PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Dear Members.

The 2008 season has now passed. This year, the Board decided to take a slightly different approach to the timing of Presentation Night and hold it closer to the end of

the football season. We had hoped that it would be the culmination of a week of celebrations for the whole club.

Unfortunately that was not to be, and there was a real hollow feeling after the end of the senior game on grand final weekend. I felt for the victorious Reserves Team who must have experienced a range of mixed emotions being Premiers—but realising the senior side had just missed their opportunity.

Achievements

2008 was another eventful year for the club:

The Junior Strategic Steering Committee, chaired by Peter Bradley, with representatives from the two junior clubs and the football club board, has swung into full gear. The bringing together of the Under 16s under the BMFC banner was an immediate successful outcome from this Committee.

Melanie Brothers, our Junior Operations Coordinator, has made huge inroads into the schools in the Belconnen area and the numbers in Auskick this year were extremely encouraging.

We have progressed the long term project of the Kippax Facilities Development to the funding stage. I am very pleased to acknowledge the work put in by our patron, the Honourable Bob McMullan MP, the Parliamentary Secretary for International Development Assistance, and Dave Peebles, who was the Labor candidate for Ginninderra at the recent ACT election. At the Presentation Night I announced that the ACT Government had committed \$2m to the project. In conjunction with the AFL, who have committed \$100k (and we hope much more to come), the project now really has wings. We are now waiting for the establishment of the new government to ensure this commitment is forthcoming.

On the field we had every side make finals football, which is a wonderful achievement. This led to us being awarded the Champion Club trophy on

Mulrooney Medal night. From the number of teams that made grand finals, we come away with premierships in the Reserves and the Women's Division 2. Congratulations to those two teams. We were not able to pull off the senior premiership, finding ourselves behind for the first time in the game after the siren. We will go one better next year.

Our junior clubs remain strong, and as mentioned, the combined Under 16 teams worked well. The Under 16 Division 1 and 2 sides contested grand finals at Manuka, and whilst they were not successful on the day, their performances throughout the year showed we have good talent coming through—and overall the club's playing stocks are in a pretty strong position.

In 2008 we also had two significant player milestones. John 'Rowdy' Williams broke Dave Bennett's long standing club games record of 302 games and Brendan Read also passed the 300 club game milestone.

Management and Leadership

Thank you to the whole coaching staff—Steve, Brett Knowles, Dave Bennett, Jason Kidney, Garry Davidson, Brendan Read, Marty Smith, John Harper, Bernie Williams, Kris Collins, Jeremy Foster and Ossie Terron.

At Presentation Night I announced that Steve Mahar had accepted the club coaching role again for 2009. Subsequently, Steve advised me that he did not think he was the right person to take the club forward in the direction the Board wanted to head next year. I thank Steve for his considerable commitment as senior coach for the last three years and his honesty and integrity in what must have been a very difficult decision for him. As a mark of Steve as a bloke, he has committed to getting his body right for 2009 to be a key player for the club, without the added stress of coaching. His leadership around the club will certainly continue to be utilised.

I am pleased and excited to advise that Brendan Read has been appointed as the club coach for 2009. Brendan has already taken the reins and has the squad on the track in preparation for an even stronger showing in 2009.

Finances

Our finances, whilst always a juggling act, are in pretty good shape and we incurred just a small loss

for the 2008 year. This strong financial position is predominantly due to the substantial input from the Magpies Sports Club and our valued sponsors. I thank these people for their continued support.

I must acknowledge the significant support of Bob Garrett and the Sports Club Board. Without this fantastic support the football club just could not operate.

Volunteers

I would like to say a big thank you to our group of volunteers—our trainers led by Peg Townley, team managers, runners, statisticians, video operators, timekeepers, water carriers, and all others who have helped out during the year. Without the dedicated and hard working volunteers the club could not function.

It is with some sadness that I advise you that Peg and Malcolm Townley have decided that 2008 was their last year in their respective roles. I thank them for their significant contribution over many, many years. Peg and Malcolm were appropriately recognised for their contributions at Presentation Night.

I would also like to single out the Club Person of the Year. This year, Peter Dunn was awarded this significant club honour. Peter is quiet and unassuming and you have to work pretty hard to get him to say too much. However, he is there every single week doing all those things behind the scenes that players and others take for granted. He doesn't expect any recognition in return—he just quietly goes about his job. Congratulations Peter on being the Club Person of the Year....it is well deserved recognition of your efforts.

The volunteer base of the club is diminishing. The number of volunteers required to keep the football club running throughout the week and on game days is significant. We need to address this immediately and it has been a topic of discussion at the Board level for some time. If there are people out there that would be willing to invest some time into the football club as a volunteer we would be very, very pleased to hear from you. There are a multitude of roles that may suit your time availability and interests.

Thank you to the Football Club Board, Vice President Scott Reid, Treasurer Ray Baguley, Secretary Dannielle Baguley, Daryl Read, Justin Lalor, Stacey Jennings, Jo Foster, Sean Egan, Norm Simms, Stuart Dunn and Trevor Davison. In particular I would like to thank Ray Baguley, Stacey Jennings and Justin Lalor who have worked tirelessly on the Board and have decided to stand down at the end of this year. Ray has been on the Board for a significant period of time and his contribution has been enormous across the whole range of club activities, including more recently as Treasurer. I would like to acknowledge Jugga, in particular for his work in the communications role, including the Annual Report and Stacey, who with Jo Foster, was the driving force behind our functions.

Thank you to our paid staff in General Manager Garry Davidson, who we rely on for so much, Melanie Brothers who has really got the junior operations humming and Cathey Kelly, for ensuring all the behind the scenes work is completed without fuss. They work so hard for the football club and don't always get the acknowledgement they should. I would like to publicly announce that Garry has signed an extension to his contract that will see him with the club until the end of October 2011.

To all the supporters—thanks for turning out to support our fantastic club in rain, hail or shine. We need to see you again next year.

Congratulations to all the award winners and I will see you at the footy in 2009.

TREASURER'S REPORT



I wish to report to Members that the Club has made a profit of \$2,961 for the 2008 financial year.

Income for the year has increased from \$531,770 to \$619,017—of which nearly \$440,000 is made available

by the Belconnen Magpies Sports Club grant. It would be impossible to fund football in the Belconnen district to the level that we do without the Sports Club grant. The Sports Club also assists in many other ways and I thank Bob Garrett, Jon Burrows and other Board members for their generous support.

The other \$170,000, a significant amount, is largely derived from sponsors, functions, raffles and registration fees. I'm pleased to report that income from functions has increased by \$14,686 and sponsorship by \$12,944.

To reiterate my comments last year, the input from our sponsors is vital to our ongoing success. Not only do they provide much needed cash but they also provide employment for recruits, sometimes at very short notice, and most of them enthusiastically support our functions. I would suggest that we should have more interaction with our sponsors and provide more networking opportunities for them.

Expenditure has increased from \$542,970 to \$616,056—mainly in the areas of administration, player payments and coaching. The expenditure side of the profit and loss account has some new expenditure items such as telephone, superannuation and uniforms. This has been done to help the Board better manage our accounts and to provide our members with a little more information of our operation.

To all the volunteers, in particular the Football Club Board, a huge thank you for your input—as without your willingness to help, the burden on our paid staff would be too great and they simply would not be able to get the job done.

In concluding, it is pertinent to emphasise that there are many projects that we could spend money on and no doubt they would enhance our operation, but we have to live within our means. In stating the obvious, the budget, and adherence to that budget is vital to the financial management of the Footy Club.

This is my last year as a Board member, so thanks to all that have helped out over the years and I hope to see you all at the footy again next year.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT



In a broad sweep across the performance of our six teams in 2008, where all teams played finals football, all associated with the club would say we had a successful 2008.

- 2008 Club Championship
- Reserves, Premiers
- Seniors, Runner up
- Under 18, 3rd (Preliminary Final)
- Division 3, Runner up
- Division 4, 3rd (Preliminary Final)
- Women, Division 2 Premiers

These results clearly reflect the depth of talent in the club and the quality and commitment of our coaches Steve Mahar, Brett Knowles, Brendan Read, John Harper, Bernie Williams, Kris Collins and Ossie Terron.

However the year will be remembered for the 'gut wrenching' one-point Grand Final loss after the siren with our Senior team... the flagship of our Club.

Being the totally dominant Senior team all year and losing 'the unlosable' was a bitter pill to swallow. How did it happen? Why did it happen? These will be the questions our club needs to consider over the coming months, along with action plans to never allow this to happen again. With nine Grand Finals in 11 years for three Premiership trophies, it is not a great return for effort....is there a missing ingredient in the make-up of our team?

Some of the pleasing aspects of our football year included the significant improvement of our younger Senior players when the team was missing injured experienced players. The same could be said of our Under 18 team under the coaching of John Harper, where we saw some emerging Senior players of the future. The resilience of players in the Reserves Premiership team under the passionate coaching of Brendan Read was also a highlight.

The Master Plan for the re-development of our training facilities at Kippax, initiated last year, has now gathered momentum—with the ACT Labor Government committing \$2 million to the project together with funding support from AFL NSW/ACT.

A working group will be established to further develop opportunities for increased funding support that hopefully will see the total Master Plan evolve into reality.

Melanie Brothers has now completed 12 months in her role as Junior Football Operations Coordinator and she has been outstanding with her commitment, work ethic and execution of her role. The Junior Football Strategic Plan is now well underway and the planning group that meets monthly is further developing AFL footy opportunities in our region.

At the entry point for AFL footy, the Auskick numbers in the two Junior clubs have significantly increased—even to the point where our club is coordinating two Auskick centres in Term 4 with over 65 children (well outside the normal football season)!

Sponsorship of our club is an important aspect of our income (over and above the generous funding support we receive from the Magpies Sports Club) and we thank all our sponsors again for their on-going support of the Football Club. We look forward to having them on board for 2009.

Earlier in the year we added another major event to our calendar, the Magpies Race Day, which proved to be a success in terms of both the event itself and the partnership that our club has developed with the Starlight Children's Foundation. Representatives from Starlight assisted with the Race Day and the club made a significant donation to this charity.

Many thanks to all of our support staff who contributed their time and energies for the Football Club this year. Trainers, water carriers, stats/video operators, runners, team managers, physios, doctors and assistants to the coaches all provided great support to the players and coaching staff.

We greatly value your support and hope you will be back next year.

2009 now represents an enormously challenging year for the football club, especially the Senior playing group and coaches.

The great challenge is to put 'closure' on 2008 and start the process of further developing attitudes and a winning style that leads us into a successful finals footy campaign in September 2009.

JUNIOR FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT



Season 2008, my first as Junior Football Operations
Coordinator, has enabled me to work with the Belconnen Cats and Junior Magpies to ensure they continue to increase junior participation, develop AFL in the Belconnen area and achieve the strategic themes set down in the Strategic Plan for 2008-2010.

The major themes of the Strategic Plan include:

- Participation
- Club Development
- AFL Football Promotion in the Belconnen Region
- Community Sport Connections
- Links between the Junior and Senior Clubs
- Economics; and
- The Structure of Junior Football.

Both Junior Clubs have seen an increase in participation numbers, particularly in the area of Auskick. Auskick numbers for both the Cats and the Magpies have increased by up to 60% on 2007. It was also great to see both junior clubs combine in the Under 16 age group to form three strong teams in the AFL Canberra Milk Junior Competition.

John Harper was appointed as Coaching Coordinator for Season 2008. A new initiative, John conducted monthly coaching workshops and was on hand to assist and help develop all of our junior coaches. It was also encouraging to see the senior players interact with the junior players—attending junior trainings and junior games to help them develop to their full potential. Another great initiative was having juniors play a game at half-time of a seniors match at Manuka, an idea that will be implemented on a more regular basis in the 2009 Season. This link between the junior clubs and the senior club is integral to the smooth transition of juniors into the senior ranks in years to come.

Our Part-Time Development Officer, Andrew Ainger, with assistance from AFL NSW/ACT development staff, conducted free AFL clinics within 16 of the local Belconnen Primary Schools. Over 3,000 children were exposed to AFL in the Belconnen region. St Francis Xavier College's Year 10, 11 and 12 students

participated in an 'Experience AFL' Program delivered by AFL NSW/ACT. These students completed an eight week course where they were able to obtain their Level O Coaching and Umpiring Certificates.

There were various School AFL Competitions run by AFL NSW/ACT, including the James Hird Cup, Swans Cup and Inter-School Girls and Boys College Days. Belconnen Schools were well represented in all competitions. There were five primary schools that competed in the Northside James Hird Cup, with St Michael's going through to the Finals day to compete against schools from across the ACT. Hawker College and Lake Ginninderra College competed in the Year 11/12 Swans Cup Competition. The Belconnen Magpies supported both school teams, supplying them with jumpers and coaching assistance for the matches. It was great to see many other local schools competing in the inter-school competitions, with a strong girls team from Canberra High winning the Girls Swans Cup in the Year 7/8 Competition.

This year, 11 teachers/parents became 'AFL School Ambassadors'. This ensured a point of contact between the Belconnen Magpies and local Belconnen Primary and High Schools. This program now provides a vital link between schools and the club—assisting with developing AFL within the school environment. Next year I hope to see an increase in the number of AFL School Ambassadors, with the aim of having at least one in every Belconnen School.

AFL NSW/ACT have provided great support and resources this year to ensure development in the Belconnen area remains strong and we as a club are able to deliver AFL to the community. John Love, Development Manager AFL NSW/ACT, conducts monthly meetings for all Junior Clubs to discuss issues and share ideas. These meetings are important for the future growth of AFL in Canberra and allow the junior clubs to catch up regularly with other junior clubs in an off-field setting.

Belconnen's Junior Football Strategic Planning Group (JFSPG) was established this season and is comprised of representatives from both Junior Clubs, Garry Davidson (General Manager), Melanie Brothers (Junior Football Operations Coordinator) and Peter Bradley (Chairperson). The JFSPG group meets on a monthly basis to discuss strategic issues associated with junior development and continues to make great

progress in driving the Strategic Plan for the Belconnen Magpies.

The future direction for 2009 is focused on developing AFL within the schools and increasing junior club participation numbers. Belconnen Magpies are hopeful of being able to secure a full-time Trainee Development Officer who will conduct school clinics and assist with junior development for our club. Belconnen has never previously had a full-time trainee, but with the increase in schools participating in our programs and the requirement of coaching assistance for school competitions, this is an important step for future development within the club.

The 2009 season looks set to be another year of achieving major goals and I look forward to facing the challenges, together with the Cats and Junior Magpies, to ensure another successful season of football.


Postscript - November 2008

I lost the services of Mick Foster, Stephen Coate and Stuart Gilchrist by Round 7, so knew we had to rely heavily on older legs. This was a big learning curve for me, but a tough time for the group to lose the services of these players coming into a cold, hard winter.

Obviously in a five team competition there is going to be a lot of byes, and getting a consistent effort from the group was quite difficult. We only played four games in a row once during the year, so playing yourself into some form was very difficult.

In the middle parts of the year we relied on a number of players due to injury throughout the club. One particular day against Queanbeyan we had 14 players unavailable, but still managed a seven-point win in what was our gutsiest win of the home and away season. Guys like Daniel Mahoney, Andrew Taylor and Mick Archibald played leading roles in keeping our team in a strong position on the ladder.

These times were also very difficult to coach, with a reluctance of players to change from lower grades into the Reserves. We would lose two or three players every week to the Seniors it seemed, but we

In the Grand Final we played a Queanbeyan Tigers outfit with a lot of momentum behind them, and we were probably sitting ducks with only two games in five weeks leading in. However, we asked our players to do extras over that period (like boxing sessions and Sunday morning trainings) and thankfully guys took that responsibility on themselves—helping us sneak away with a two-point win. This was also the greatest part of coaching this group....the players always took responsibility for their actions and were striving to achieve together and better themselves.

To my match day and selection help during the week—Marty Smith, Andrew Smith, Garry Davidson, Tony Stubbs, Lyall Camp and the trainers, our whole playing group thanks you. To Mahary and Knowlesy, thanks guys for all of your support.

To the Committee led by Darren Hooper, thanks for all of your efforts this year.

To our supporters on the day, thanks for helping us over the line—your vocal presence was invaluable for us!

To our retiring players, the football club thanks you for your many contributions over many years. We now need you as servants of the club because YOU NEVER STOP OWING THIS PLACE.

And to the guys who missed out, it breaks my heart when I think of you guys. However, I hope it spurs you on to bigger things because you are capable and you deserve it. Now, it's head down for 2009.
