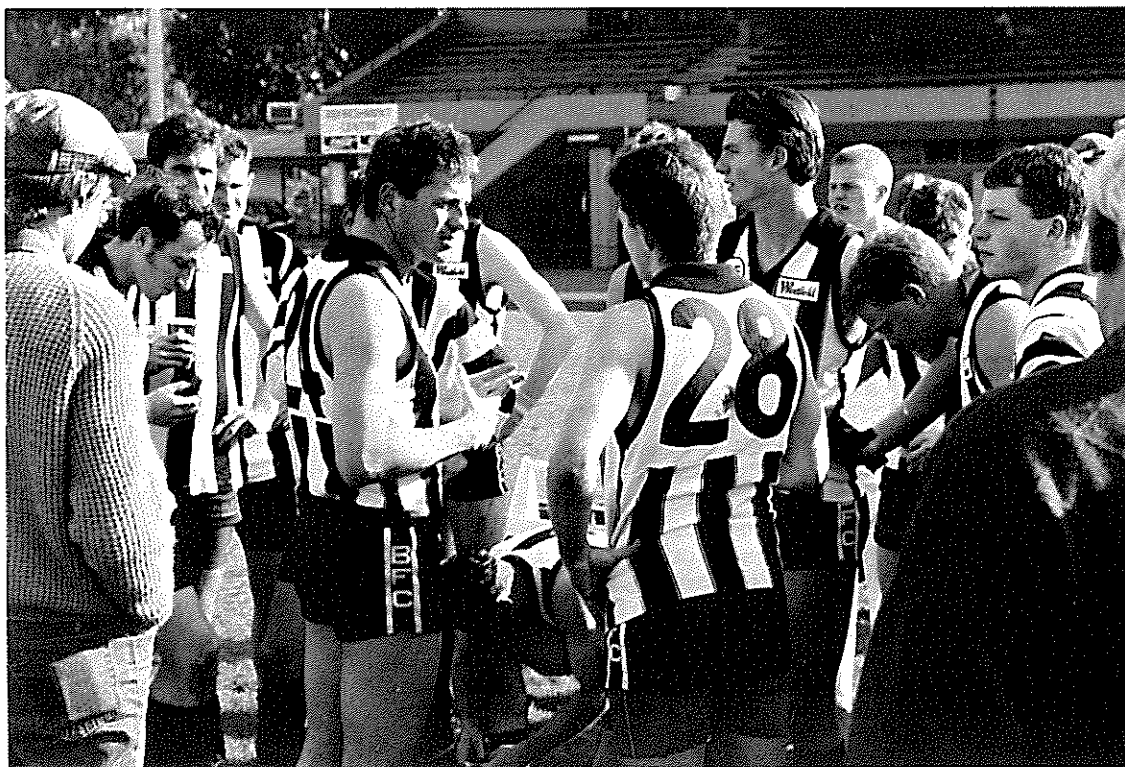
Thanks to Paul Gunn for his trojan like efforts as Team Manager and to Frank Goddard for keeping us on track.

As most will know, Graeme is currently serving in an overseas posting with the Department of Foreign Affairs.

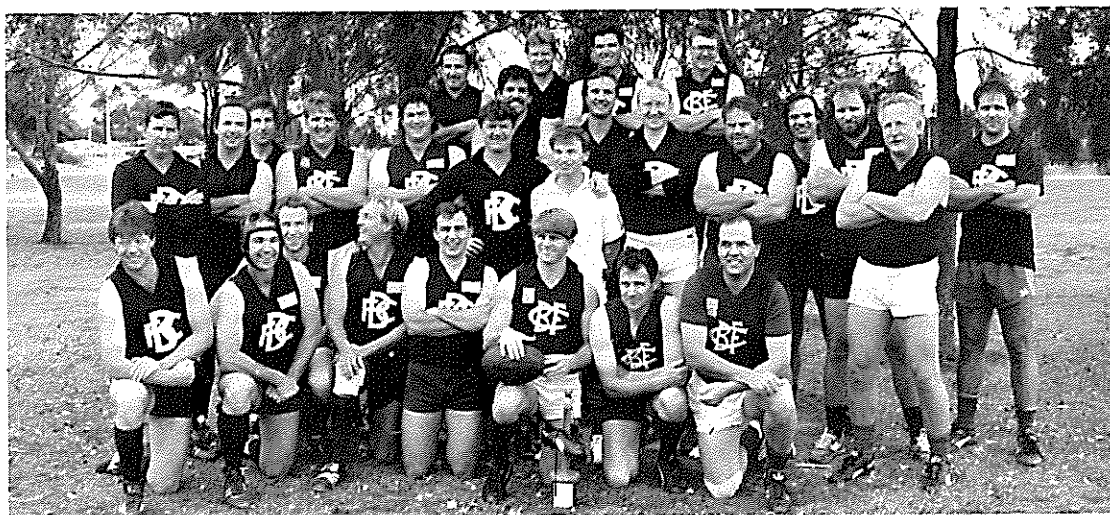
As listed above, ten players reached the 50 Club games milestone in 1995. Congratulations to each of them and best wishes for the next 50.

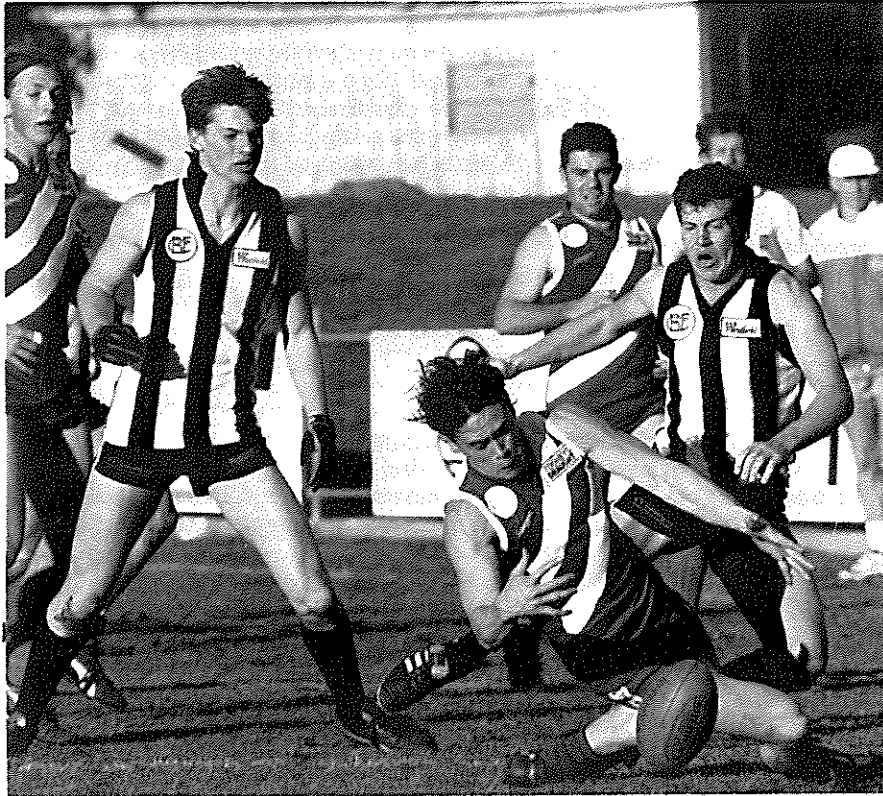

Last year's Annual Report included comments on the lives of Cleve Weatherill, Reg Proctor, Neil Conlan and Robert Anderson, after whom the Club's perpetual trophies are named. Below is a brief statement of the contribution each made to the Club's development.

First Grade Best and Fairest - Cleve Weatherill Memorial Perpetual Trophy -
Cleve was one of the Club's hard workers in its early years, winning the Best Clubman award in 1972. He took over as Reserve Grade coach in the 1974 season and guided them into the Finals series (their first ever), a success he repeated in 1975 and with the Firsts in 1976. He died in early 1977 after a short illness.

Under 19 Grade Best and Fairest - Reg Proctor Perpetual Trophy - Reg was the Club's Football Treasurer from 1972-1977 and was on the Football Committee for that period and also in 1980 and 1981. He was the Club's timekeeper from 1972 until 1991 and has kept the basic historical records during that period from which the annual statistics included in this report are produced. He was Under 19 co-ordinator in 1981-1986 and has maintained a support for this team throughout most of his involvement with the Club. He won the Best Clubman trophy in 1973 (shared) and 1979, the Club's Merit Award in 1980, was appointed a Life Member in 1985 and was awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.

First Grade Most Courageous and Best First Year Player - Neil Conlan Memorial Perpetual Trophies - Neil Conlan coached Belconnen for two months in 1978 before his sudden death, aged 42. He had a long and illustrious career as a coach and player in Tasmania and later with Manuka in the ACTAFL. In 7 years he coached Manuka to 5 premierships. Neil was one of Canberra's outstanding players and coaches.

First Grade Most Consistent Player - Robert "Andy" Anderson Memorial Perpetual Trophy - Andy was the Club's senior trainer for a period of 31 years, until his sudden death in July 1994. For his dedicated service he was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 1984. He was also awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.

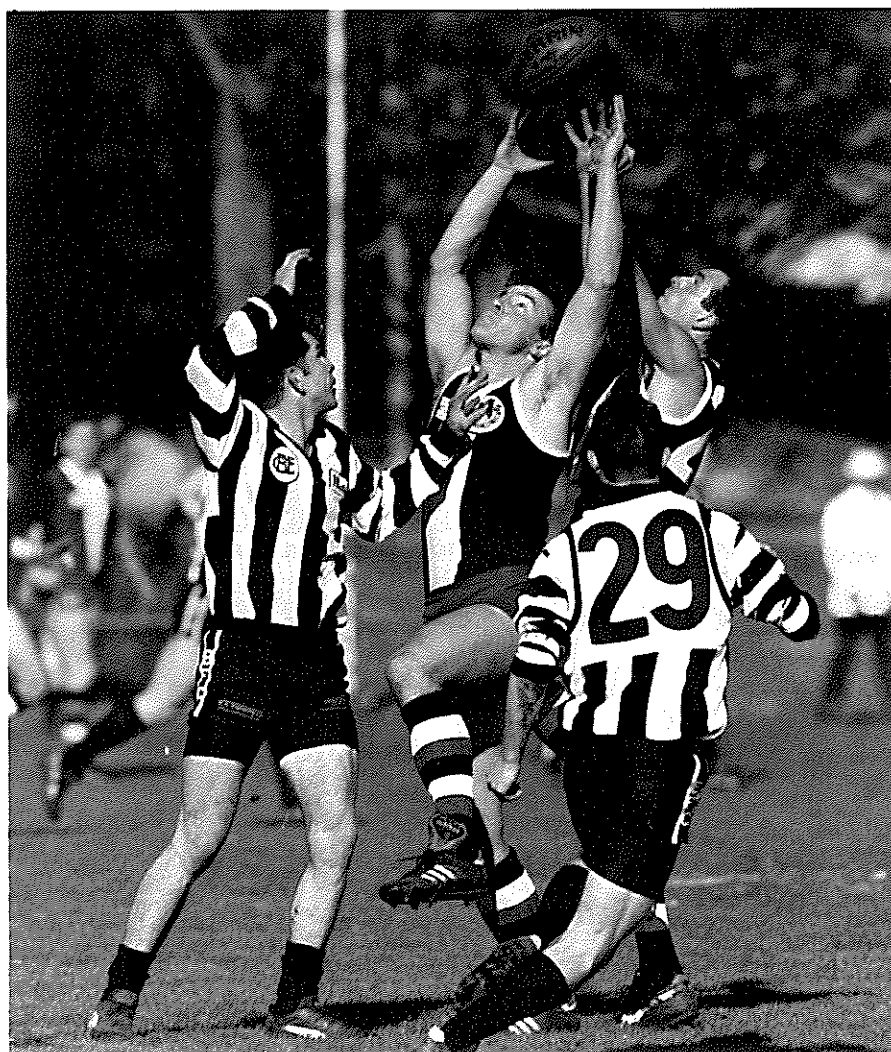
