Development Squad Report

I can't believe that this is the third time I have had to put pen to paper to write this report. The three years have passed so quickly. It certainly helps that the club has been so successful both on and off the field during this time.

Congratulations to Darren Denneman and the First Grade team for winning the 2004 premiership. Clubs are measured by the success of their First Grade team and you can't do much better than win your third consecutive First Grade premiership. Success like this does not just happen. Much of the credit can be attributed to Darren for the way he prepares the senior squad from the pre-season sessions through to that final game in September. Being part of the coaching squad I have had the privilege of sitting in on many of his mid week and pre-match addresses. He leaves nothing to chance and I can understand why the players would run through brick walls for him. He is the consummate professional. His knowledge and understanding of the game always, always keeps the playing group on their toes.

Before I comment on this year's Development Squad performance I want to reflect a little on the players who progressed to First Grade football this year from the Development Squad last year. From the Development Squad premiership team in 2003, Daryl Read played every game in the First Grade in 2004, Lexie Bennett, Michael Ghobrial and Brock Weston played 19 (and would have played 20 but for injury) and Martin Rice was one of the revelations for the year playing 18 games as first ruck for the premiership team. These guys should be an inspiration to others who wish to play at the highest level.

One look at the Development Squad team that run on to field this year and it was noticeable the change in personnel from last season. I have already mentioned the five guys that

moved up to First Grade, but this was pretty minor to the other movements that occurred. Jason Moore, Chris McDevitt, Scott Smith, Robert Hanily and Andrew McIntosh all decided to play the season in Third Grade, Dougy Read, Luke Jeffrey, Chris Calvert, Phil Younger, Justin Direen and Mick Tilley moved out of town, Tony Mahar retired to coach the Under 18s, Jon Alexander decided to take the year off and Kyle Archibald was drafted to Richmond. All up 19 from last year's squad were not available to play in 2004, including all seven end-of-season trophy winners.

This, although a challenge, was good for the development of players within the club. It allowed eleven under 18 players to play senior football in the Development Squad at some stage throughout the season. They were: Jon DeAngelis, Joey Dunstan, Karl Fennis, Daniel Posch, Anthony Whittard, Brendan Fischer, Rohan Singleton, Andre Borgeaud, Tom Doig, Michael Stakelum and Scott McKinnon. All these players contributed and showed they can be regular senior footballers.

This year also saw the return of John Williams to the Development Squad from his stint as Third Grade coach. Rowdy very capably captained the side, filling the large shoes vacated by Tony Mahar's retirement, and showed his class and experience being a consistent performer throughout the season. Like all good players he shone through in the finals matches to be our best player in the finals.

The on-field performances of the team were a little inconsistent, both from week-to-week and from quarter-to-quarter. This saw us really test Ainslie, the eventual premiership team, on two occasions, but really struggle against others at times. This could be attributed, in part, to the relatively young age and inexperience of the team, which should improve significantly in 2005 as a result of the experiences gained this year.

Congratulations to Ryan McClintock on winning the Development Squad best and fairest award. Ryan overcame a number of significant setbacks through the year to be our stand out player. I'm sure the experience of this year will set him up for a real crack at First Grade football next year. Jeremy Brodie-Reed returned to football after time away from the game and showed he definitely has the class to play at a higher level. His efforts saw him play five First Grade games and win the Development Squad runner up best and fairest.

The off the field support has again been outstanding. Peg Townley keeps husband Mal, Schmidty, Dave Kennard and the girls in line and the exceptional work they do ensures we have all our players fit and on the field as often as possible. Trevor Davison, Jim and Robyn Donlan do an amazing job as Team Managers ensuring every equipment or supply item is available and the paper work is in order. It was good to welcome back Gunny (Paul Gunn) to his familiar timekeeping and recordkeeping role this year. His work makes it so much simpler on game days and his regularly phone calls throughout the week keep me up to date.

FRANK GODDARD – A TRIBUTE TO A GREAT CLUBMAN

Frank Goddard (1928-2004) moved to the ACT in 1963 with his wife Joyce and children Rob, Janet and Ross. He began his involvement in ACT football with Turner Juniors in 1967, continued through the evolution of Turner into the Belconnen Football Club in 1971 and maintained his involvement in football administration until he died.

Listing Frank's record of football service gives an important but incomplete account of his contribution. He took on the 'behind the scenes' roles essential to the running of a football club and filled most of them for many years – Club Secretary, Registrar, Team Manager, League delegate, annual report editor and statistician, timekeeper, scoreboard attendant and many other tasks large and small for which no-one else volunteered. He was honoured with Best Clubman awards in 1973, 1977 and 1994, a National Football League Merit Award in 1994, Centenary Medal in 2001 and Life Memberships of Belconnen in 1987 and the ACTAFL in 2004. Most recently, Frank served for the last several years as a member of the League Permit and Match Committee where his thoroughness and meticulous application of rules would have been quite at home.

Belconnen's heritage is founded on the work of the pioneers, such as Frank, in establishing and building the club, through times when even bare survival was a mighty struggle. More than that, the enduring values of our club which must be at the core of any activity of worth find their source in people like Frank. Those values would have seemed ordinary to Frank as to him they were unquestioned - integrity, commitment, loyalty, care for others, generous with his time, doing the hard work without complaint and, yes, doing it all by the rules.

One was never left in doubt about Frank's views. He was forthright when matters of principle were at stake and a stickler for rules - exasperating at times but it saved the club often. Frank and Joyce were also strong match day supporters of our players. No-one has watched more Belconnen games. Frank was immensely proud of the recent premiership successes. But in the end he loved football and the people with whom he shared

good times and times of struggle, in friendships that endured. In his 25 year history of the Club, Rob Goddard tells one story about Frank with affection:

Frank also took on the job of organising trophies for the annual Presentation Night – always a big night on the Club calendar. For Frank the 1974 Presentation Night is one he may choose to forget. Frank was, and still is, one for doing a job thoroughly and his efforts in purchasing the trophies for 1974 were no exception. He carefully placed the large cardboard box with the trophies behind the car in his driveway before going back into the house to hurry the rest of the family along so they could get to the function on time. The Goddard family rushed to the car, Frank threw it into reverse and proceeded to back over the box. There was a deathly hush in the car as the realisation of what had happened dawned. It was a disaster at the time but it did make for a memorable Presentation Night. The vision of Bags going up to receive his trophy not with right hand extended for the handshake but hands cupped to receive his trophy in bits is something that will remain in the minds of many.

We also saw Frank's great love for his family - for Joyce, his friend and companion throughout, and his pride in his children and their partners and his grandchildren. He was a firm supporter of them in all they did.

Even for those who have been part of Belconnen since its formation in 1971, Frank Goddard was always there as one of the guiding lights of our football experience. Sir Isaac Newton wrote "If I have seen further it is by standing on the shoulders of giants". Frank would strongly demur at any comparison because he never sought attention or praise. But so too, we pay homage to our heritage and recognise that our Club also stands on the shoulders of people such as Frank Goddard.
