

The spirit, commitment and character of the senior side was often tested. I strongly believe that all senior players should be congratulated and commended for their efforts.

Our style of play in 1996 progressed steadily from previous years. Our attack on the ball and our opponents, was one area that showed significant improvement. The emphasis on strength development during pre-season assisted us throughout the year. This will improve further in time, now that the Club has a training gym where players can develop this strength component.

The efforts of Stephen Mahar until injured were nothing short of tremendous. Unfortunately for the Club and Stephen, his absence left a major hole in the side which was difficult to fill. Winning the Best and Fairest award at such a young age is certainly a remarkable achievement. Stephen possesses the qualities to become a very good player. What is more important, he is a person of fine character and is an excellent role model for younger players wishing to play senior football. One can only wonder what the year could have been for the Club and Stephen, if he had not been injured.

To have the Reserves and Colts competing in the Finals was once again a pleasing sign. Unfortunately for the Colts the results did not come our way, but the experience these boys would have gained will be invaluable in their football development.

There is no doubt the Club has some very fine players coming into the senior grade from the Reserves and Colts Grades. Tim Garrett, Neil Davill, Jason Kilgower, Neil Donlan, John Stonham and James Terron are just a few who have the potential to become senior players in future years.

As senior coach I was pleased with the level of commitment and attitude displayed by most players. However, as I said in last year's report, we as a club need to have a higher level of expectation of each other and of our own individual performances. The work ethic of players needs to become stronger and more committed in 1997. It is vital that players see season 1996 as one that could have been anything. Unfortunately, I do believe we defeated ourselves in a number of games, rather than the opposition defeating us. A number of opportunities went missing, which we can ill afford to happen in the future. If we are to continue to grow as a club these areas have to be addressed, or if not, changes of attitude need to occur. We cannot except losing and be done with it. Missing out on not playing in a Finals Series for the last two years must make the Club hungrier for success in 1997.

I would like to acknowledge the efforts of our training staff - Peg, Steve, Gary, Kym and my Team Manager Mick Sek. Their efforts are often forgotten, but their role is vital to the success of our Club's football operation.



To all the supporters who came to our games, thank you for your support and encouragement - it meant a great deal to us.


Finally, I would like to thank the players who participated this year. It has been a great team effort and it was a pleasure to coach and play with such a great bunch of blokes.


another school carnival prior to the end of the school year, which will attract as many as 170 children well done.




The 1996 goalkicking honours for the Colts went to Jason Kilgower with 36 goals from 19 games. A good effort Jason.

Last year's Annual Report included comments on the lives of Cleve Weatherill, Reg Proctor, Neil Conlan and Robert Anderson, after whom the Club's perpetual trophies are named. Below is a brief statement of the contribution each made to the Club's development.

<u>First Grade Best and Fairest - Cleve Weatherill Memorial Perpetual Trophy</u> - Cleve was one of the Club's hard workers in its early years, winning the Best Clubman award in 1972. He took over as Reserve Grade coach in the 1974 season and guided them into the Finals series (their first ever), a success he repeated in 1975 and with the Firsts in 1976. He died in early 1977 after a short illness.

<u>Under 19 Grade Best and Fairest - Reg Proctor Perpetual Trophy</u> - Reg was the Club's Football Treasurer from 1972-1977 and was on the Football Committee for that period and also in 1980 and 1981. He was the Club's timekeeper from 1972 until 1991 and has kept the basic historical records during that period from which the annual statistics included in this report are produced. He was Under 19 co-ordinator in 1981-1986 and has maintained a support for this team throughout most of his involvement with the Club. He won the Best Clubman trophy in 1973 (shared) and 1979, the Club's Merit Award in 1980, was appointed a Life Member in 1985 and was awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.

<u>First Grade Most Courageous and Best First Year Player</u> - <u>Neil Conlan Memorial Perpetual Trophies</u> - Neil Conlan coached Belconnen for two months in 1978 before his sudden death, aged 42. He had a long and illustrious career as a coach and player in Tasmania and later with Manuka in the ACTAFL. In 7 years he coached Manuka to 5 premierships. Neil was one of Canberra's outstanding players and coaches.

<u>First Grade Most Consistent Player - Robert "Andy" Anderson Memorial Perpetual Trophy</u> - Andy was the Club's senior trainer for a period of 31 years, until his sudden death in July 1994. For his dedicated service he was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 1984. He was also awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.


