PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Daryl Read - President

I was honoured to accept the position of President of the Belconnen Magpies Football Club in December last year. My family has had a long association with the club and I am very proud to be able to make a contribution. Unfortunately 2010 was the year that the Belconnen Magpies Football Club reaped what we had sown. Just as we all basked in the glow of 2009, we must all carry some burden of responsibility for a season in which we didn't play finals. It is too simplistic to point to one event, or one problem. It is fair to say that the compounding effect of multiple events created an unfamiliar environment for us that we weren't prepared for. We had a playing list which was exposed by injuries to key players at wrong times and then didn't have the depth of list, or depth of character to meet the challenge this presented.

Off field 2010 was an initiation by fire for a new BMFC board. With a new President, new Treasurer (Mick Williams) and 4 new board members (Rory Markham, Chris York, Liam Early, Mick Williams) we were quickly under the pump when we lost the services of our General Manager, Garry Davidson, in March. Paul Netting answered an SOS call, kindly accepted a board position, and assumed the role of managing our sponsorships. He quickly turned this portfolio around, growing our sponsorship base and improving the servicing of our sponsors. We also welcomed to the board Lachlan Searle in May, Lachlan brings experience in media and marketing with large international sporting organisations and will be a key board member for our club in years to come.

The departure of Garry Davidson was a difficult time for the club and me personally. I will be eternally grateful to those who mentored me through this and offered support and advice. It must be said that to the end Garry always acted with the best interests of the club at heart and no one wanted success for our club more than Garry.

Garry's departure left a large hole at a critical time in pre-season. Thanks must go to Lyall Camp, Jo Foster, Scott Reid and Andrew Ainger who all worked together to ensure we got to round 1 in Sydney with minimal disruption to our playing group. We were without a General Manager until round 7 in the season when we gratefully welcomed Ray Hocking to the role. Ray stepped in at a difficult time and has performed admirably over this period. I look forward to working with Ray when he is able to implement some of his own ideas and put his own stamp on this club.

Despite the challenges that our new board faced we were able to implement a number of our key initiatives for the year. These include:

- ⇒ Review of our internal processes and procedures to implement recommendations from the 2009 audit management report.
- ⇒ New BMFC administration offices upstairs at the Magpies Sports Club.
- ⇒ Sponsorship growth outside of our Magpies Sports Club grant. Both in revenues and the number of new sponsors. Also improvement of our sponsorship servicing with a Magpies Business Network lunch.
- ⇒ Re-establishment of a Past Players and Officials group and a successful function at our first home game of the year where we defeated Ainslie and unfurled our 2009 Premiership flag.
- ⇒ Announcement of our "Team of the Decade 2000-2009" at the 100 Club Dinner
- ⇒ Growth of our Long Lunch, 100 Club and Presentation Night functions
- Development of the Magpies Academy (commencing end of 2010) for identified junior talent.

I'm extremely proud of all board members and the contribution that they have made. To all of you and your families "Thank You".

I will leave the on field achievements and results to the reports of the respective coaches elsewhere in this annual report. However I would like to make special mention of Adam Garret who as a first year coach guided a young reserve grade side to a grand final. The experience of finals football for this young group will stand the club in good stead going forward.

I would also like to acknowledge the significant contribution made to this club by outgoing senior coach Brendan Read. At the end of 2008 the club found itself in a position where we didn't have a senior coach, and it was very late in the year to begin the search for one. Brendan had just player coached our Reserves to a Premiership and agreed to take on the senior coaching role at very late notice. That Brendan and his senior team were able to win the 2009 Premiership under extremely difficult circumstances will go down as one of our clubs greatest moments.

2010 was a different year, however true to his character Brendan didn't relent and never accepted that we couldn't achieve our goals until the very end. He is a Belconnen Magpies man and can be proud of the way he has lead our club over the past 2 years.

Another departure this season is our club patron, the Hon Bob McMullen. For the past 20+ years Bob has been a visible club patron, attending many games and functions over the years. Bob was also able to secure a sponsorship arrangement for us with Westfield which has continued for 20 seasons. In the early 1990s the club was in a difficult financial position and this sponsorship helped to secure our ongoing survival. Bob was inducted as a Life Member at our Presentation Night and we wish Bob all the best for his retirement.

I would like to thank all coaches, assistant coaches, team managers, trainers, medical and support staff, team runners, water boys and girls, time keepers, gate keepers, canteen staff, video and stats staff. It is your contribution that allows a select group of lucky guys and girls to experience 2 hours of the greatest game each week. You have all done a fantastic job over the past season and I look forward to working with you all again next season.

To all of our loyal club sponsors a special thanks for your continued support this year. I hope you have enjoyed the benefits of our association and continue to see value in the work we are doing promoting AFL in the Belconnen community.

The club wouldn't be able to operate without the continued support of Bob Garrett, Jon Burrows and the board of the Magpies Sports Club. As the clubs major sponsor we are very grateful of the support you provide and the opportunities you give us to develop Australian Rules football in the Belconnen region.

Our club is full of willing people. Those who are willing to work, and those who are willing to let them. We need more help and more volunteers to assist with a multitude of tasks. If you can assist in any way please let us know. You will be welcomed with open arms and given an opportunity to be an integral part of something great as we work to regain our place at the top of the competition.

I wish all Belconnen Magpies people and their families a safe and prosperous summer and I look forward to working with you all again next season.

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the board, I am pleased to present the Club's financial report for the year ended 30 September 2010. At the time of writing, the audit of the Club's financial records was not completed. Therefore, these results are correct at time of writing, however may change as a result of the audit.

In 2010 the Club is expected to report a profit in the range of \$40,000 to \$45,000. This is a significantly better result than our budget to break even for the year. It was a year of consolidation from a financial perspective with almost an entire new committee kicking things off in late February. We will certainly benefit next year with the majority of the committee back for another season. Preparations have already commenced for this exciting new era of AFL in Canberra with the inclusion of GWS.

Income for the year was \$650,000, down from a budget of \$690,000, however it was marginally up on 2009. During the year we wrote off more than \$25,000 in uncollectible debtors which had been carried for a number of years. Our long lunch function continued to be not only highly successful, but profitable. Well done to Jo & Katrina, and to all who assisted in our marquee event. The Magpies Sports Club grant contributed \$500,000 of income and we would not be able to run our 6 senior football sides, as well as fund our junior development activities in the Belconnen region without the Sports Club support. I'd like to thank Bob Garrett, Jon Burrows and the Sports Club board for their generous support and belief in our organisation. The remaining \$150,000 raised comes from the ongoing support of our loyal sponsors, functions, various raffles, and player registration fees. I'd like to thank all those associated with these activities.

Even though we didn't meet our income target I'd like to thank Paul Netting and his sponsorship team who worked tirelessly to deliver our sponsors great service and value for money. No doubt 2011 will be an even bigger year in this area, with the re-launch of the golf day and other new functions planned.

Expenditure for the year was \$600,000, on a budget of \$680,000. We were also able to secure various operational savings throughout the year as we were aware of revenue shortfalls, however the bulk of these savings will mean more money must be spent in these areas next year.

This trading profit leaves the Club with Net Assets of \$150,000. To all volunteers, support staff and BMFC board members I thank you for your commitment and support in 2010 and look forward to sharing future success with you all in 2011.

With senior coach Brendan Read's retirement the club moves into a new era. Brendan's contribution to this club is immeasurable. With a senior and reserve grade flag to his credit as a coach, no one can deny his influence on the club as a whole, and it can only be hoped he continues his involvement with the club in some capacity.

I would also like to thank the coaches from all the other grades for their commitment throughout a very long season. Each of them extended their individual season deep into finals, and this a clear indication of that commitment. Having come to the club mid season, I needed a lot of guidance in existing club issues and policies. The help and support I received from the Board has been terrific, but I would like to thank in particular the club executive of Daryl Read who must have at times rolled his eyes when my number appeared on his phone, Jo Foster for her help through numerous issues and Scott Reid for his support throughout the season.

This club, like many others cannot survive without its volunteer work force, and to see the time and effort this group generously gives to the club, does make one proud to be associated with the Belconnen Magpies. To all of you, your efforts are greatly appreciated.

Our Junior program headed by Andrew Ainger, once again has been run in a professional manner and been very successful, with a number of under age teams experiencing finals footy. With the inaugural Belconnen football academy kicking off this year, Andrew together with John Harper has been kept busy ensuring the club has a list of talented local footballers to draw on in future years.

With 2011 approaching quickly the club has been busy recruiting players to help the club re gain its rightful position at the top of the AFL Canberra ladder, and new coach Michael Horne has current players on the track preparing for the new season and the possibility of a new league

JUNIOR FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT



2010 has been another rewarding season from both the Magpies Juniors and the Belconnen Cats. From a development point of view the statistics show it has been a fantastic year with a gradual increase in junior football participation, school clinics, AFL competitions and Auskick numbers. This year we were able to build on initiatives created in 2009 while creating new programs to help develop our junior players.

Junior Football

Due to healthy numbers in the junior clubs both the Magpies Juniors and the Belconnen Cats were able to fill teams in every age group. A special acknowledgment goes to the U14's Div 2 Magpies team on winning the premiership and the U12's Magpies for making the finals. Thank you to both committees who put countless hours in to ensuring each age group was able to field strong competitive teams. The committee are an essential group when it comes to assisting the growth of AFL in the area, Congratulations to both the Belconnen Cats and the Magpies Juniors on another very successful year.

School Participation

This year Belconnen were able to conduct its specialised AFL program in schools due to the hard work of our trainees Ashley Balazic and Justin Croker. The club delivered it program into 91% of the schools in the area. This ensured that over 5000 children in the Belconnen region experienced the game of AFL, this lead to an increase participation rate for the AFL competitions run. Thank you to Cameron James from AFL NSW/ACT for his ongoing support this year and to all the school ambassadors and teachers that make these school clinics possible.

Development Again in 2010 Belconnen were on the front foot interms of development. Both the junior clubs ran a successful end of season Auskick centres. We conducted the holiday clinics in both 1st and 3rd term holidays after how well it was received by the community in 2009. Term 1 saw Belconnen team up with Belconnen Basketball to provide an action packed holiday program. The program saw more than 25 plus children experience the different skills of AFL and Basketball. In term 3 Belconnen teamed up with BelNorth Soccer club, with over 60 children participating in the program. Soccer and AFL have similarities in the skills required to play the game, it was fantastic to see the children out enjoying the sunshine whilst playing sport. We look forward to continuing a partnership with both sporting clubs in 2011.

Senior Club

This year the club has worked on trying to strengthen its strong relationship between the senior club and junior clubs. Thank you to the work of senior coach Brendan Read and Captain Lexie Bennett. To all the senior players that gave their time up to assist the juniors, it really means a lot to the young children. The cooperation of the senior club to ensure that the VIP days for the junior was a successful day was very appreciated, the children we able to gain an understanding of what it would be like to be a senior player for the day. Thank you to all the senior players who attended the junior finals and to the juniors who attended the U18's and 2nd grade grand finals, this great bond that Belconnen have built will keep the club in good stead for years to come.

This year for the first time Belconnen Magpies have introduced a Belconnen Academy. aimed at players that have missed out on the Representative squads. John Harper will be head coach with the help of some very special quests. The programs plans to show the boys aged between U14-U18's the pathway to Senior Football at Belconnen while exploring Physical preparation, Skill Development, Nutrient & Recovery, Personal Development,

Firstly, I would like to thank the Belconnen Football club board for giving me the opportunity to coach the Development squad this year. After retiring from playing in 2008, I thought that I had finished a significant 'era' in my life. However life after football was always going to be a difficult transition. I was delighted when the opportunity to coach arose and I was also able to pull my footy boots on again! I have thoroughly enjoyed training; match days and having the opportunity to meet and watch some young, talented players develop.

Secondly, I would like to personally thank senior coach Brendan Read for his full support and mentoring in training and on game day. The chairman of selectors Rod Cowie, Justin Lalor, Bill Viney, Rhys McAlister and John Harper have also greatly assisted me as a first year coach. Their advice, tactical knowledge and physical assistance played a huge role in our successful year.

Season 2010, started as a bit of a dream with 11 wins after 11 rounds. I credit this to the exuberance, confidence and talent of our players. In a snap shot we had 10-12 players that were under 20 with the majority having graduating from the U18's in 2009. We also had Stephen Meikle and Joss Whitford who were still eligible to play U18's in the side regularly. The boys were fit, willing and dedicated to play for their club. The experience and leadership of Craig Eckersley, Anthony Whitard, Liam Early, Andrew Gatenby and Daniel Posch proved to be the perfect combination needed in a team. We definitely sent a message to the league that we were the ones to beat and that Belconnen has a strong future.

Throughout the year we have had a total of 48 players play in the development squad, which is a massive number. No two weeks were the same particularly in the second half of the

season when the Development squad felt the impact of the massive injury toll from first grade. We lost our experienced and more senior players due to promotion. This however gave some fringe second grade and U18 players an opportunity to join the squad. Rhys Hartwig, James Michelle, Tom Madsen, Jordan Harper, Zac Sheather and Daniel Jordan all came up from the U18s at some stage to give as hand. They certainly didn't let us down and showed that they were talented footballers that can play senior football.

In the second part of the season we were not winning as many games however we were still very competitive, loosing by narrow margins. Although it was not best way to go into a finals series I still believe we had the talent to win it. The first semi was played in terrible conditions. We were beaten by Queanbeyan's experience, they capitalised on their opportunities. The preliminary final against Ainslie was one of the seasons highlights, to come from behind all day and kick the last goal with 30 seconds remaining, showed character and belief. The season concluded with a disappointing result in the grand final, being beaten again, by Queanbeyan's size and experience. The pain of defeat will stay with the players and hopefully next time they're faced with the same situation they will be able to overcome it.

With a young side there were not to many milestone games however we do have some honourable mentions. Paul Netting played his 100^{th} second grade game this season. It was great to have the opportunity to see the club legend in action. Another honourable mention goes to Justin Hodder. He needs to be congratulated for finishing 3^{rd} in the leagues best and fairest. Justin is a very talented player who would have won the medal if he hadn't played 5 first grade and 1 swans game. I hope he has a long future with our club.

Another personal highlight for me as a coach was watching the development of Graeme Cook, a rugby convert, trying out AFL for the first time. 'Cookies' skills were a little bit questionable at times however he made up for it with his ruck work. It is that willingness to try new things and give it your all that I admire in a person.

Daniel Jordan also requires a mention, he stayed with the development squad during the final series when he could have easily taken the option of going back to the U18's. Well done Daniel for pushing yourself to the highest level possible.







WOMEN'S GRADE REPORT

Overall the season was very successful. There was a noticeable improvement in the skills of the players over the season with the games becoming much more competitive over time. Morale remained high all year with 36 people attending the post season dinner. The women's team finished the season in 4th place in a 9 team competition. We were in 6th place prior to the finals, mainly due to the uneven draw. We played all the top teams from 2009 twice and all the bottom teams once. The final series was a final 8 with 6th playing 7th. We won the first final on forfeit as ANU couldn't field a team. This set up a semi final against Eastlake which we won in a huge upset by 10 points. In the preliminary final we played Ainslie on a wet and windy day. The conditions suited their bigger bodies and they beat us easily to finish our season.

The top 3 sides Ainslie, Tuggeranong and Eastlake beat Belconnen in both rounds. Eastlake inflicted our biggest losses for the year - by 63 points and 50 points. To beat them in the finals was exciting for everyone involved in the team. We hadn't beaten Eastlake since the competition started so it meant a lot to players who had played for many years. Against Ainslie we led at half time in our second round clash but had injuries in the third quarter and eventually succumbed. We were 13 points down to Tuggeranong at 3/4 time in our second round clash but they outscored us in the last quarter.

In total 26 players were used in games throughout the season. The maximum number of players we fielded for any game, however, was only 20. At times during the second half of the year we were only able to field 16 players. This was tough on the players as we were in winning positions on a number of occasions only to tire in the last quarter and be overrun. The players responded well though. They stayed a close knit group all year and kept a belief in themselves. This belief was vindicated with our win over Eastlake in the finals.

Of the 26 players, 11 were first year players. For most matches the team was evenly split between first year players and experienced players. There was a steep learning curve for the first year players and it was only in the second half of the season that they started to make an impact in games. Losing experienced players is a perennial problem

in the women's competition if a team hasn't had success in previous years. With the introduction of an ACT youth girls competition there should now be a pathway for young players to add depth to women's teams although Belconnen doesn't have a youth girls team yet.

Training attendance varied during the year. Prior to the season the highest attendance was 22. During the season the lowest attendance was 8. The semi final team attended 59% of training sessions. There were a core group of 5 that attended almost all sessions. If these players were removed the rest of the team attended 49% of training sessions. This was partly due to playing games on Sunday and players then being sore for Monday training. It was also due to the players knowing they were going to get a game without training because of our low numbers.

The pre-season got off to a good start with a practice game in Sydney against Southern Power. We won this game easily and it gave the new players some much needed confidence. We then played in the Cooma Gala day against Ainslie, Eastlake and Tuggeranong where we won all our games. The Gala day final was against Eastlake which we won easily kicking 9 goals in the first 20 minutes of the game. We made the final of the AFL pre-season carnival with wins against Queanbeyan, ANU and Ainslie. We lost to Eastlake in the final.

Overall the competition was well organised although playing games on both Saturdays and Sundays over the season was disruptive. Some valuable players had work or other private commitments on Sunday and the team never performed as well as a result. Pre-season training was often difficult to arrange due to difficulties getting access to ovals.

Many thanks to Daryl Smeaton who performed miracles in his first year as team trainer. Petra Bright did a great job as Manager. Thanks also to Judy Henson who filled in for Petra when she was away. Injured players and parents/partners/friends were happy to help out on game day in various roles, which was much appreciated. Ivan Woods helped the team each week by providing essential equipment. The Belconnen football department provided excellent support over the year.

With their improvements this year, the team is already looking forward to taking it to another level and more success next year.
