# President's Report

All of us - admin people, coaching staff and others at the club - have to be prepared to do the networking in this area and not leave it to fall on the shoulders of just two people.

We must take these lessons with us, and our players must realize how single minded you have to be to be the best in the competition. Having the best squad, like we did in 1999, doesn't necessarily get you across the line. A club spirit that is the best in the league has to be there as well. We are maturing as a group and I encourage the players to take ownership of their club to a greater level.

Having said all this, the club is in very good position to go forward. We have as talented a core group of players as anyone in the league. A lot of the work that has been done over the past six years is still there and we are not far from being a real contender.

We can look forward to a vastly improved 2001. There are 6 or so young players coming through that will play 50 plus senior grade games. A very solid balance sheet within the social club allows us to have consistency in our administration that is paramount to being constantly competitive. That part of our business is traveling quite well but we still have to be prudent in this area.

Congratulation to all the award winners on Presentation night. Congratulations in particular to Steve Mahar on his Australian representation and his third B.F.C win. The Read brothers have accomplished a great club achievement in having each played 100 first grade games.

Thank you to all the volunteers that put in enormous amount of work throughout the year to field our teams. You are too numerous to mention individually but I express my thanks from me and on behalf of all the players and supporters.

To Steve, I know it is disappointing when a change is made but there is no right way in which you can deliver that type of decision. You have brought some very good qualities to the club which I hope will remain for a long period. I have nothing but praise for the way you prepared the teams between games.

As this is my last year as president, I would like to express my thanks to everyone involved over the last six years. I thank the club for the honor of presiding over it during this time. A lot of hard decisions have been made and we're on track to being a very successful club. Thanks must go to Mick Danaher, John Kimball, Peter Bradley, Ray Baguley and Jon Burrows for the unwavering support they have shown.

I think it might be appropriate to remind everyone what this committee has achieved over the last six years, as it was really the 'renaissance' of the Belconnen Magpies Football Club.

# Treasurer's Report

In last year's report I commented that our budget will have to increase for Year 2000 to keep abreast of the ever increasing costs in running a football club. For the first time the Club comprised of six sides, with the Under 18's and the Womens team being included in the senior club. This addition of two teams put further pressure on the budget.

I am happy to announce that even with the budget increasing from \$153,000 in 1999 to \$195,000 in 2000, we were able to cope with the increase. This was achieved by generating extra income from sponsorship, car raffles, jolly joker and the Social Club. With a month to go, as I write this report, I am confident the Club will finish the financial year with a modest surplus.

For the 2000/01 financial year changes are being planned in the areas of coaching, players and administration. These proposed changes will increase the budget for next year by 35%. The increases will be largely self funded through additional sponsorship, and with the Social Club providing further support.

The introduction of the GST in July has had an affect on the Club's finances. The government have got their greedy hands on our function and raffle money, specifically auction income from functions, and BBQ, aftermatch, and car raffle takings.

## General Manager's Report

The slide from Grand Finalist to fifth was certainly a dramatic one. It is a poor result and whilst we were down on personnel in the middle stages of the season we have as a Club under achieved. We needed to perform well in the pre-season to build confidence and momentum given that it was such a short season. The results in the first 2 games against Queanbeyan and Tuggeranong where we were out of the match on both occasions at quarter time showed how out of form we were. From then on it was a struggle all the way and rarely did we show the form of 98 and 99.

Fortunately, it appears that we will be able to retain a very high percentage of the 2000 list and with the introduction of some new players in 2001 and the continuing development of some of the youngsters a march back up the ladder is certainly possible. Highlights of the year were:

- Rickie Dolliver's development squad were minor premiers and were unlucky to lose on Grand Final day.
- For the first time in the Clubs history we fielded 6 senior teams.
- Steve Mahar was selected in the Australian Country team following some outstanding performances at the carnival in Wagga. Steve also won the Club's Best and Fairest for the third time.
- Melinda Smith was awarded best player in the women's competition.
- The fantastic achievement of Brendan, Daryl and Wayne Read playing their 100th first grade game in the same year. Thanks Dannielle for the banners.
- Ben Aulich's performance in kicking 44 goals from only 10 games.
- Robert White's selection in the AFL Canberra's "Team of the Century".

Our functions, in particular, The Magpie Long Lunch and The 100 Game Dinner continue to grow in status, popularity and profitability due to the professional manner in which they are organised. Thanks to those committees.

Many issues will confront us during 2001; some that we are aware of and others will come from left field. Some of the major issues are:

• Implementation of the strategies that were

- identified at the joint football and social club forum held in August.
- Make adjustments to our administrative operation now that we have recruited an additional person to assist with football management. Our new Football Assistant Manager is Duane Rek and we warmly welcome Duane and his wife Liz to our Club.
- Prepare to take the maximum advantage from our proposed alliance with Collingwood and take care to preserve the longevity of this relationship.
- Make definitive decisions as to our policy in developing our training and home ground facilities.
- Further build our sponsorship and fundraising base to reduce our reliance on high risk fund raising ventures.
- Protect our interests in the disposal of Football Park.
- Redefine our junior development program and implement methods to measure its effectiveness.
- Prepare for our tour to Ireland in October and teach the Irish how to party.

Peter Taylor will stand down this year as President of the Football Club after being at the helm for a record 7 years. Without Peter's vision and commitment this Club would not be in the very healthy position that it is today. Club stability and indeed success is not measured by the number of games the first grade team wins each year. It is measured by the organisation's ability to consistently compete at a high level, operate and fund a professional football program. Peter has been the driving force in the Belconnen Magpies being able to achieve these abilities.

In closing I would like to thank the many volunteers including the members of all the committees who have assisted in so many ways on so many occasions. They with the players are the lifeblood of the Club. To the two Peters, Pup and Spud thank you for your support and last but not least thanks to Kate for her help and interest in what I was doing.



## Junior Clubs

#### **BELCONNEN CATS**

Belconnen Juniors enjoyed a successful season in 2000.

We fielded teams eight teams in the ACT Australian Football Junior League. younger play Aussie Footy, involving non competitive games with modified rules to encourage skill development and participation. The Under 8s were coached by Reserves captain Darren Hooper, making him the Club's only captain/coach. They had a great season and developed enormously during the season. Under 9s also had a very good year - a highlight were games against the Magpies, which matched two of the stronger teams in the competition. In the Under 10s we had two teams - the first time we had multiple teams in the one age group - lets hope this is a sign of the future. We also run a successful AusKick program at Giralana during the season, which should lead to healthy recruitment in coming seasons.

In the competitive age groups (Under 12s to Under 16s), the Club had its most successful seasons for some time with all four of our teams making the finals, which was the equal highest representation in the finals of any Club. Our Under 12s started with four big defeats, and then beat every team but the ultimate premiers to make the finals and finish fourth. The Under 13s, beaten grand finalists in 1999, went one better in 2000. After an early season loss they dominated the competition and won the grand final by five goals. Under coach Phil Chisholm they play a brand of footy which would be the envy of many sides of any age. Under 15s has a large squad and finished a very credible third. Our Under 16s were very competitive, beating all but the premiers before finishing fourth. Look out for players from this team as they progress to senior ranks.

A special mention to Michael Stakelum who won the League best and fairest in the Under 13 competition - another one to look out for in the future.

The Club is very appreciative of the substantial support received from the Senior Club. 


