



The renewed enthusiasm and focus after that meeting was great and we then went on to play our best football in the final eight weeks of the season.

As all other ACTAFL clubs strive to become more competitive, season 2000 is going to be a very competitive competition. Players will need to be prepared more than last year both physically and - more importantly - MENTALLY TOUGHER and have a firm belief and a burning desire to achieve our ultimate goal.





Our Super Clinic for our own two junior clubs was a resounding success - with


most Reserve Grade players attending and passing on valuable knowledge to our players of the future.

Belconnen Juniors had nine teams in the ACT Australian Football Junior League this season. This represented an effective increase of two teams. We managed a combined Belconnen/ West Canberra Under 18 team under the banner of Belconnen Magpies. Our player numbers increased, particularly in our younger ages - our Under 8s and Under 9s having over 20 players each and enjoyed terrific seasons. Combined with over 50 participants in AusKick (introductory skills and participation), the year has been very encouraging in terms of recruiting young children to football.

Our Under 18s demonstrated they were competitive with all teams in the competition with some good performances. The season did have its disappointments with variable player numbers and too little support. Both the junior and senior clubs owe much to the perseverance of coach Shane Evans, trainer John Lockie and the leaders in the team - we will reap the rewards for their efforts in coming years.

We had two sides who made the finals. Our Under 15s, under the guidance of Belconnen legend David Bennett finished the home and away season third but won all three finals to win the premiership. A fantastic effort. Our Under 12s proved to be one of two outstanding teams in the competition – they won the second semi-final but went down by a mere 5 points in the Grand Final in a game where the whole team gave 100 per cent.

Belconnen Juniors is very grateful for the support it received this season from the senior club. Through support provided, we were able to offer free registration this season - this undoubtably helped boost our numbers for the season. We have worked together to foster junior development in schools. The effectiveness of this activity needs to be improved, but is nevertheless an important activity. Many senior players have assisted, encouraged and supported our junior teams during the season.

Belconnen Juniors are delighted to be associated with the Belconnen Magpies. We grieved at the disappointment of grand final day - but we know that the professionalism, effort and commitment will surely bring its reward in the near future.

Brett Langham coached the Under 14 side and the players responded well to his coaching. Mick Drage and Dave Fitzgerald took on the Under 15s - which was another side playing well in spurts. As noted by David Gallagher, above, the Under 18 combined side was coached by Shane Evans and was known as the Belconnen Magpies. The team had a tough year, but played some meritorious football. They are to be congratulated as a group for their efforts. The combined side was administered by the Belconnen Junior Football Club this year and we are grateful for their efforts.

The Club, in conjunction with the Belconnen Junior and Senior Clubs, appointed Rick Dolliver as the Junior Development Officer. He has been responsible for running, either by himself or with other suitable senior players, hundreds upon hundreds of clinics at schools and has established a network for future years. As noted in Rick's report, the main focus has been on building the AusKick base and I believe this is the feeder to Club competition.

I would like to thank senior players who assisted at training and with AusKick. The players' presence is good for the junior players to see and gives the players a clue of the senior Club and what they can aspire to.

The West Canberra Junior Football Club congratulates the senior Club for the advancement to two grand finals - regardless of the result. Both the First and Reserve Grade sides have many Belconnen and West Canberra Juniors within them and the continued advancement of these players is crucial for local junior development. Separately, the Magpies Juniors congratulate David Bennett and his Under 15 Belconnen side for winning the flag.

The Magpies Juniors would like to thank the Belconnen Football Club for the financial assistance in covering costs for the Development Officer as well as their pormotion of senior football through the junior ranks. I would also like to thank Magpies - The Sports Club for their direct financial support



As we enter Belconnen's 30<sup>th</sup> year, it is appropriate to acknowledge the outstanding contributions of a number of members which have been an integral part of the story of the Belconnen Football Club. In recognition of their special place in the history of the Club, a Roll of Honour was unveiled on Presentation Night 1999. The Roll of Honour will continue to grow with the Club in its development of, and participation in, Australian Football in the Belconnen community.

It should be noted that the West Canberra Football Club has appointed a Committee with a view to compiling a Roll of Honour to acknowledge contributions made by members of the West Canberra Football Club.

Inaugural members of the Belconnen Football Club Roll of Honour are:

### TOM ALLISON

Tom Allison became the Club's first senior coach in 1971 after playing more than 100 senior games for North Melbourne and Victoria. He was captain-coach from 1971-1974 and then continued as a player, winning two best and fairest awards (1971 and 1976) in 106 games with his classical football skills. Tom took the new Club to its first finals appearance in first grade in 1972. He also coached and played for the ACT. Tom served on the Football Committee in 1972-1976 and 1978-1981 and played a major fundraising role on the Supporters Group. Tom was Best Clubman in 1976 and became a Life Member in 1995.

### ROBERT ANDERSON

Robert 'Andy' Anderson served the Turner and Belconnen Football Clubs as a trainer and head trainer for 31 years from 1963 until his death in 1994. His eminence in the field was recognised with his appointment as head trainer for ACT Representative Teams. Andy was unwavering in his support of the Club and its players, doing much more than ministering to the body with his friendship, enthusiasm and faithful service. Andy was awarded Life Membership in 1984 as one of the Club's greatest supporters and servants. He received the ACT Australian Football League Certificate of Merit in 1985.

### RAY BAGULEY

Ray Baguley was a member of the first senior team in 1971, having played for the predecessor Club, Turner. Over the next 11 years. Bags played 169 games as a full back or back pocket, including 115 in first grade for which he became the first player to reach 100 games. He was a member of the 1978 Reserve Grade premiership side. His off-field service continues with more than 15 vears on the Football Committee and four years as President from 1982-1985. Bags was Best Clubman in 1974 and 1981, became a Life Member in 1985 and received the National Football League Merit Award in 1986.

### DAVID BENNETT

David Bennett retired in 1992 after a record 302 Club games (268 in first grade) as full back and centre half back over 18 seasons. A Belconnen junior, David played his first senior game in 1976 and went on to win three best and fairest awards (including in his final season) and finishing runner-up four times. Curly was first grade captain in 1990 and represented the ACT. His distin-

guished service as a player was achieved while also serving on the Committee from 1982-1995. As President in 1990-1991 he lead the Club in its relocation to the West Canberra premises, which laid a firm foundation for the future. David was Best Clubman in 1984 and 1985 and became a Life Member in 1988.

### FRANK GODDARD

Frank Goddard began his involvement with the Turner juniors in 1967 and over the next 30 years compiled a staggering record of outstanding administrative service to the Club as one of the rocks on which the Club's existence is solidly based. Frank was first grade team manager from 1972-1977 and served on the Committee from 1972-1978 and 1986-1997, mostly as Secretary. Frank's roles over many years have also included Club Registrar, ACTAFL delegate and editor of the Annual Report. He was Best Clubman in 1973, 1977 and 1994 and became a Life Member in 1987. Frank was awarded the National Football League Merit Award in 1994.

### ROBERT GODDARD

Robert Goddard was a Turner junior who played with Belconnen in its first season in 1971 and over the next 15 years played 226 Club games and became the first player to record more than 100 games in each of first and reserve grades. An elegant winger, Rob was captain-coach of the 1982 and 1984-1985 Reserve Grade sides and won the best and fairest award in that grade in 1981 and 1982. Rob joined the Club Committee in 1983, on which he served for a total of eight years including as Vice-President for several years. Rob is the author of the wonderful history of the Club, 'The First 25 Years'. He was awarded Life Membership in 1985.

### MICHAEL PRICE

Michael Price joined Belconnen in 1976 and played 103 games in first grade on the half

forward flank until his retirement at the end of 1981. He was Most Consistent Player in 1977. After his retirement as a player, Michael continued as an outstanding administrator and served on the Club Committee from 1982-1987 and 1991-1997, including nine years in the demanding position of Treasurer. His work as Treasurer, including many years in charge of fundraising, has been instrumental in the survival and growth of the Club. Michael was Best Clubman in 1983 and was awarded Life Membership in 1988.

### GARY SCHMIDT

Gary Schmidt began his association with Belconnen in 1970 as an under 19 player and also played, from time to time, with the Reserve Grade. In the mid-seventies Gary turned his attention to medical and training support. As a member of the training staff since then, he has made an outstanding contribution to the Club and its players, with a record of service now well into its third decade. During that time Gary has made an enormous effort to attend countless training nights and match days for the senior grades and apply his expertise to the benefit of the players. Gary was awarded Life Membership in 1989.

### PETER TAYLOR

A Belconnen junior, Peter Taylor began his first grade career in 1977 and finished in 1991 after 16 years service with 256 Club games. Pup's distinguished playing career, mainly as a rover, included 219 games in first grade, a record five best and fairest awards and three times runner-up. Peter was also a regular ACT representative player. Peter was on the Committee in 1982 and from 1995-1999 has served a record five year term as President, during which the Club has consolidated its position in the ACTAFL and its relationship with the West Canberra premises. Peter was Best Clubman in 1998 and became a Life Member in 1989.


