

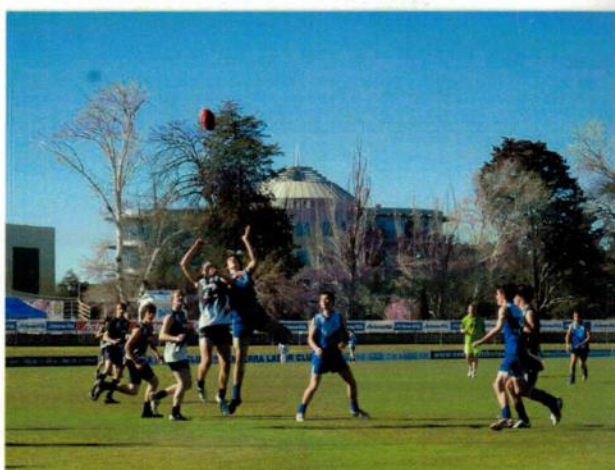

The volunteer base in our club is diminishing and our off field endeavours continue to place a lot of pressure on too few people. Different strategies have been discussed and tried but to no avail. We need more volunteers to push our club into the next decade of success so if anyone would be willing to invest some time we would be very pleased to hear from you.

Thank you to the football club board. It was with sadness and disappointment that Darren Hooper had to stand down from his role as club president half way through 2009 due to work and personal commitments and we appreciate all his hard work.

TREASURER'S REPORT



On behalf of the board, I am pleased to present the Club's financial report for the year ended 30 September 2009. At the time of writing, the audit of the Club's financial records was not

completed. Therefore, these results are correct at time of writing, however may change as a result of the audit.

In 2009 the Club is expected to report a profit in the range of \$40,000 to \$50,000. This is a significantly better result than our budget to break even for the year. Income for the year was \$620,000, down from a budget of \$647,000, and marginally up on 2008.

The Magpies Sports Club grant contributed \$466,000 of income and we would not be able to run our 6 senior football sides, as well as fund our junior development activities in the Belconnen region without the Sports Club support. I'd like to thank Bob Garrett, Jon Burrows and the Sports Club board for their generous support and belief in our organisation. The remaining \$154,000 raised comes from the ongoing support of our loyal sponsors, functions such

as our golf days and long lunch, various raffles and player registration fees. I'd like to thank all those associated with these activities.

The shortfall in income to budget was due to the cancellation of our race day, loss of sponsors and sponsorship activities and a shortfall in raffles for the year. While some of this can be attributed to harder economic times we need to ensure we are working hard to cover shortfalls in sponsorship and fund raising.

Expenditure for the year was \$570,000, down \$78,000 from a budget of \$648,000, and down from \$616,000 in 2008. From 2008 to 2009 we experienced a large transition in our playing group and the corresponding savings in player payments accounted for the majority of our budget savings. We were also able to secure various operational savings throughout the year as we were aware of revenue shortfalls.

This trading profit leaves the Club with Net Assets of \$107,049, with cash at the bank of \$24,833.

To all volunteers, support staff and BMFC board members I thank you for your commitment and support in 2009 and look forward to sharing future success with you all in 2010

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT



Season 2009 proved to be another year where the Belconnen Magpies Football Club further enhanced its reputation as the leading AFL Club in Canberra both on and off the field. A senior premiership and a strong financial position in difficult

economic times was the perfect result for 2009.

Senior Coach Brendan Read deserves every accolade possible after guiding the senior team to Premiership success.

After an "off-season" where a number of quality senior players left the club to move home or take up employment and education opportunities elsewhere in Australia, together with minimal recruits arriving at the club, the Grand Final result was a lesson in hard work and taking opportunities when they arose.

This was especially so with the senior players under the captaincy of Lexie Bennett and also after five key players were lost to the team with season ending injuries in the lead up to the Finals.

Hopefully the young players who achieved Premiership success in the absence of these injured players are the legacy that should set up another Premiership win. Couple this with the improved quality of players at the U18 level this year and some exciting times are ahead. John Harper has established a solid platform for player development at the U18 level and their Grand Final appearance this year was a great reward to that group (one more step in 2010?)

Our positive financial result amidst the global financial crisis reflects the prudence of the Board and the hard work of the Sponsorship working group headed by Stuart Dunn. We lost one or two minor sponsors during the year but were fortunate enough to gain four new sponsors and our player payment schedule was greatly reduced in 2009. We greatly value the contribution our sponsors make to our club and hope they continue to be part of the club in 2010.

As in 2008, our continued progress in establishing a 'benchmark' Junior Development model had been managed extremely professionally by Melanie

Brothers with some significant program elements added in 2009. The school vacation program, U16 Development Squad the appointment of a Trainee Junior Development Officer in Ashley Balazic, a Youth girls team in Term 4 and the senior match day/ junior team experience at Manuka Oval are examples of how much we have progressed. Mel will be leaving us in December to pursue opportunities overseas and at the next Winter Olympics in Vancouver. This leaves some 'big shoes to fill'. Thanks for all your great work Mel. You will be sorely missed as a great Junior Football Co-Ordinator, colleague and friend.

Aside from the 2009 Senior Premiership the year had some outstanding junior club team success with the U12 team in a Grand Final and both the U14 Cats and U16 team having Grand Final success. Good long term signs for the Senior club.

The re-development plans for Kippax are progressing with some significant steps being undertaken to develop a detailed design and cost schedule for the project. It is hoped that this is completed over the next month and will be ready for Government budget processes in time for the 2010 – 2011 ACT Government budget.

Following the Grand Final in September a 'legend' of the club retired. Steve Mahar has amassed a record that will be unsurpassed for quite sometime... if ever. Steve thank you for your great contribution to this club. Enjoy your retirement and time with family!

Support staff and volunteers form the backbone of all great clubs and our club is no different. For all the roles they fulfill we do appreciate their input and sincerely hope they are with us in 2010.

Season 2010 is looming, senior player recruitment is underway, players are back in training and expectations again are high. Striving for back to back senior premierships is nothing new for this club and all involved will use every endeavor to achieve such a result.

JUNIOR FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT



As Junior Football Operations Coordinator it was pleasing to see an increase in participation in AFL across a number of areas in Season 2009 including; junior football, school clinics and competition and Auskick. The introduction

of School Holiday Programs and Development Squads was well received within the Belconnen community.

Participation

Belconnen had a successful year in terms of development within our local schools. After securing the services of a full time Development Officer (Ashley Balazic) the club was equipped to deliver school clinics in over 85% of our areas Primary Schools. This saw over 4000 students being exposed to the great game of AFL and to their local junior clubs. There was an increase in participation from our schools in competitions conducted by AFL NSW/ACT within the region. The biggest being a Kinder – year 2 Super Clinic held in September with over 1000 students participating. This clinic showcased the benefits of AFL football for young school-aged children. Thank you to our AFL School Ambassadors and teachers who ensure their students were able to participate in these AFL activities. Cameron James and John Love from AFL NSW/ACT were of great assistance and guidance with school programs and competitions in 2009.

On the Field

Congratulations to the Belconnen Cats and Magpies Juniors on their successful season. It was encouraging to observe our junior clubs representation in every age group. The U/12 Belconnen Cats, U/14 Div 1 Belconnen Cats and Belconnen Magpies U/16 Div 1 all played in Grand Finals. This was a reward for those junior committees who play an integral part in the growth of junior football and assist always in the smooth running of their junior clubs.

Strategy

The Junior Football Strategic Planning Group worked tirelessly throughout the season, meeting monthly to discuss the strategic direction of junior development in Belconnen. The re-introduction of an U/16

Development Squad Program was a success with our U/16 players given the opportunity to play against an Eastlake U/16 Development Team. Belconnen are looking forward to extending this program further in 2010 including a visit from a Victorian AFL Club.

Development

Once again the junior clubs conducted successful Auskick centres throughout the football season with numbers increasing from last year. It's a great spectacle to see 50 plus children running around with their Mum's and Dad's having a kick of the footy and generally enjoying their AFL experience. Term 4 Auskick sessions were successful giving many children the opportunity to experience AFL for the first time. It is expected participants will join Belconnen for the 2010 junior season. It all begins at this young age and it's important to ensure the children enjoy their first experience of AFL at their junior club. I hope I have been able to contribute to this.

2009 saw the introduction of a School Holiday Program. In conjunction with Wests Magpies Basketball Club Belconnen offered a 3 day School Holiday AFL & Basketball Clinic. This was well received with over 50 children participating each day. Basketball and AFL have similarities in terms of skill and ability required to play either game and the club looks forward to continuing this partnership and offering further programs in 2010.

Senior Club Involvement

The senior and junior clubs strengthened their relationship this season. Thank you to Senior Coach Brendan Read, Captain Lexie Bennett and all the senior players who gave up their time to assist with junior training and games and various junior development activities throughout the year. It is important for juniors to be able to see what it's like to be a senior 'Magpie' for the day. These young juniors enjoy the time spent with the seniors on game days. It's important for the juniors to have the opportunity to meet the senior players and have positive role models they can aspire to. Likewise it was positive to see the junior players supporting the seniors on Grand Final Day which was reciprocated by the seniors with their presence at junior finals. I believe this shows a positive link between the 3 clubs and is one of the many factors that make Belconnen Magpies such a highly professional and respected AFL Club within Canberra.

SENIOR GRADE REPORT



I am writing this Annual Report message prior to the Grand Final as I don't feel that the result this weekend is necessary for me to evaluate our season.

No matter what happens, I am comfortable and confident in

the fact that we have manoeuvred ourselves from what was an extremely difficult situation into a position of strength. For our club to win a Club Championship and to have the Firsts, Reserves and Under 18's all finish first or second on the ladder at the end of the home and away season is something that was a pipe dream this time last year.

We have trained with a higher level of intensity than ever before seen at the Belconnen Magpies Football Club and I believe that this reason alone has seen the dramatic improvement in our younger players. They are fit, confident, skilful young men who represent our club for the right reasons. I am very proud of them. He is worth meeting, so if you have the chance, go out of your way to introduce yourself - he could be anything at our club in the future. And finally, Daniel Quee showed that with hard work comes reward. The fitter he got, the better he played.

I am lucky as coach to have some great older players to assist me. Mahary, you have been the best I could ask for in a mate and a player. Nothing was a hassle - you have played through pain and showed class that no one has ever shown in this competition. I am very proud to have a friend like you. Brock, Raadtsy and Snake have probably found it difficult to listen to my message at times. I have mentioned that it's not easy to coach players you played with and I thank them for being understanding of my deficiencies.

We/I have been blessed with work colleagues (managers) like Peter Dunn, Lyall and Cheryl Camp. For all the time and effort you have put into looking after the boys, I know they really appreciate it. To Gary Schmidt and the trainers, thanks for looking after the players. Your hours and hours of work are so valuable to the club that words won't and can't express how special you are.

Scott Smith, Brad Hiskins, Shane Brown (physio) and Wilson Lo, thank you for your help - you have greatly improved the level of communication with injured players and I think this will take another step forward in 2010. Thanks also to Mel Brothers for booking the AIS recovery facility when it was required.

To Hoops, I know it's been a tough little while and I thank you for believing in me and appointing me as a coach. To the Committee, who have also had a turbulent year, thank you for supporting football, footballers, and myself.

To the Match Committee of Garry Davidson, Rod Cowie, Andrew Smith and Kenny Meredith - I think we improved so much over the year. I had never previously coached a game from the box, and to have support like I've been given has been inspiring to me. Garry in particular, to make yourself available when required has been great.

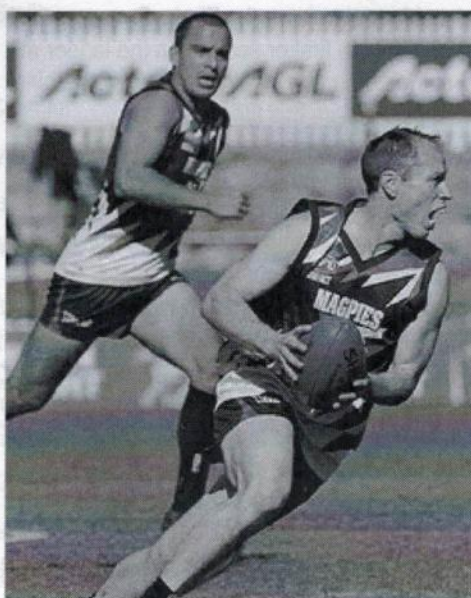

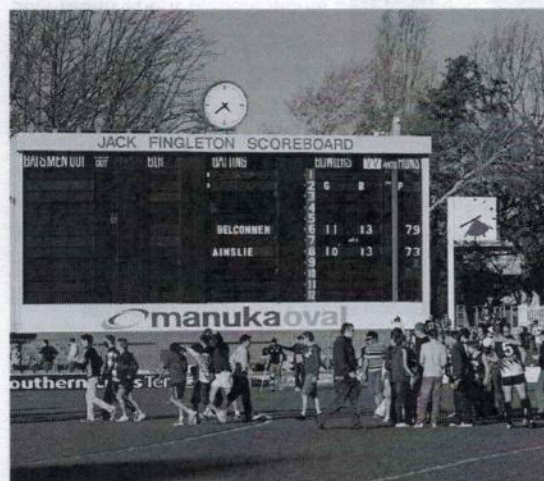
Congratulations to Best and Fairest winner Scott Henning whose leadership skills certainly helped the younger players in tough games.

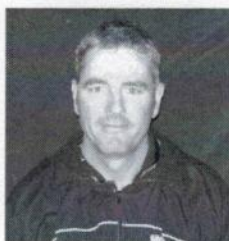
In closing the club is extremely grateful to the untiring work of the volunteers who worked with the team and we thank them sincerely.

UNDER 18S REPORT



The Magpies' u18s have had a very successful 2009 football season, finishing the home and away program with 10 wins, 8 losses and securing 2nd place on the ladder. Throughout the season we played a total of

32 players, more than half can play again in 2010 as top age players. The boys started training in early February and have continued strongly throughout the season. The season didn't start as planned after losing the first 3 games. A number of injuries to key players, representative duties, college and university commitments, plus the transition for some of our younger players into the senior football program, were a factor in our slow start to the season.

A number of our players had outstanding seasons, in particular Joss Whitford our Best & Fairest winner. Michael Handscome, Cameron Burdett, Brady Daw, Evan Brodie-Read, James Kenna, Kieran Ferns and Dean Fair have all had strong seasons.

It was great to see some of our U16s play in the U18s this year. Jordan Harper and Nick Collins in particular have made a great start to their senior careers. Nick Collins was also successful at gaining selection into the State NSW/ACT Rams U16 program. 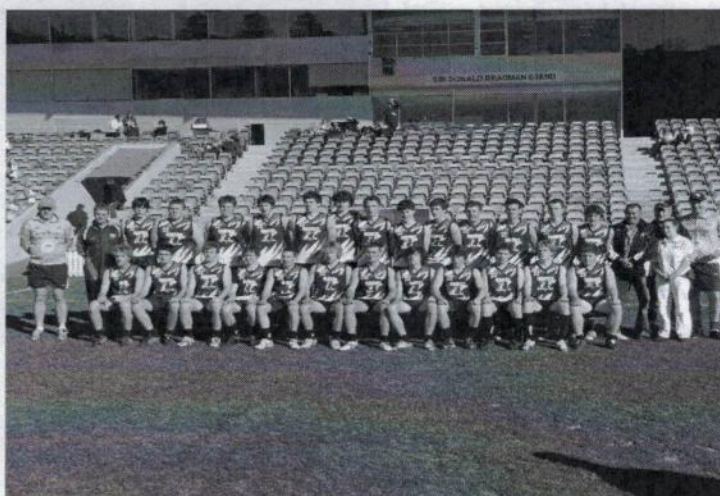

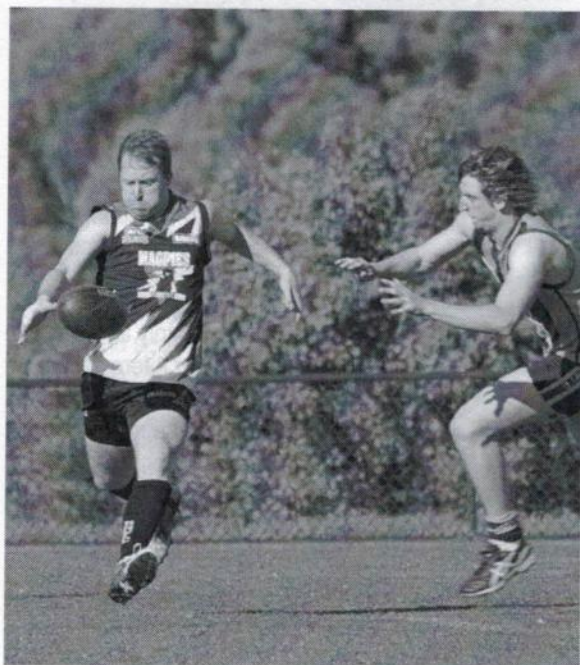

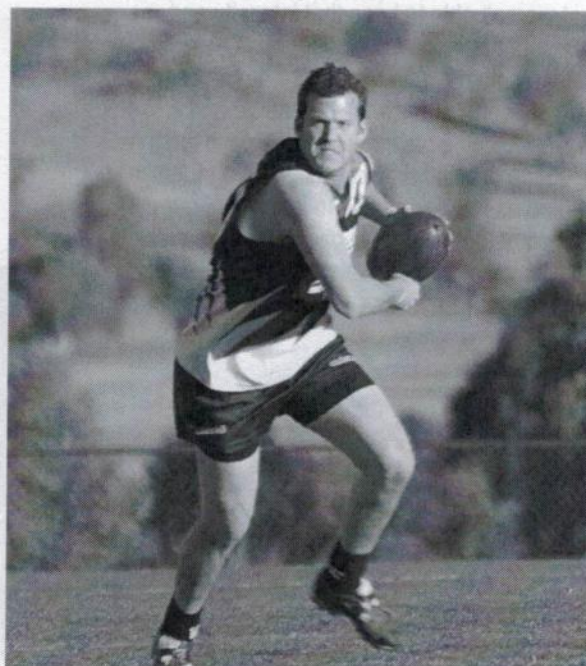

WOMEN'S GRADE REPORT



Overall the season was quite successful. There was a noticeable improvement in the skills of the players over the season with the games becoming much more competitive over time. Morale

remained high all year with 36 people attending the post season dinner. The women's team finished the home and away season in 5th place in an 8 team competition, which was the same the 2008, however in 2009, the team had 7 wins and 7 losses. We missed out on 4th place on percentage. The final series was a final 8 with 5th playing 8th. We won this game against ADFA easily. In the second week of the finals we played Riverina (4th) and were beaten easily to finish our season.

The top 3 sides (Ainslie, Eastlake and Tuggeranong) beat us in both rounds but our performance in the second half of the season was substantially better than the first. In the first round we lost to Eastlake by 84 points, Ainslie by 104 points and Tuggeranong by 70 points. In the second round we lost to Eastlake by 24 points, Ainslie by 23 points and Tuggeranong by 36 points. These results showed a steady improvement over the season. We beat Riverina for the first time in at least 5 years in round 3. This was the highlight of the year as we were 14 points down at 3/4 time and went on to win by 5 points. In the second round we were beaten by Riverina by 9 points in Wagga. The game was played in wet and muddy conditions. We didn't take advantage of our opportunities in a disappointing game. Apart from the Riverina game all our wins were largely one sided. The closest any team came to us was 23 points.

In total 34 players were used in games throughout the season. Only 19 players were available for the first game against Eastlake. In the following week 3 players joined the team and several players returned which meant we weren't short of players until mid way through the second round. During the round 13 game we lost 2 key players for the season with injury - one with a broken collar bone and one with a broken finger. In the second semi final against Riverina we only had 22 players to pick from - several of whom were sick or playing injured.

Of the 34 players who played games 13 were first year players, much higher than in previous years. For most matches the team was evenly split between first

year players and experienced players. There was a steep learning curve for the first year players and it was only in the second half of the season that they started to make an impact in games. Losing experienced players is a perennial problem in the women's competition if a team hasn't had success in previous years. With the introduction of a youth girls competition there should now be a pathway for young players to add depth to women's teams, even though Belconnen doesn't have a youth girls team yet.

Training attendance varied during the year. Prior to the season the highest attendance was 16. The best month for attendance was May after the new players arrived when we regularly had 20 players at training. As injuries took their toll on the team attendance fell dramatically. In August as finals approached the highest attendance was 15 and the lowest 10. This showed that if players were worried about their place in the team they would come to training but if they knew their place was safe they would occasionally skip training no matter how much they were encouraged. A core group of 8 players attending over 90% of training sessions. This group were predictably the best players in the team.

The season got off to a good start with practice games in Sydney against Sydney University and St George. These were both close games and both clubs were keen to play Belconnen again next year. The pre season carnival in early April was good for the new players although we lost a player for the season with a broken wrist.

Overall the competition was well organised although we had games on Saturday and Sunday. Some players had work commitments on Sunday and the team never performed as well as a result. The Belconnen trainers were brilliant as always. Special thanks to Jo Foster for travelling with the team to Sydney and Riverina. Thanks to Jeremy Foster who drove the team bus to Riverina. Liz Howell did a great job as Manager. Injured players were happy to help out on game day in various roles. Norm Sims deserves thanks as he filled various roles on game day as well as being first there and last to leave opening and closing the ovals for home games. The Belconnen football department provided excellent support as well.
