President's Report



2011 was another trying year for all involved with the Belconnen Magpies Football Club. On field our senior side was not capable of playing finals football. We lacked the experience and polish of the sides above us. However those who took to the field each week competed with true Belconnen spirit and won the admiration of all supporters and staff week in week out. I was very proud of the way our players stuck to their task each week, and I know that the hard knocks we have taken this season will stand us in good stead in future seasons. Down the grades the Under 18s were a shining light as they won the club's 5th U18/U19 premiership. Congratulations to John Harper, his off field team and every player who played throughout the season.

Off field we experienced another turbulent year in which we lost our General Manager on the cusp of the season starting, our senior assistant coach mid season and then our senior and reserve grade coaches with 5 rounds to go. Each of these disruptions required many hours of work from many people to ensure the club remained on course and that these positions were adequately filled. To everyone who stuck tight, provided support and help I am truly thankful.

On the administration side we had to replace our General Manager before the season started. Ray Hocking resigned from the role after cyclone Yassi hit his Cairns property and then the NZ earthquakes required his attention. I thank Ray for his contribution to the club during his short time in the role. With the season about to kick off we decided it was not the right time to look for a new General Manager. We didn't need to look far to find a capable replacement as we had earlier in the year appointed Cameron Campbell as our Junior Football Operations Coordinator. Cam stepped up to the role of General Manager and juggled his role as a senior player and club administrator in a very professional manner. This year we also introduced a new position in the form of a Marketing, Events and Sponsorship Manager. We welcomed senior player, Matt Hammond to this position. When Cam stepped up to the GM position it left a vacancy in our Junior Football Operations Coordinator role. We were very fortunate to have the talents and experience of Rob Kelly in this role for an interim period before we appointed Sav Coate. Cam, Matt and Sav have

developed into a good off field team and they should be proud of their achievements and work this year. Our social media presence and communication has taken a massive leap forward with our new website, improved newsletters and our use of Facebook and Twitter. Over the summer our first Magpies Academy for talented juniors was well received and supported and we look forward to many of these kids coming through our ranks to be 100 Game players in the future.

It is never an easy time when both senior and reserve grade coaches depart mid season, however we were fortunate to have Brock Weston and Justin Lalor step up and take on the respective roles. Both Brock and Justin performed these roles tremendously, Brock being able to lift the guys to a memorable win over Tuggeranong at Greenway in our last game, and Justin taking the reserves to a Preliminary Final before stumbling to eventual premiers Queanbeyan.

Despite the problems and issues this year there were many positives for our club. We kicked off the season with a "One Club" theme and this was supported by a combined pre-season camp and a combined season launch. This set the tone for the season where players and supporters from all grades supported each other and shared in each other's successes and milestone achievements. Our social events were well attended by all grades and post match awards at the club with all 6 grades in attendance created a welcoming and shared BMFC environment for everyone.

2011 was the 40th anniversary of the formation of the Belconnen Football Club and we celebrated this milestone at our 100 Club function. Thank you to all past players, sponsors and supporters who came along and shared in the occasion. The club is nothing more than it's people past and present and it was great to share stories and relive moments from the past 40 years. The highlight of the night was standing arm in arm around the room as we belted out a rowdy rendition of our wonderful club song.

Each season has it's milestone games and while not discounting the others the milestones of Paul Raadts (200 First Grade Games), Lexie Bennett (150 First Grade Games) and Brendan Read (Club Games record of 319) should be noted for their significant longevity at the club and particularly at the highest grades over many years. Congratulations to you all on these milestones, they are an amazing achievement and I know the result of many hours dedicated to the club.

We are also excited by the upcoming redevelopment of the Kippax Ovals. This project has been in the pipeline for many years and was nearly dead and buried before Brendan Read was able to bring it back to life. Through

shear persistence with the ACT Government and other project sponsors Bubba has successfully lobbied and negotiated his way to the point where we are looking at a \$3M plus project. This is an incredible result and knowing the hours that he has put into this project at the expense of his business, family and other interests the Club is indebted to Brendan for this work. Treasurer's Report



The Belconnen Magpies Football Club has made a sizeable investment in training equipment over the year and donated \$25,000 into the Kick in for Kippax fund. Even with these outlays the Club will make a small profit for the year.

I would like to thank the Club Board for their tireless work throughout the year, especially Daryl Read who has done a tremendous job steering the Club through a difficult year. Cam Campbell came on board as Football Manager this year and has done a very professional and efficient job. Paul Netting has done a great job with Sponsorship and Matt Hammond has run some terrific and successful functions including the Long Lunch and the 100 Game/Anniversary dinner.

I would also like to thank all the volunteers for their hard work, the sponsors for their continued support, and the players, coaches and trainers who generously donated to the Kick in for Kippax fund. The support provided by these people and businesses typifies what this Club is all about.

I would like to recognize the support provided by the Club's major sponsor, the Magpies Sports Club.

Thanks to Jon Burrows and Bob Garrett for their advice throughout the year. Lastly I would like to acknowledge the fantastic job of the Kick in for Kippax committee lead by Brendan Read. If it wasn't for their persistence and drive we would be still dreaming about watching a senior game at Kippax.

Total revenue totaled \$735,000 for the year. This was an increase of 13% on the year before. Highlights included an increase in sponsorship of 43% to \$112,000, and function profits increasing by 60% to \$24,000.

Total expenditure totaled \$730,000 for the year. This was an increase of 21% on the year before. Major one-off items included \$20,000 on training equipment, \$46,000 for preliminary expenses for the Kippax oval including our donation to the fund, and \$9,000 on a new Club website.

I look forward to working with everyone again next year.

This year our Junior Development program went through a number of staff changes, thank you to Rob Kelly for the short period he was involved. Stephen Coate has now come into the junior development role and his work since he took on the role has been fantastic. He has rolled out a number of successful programs including the School

Holiday program which increased in size and participation numbers from 2010 and will grow again in 2012. The Academy program will evolve this year and consist of 2 age groups, we are expecting large numbers across the board. Other new initiatives that have been rolled out in 2011 have been: Kids First programs, umpire education sessions and School based Auskick. Stephen is already looking at new initiatives for 2012 and it will be an exciting year for grass roots football where he will be able to put his own stamp on junior football in the Belconnen region.

Two new roles were created in 2011 to assist the football club, the major role assisting in 3 areas, event management, marketing and sponsorship. Matt Hammond was appointed in this role and relocated from Cairns, Matt has been exceptional in delivering in all areas of his role as well as assisting in developing new Club events like the Ipod Shuffle night. In 2012 there will be some new events including a BMFC Race day and possibly a reverse raffle. Matt has also been a driving force in the KI4K campaign along with Brendan Read and Andrew Smith, the fund has reached the initial target of \$100,000 and will reach \$128,274 once all pledges are finalised. It will be fantastic to be able to play home games at Kippax in the future.

Matt has also increased our social media networks to an impressive level. Jo Foster and Katrina Gallway have both been crucial to Matt's role and I thank them for their assistance. It has been a transition year for the sponsorship and Matt and I are both working tirelessly to meet and support all of our sponsors to ensure their continued commitment for years to come. Paul Netting has done a fantastic job with the sponsorship and should be commended for his efforts.

The second role that was established in 2011 was a part time Trainee role from Hawker College. Ryan Gibson, a current BMFC Under 16 player, took on this role for 2011 & 2012 and has been a valuable asset both in the office doing sports administrative tasks and also in the field where he has assisted the NEAFL, Reserves and Under 18's sides with stats.

The 2012 season is just around the corner and it is a very exciting time for the football club, although we are starting from bottom of the ladder its times like these where true club people will stand up and help the club reestablish itself in the new NEAFL competition.

Pre-Christmas training has just commenced and I am truly excited about the opportunities that lay ahead for our entire club and I look forward to working with everyone in the New Year.

Under 16s

The under 16's was a funny one this year. We started off great having entered 3 sides at the start of the season but unfortunately we dropped some numbers and we were forced to reduce to two teams early in the season. Both sides were still able to be very competitive and make finals. I would like to thank Mal Douglas, Steve Smith, Julie Smith, Kris Archibald and Scott Reid for all the work they put in this year with the under 16s. Thanks to Lukey Donohoe, Ryan Turnbull and Andrew Dess who gave up their own time to assist the group. There will be a large number of the U16 players move into the U18 competition next year and the senior club welcomes each of you.

School Participation

Belconnen were able to conduct AFL clinics in 18 of the 23 primary schools in our region till the end of term 3 and we are pushing hard to get clinics into the other schools in term4. We had a great response from all of the schools and we thoroughly enjoyed getting out and introducing AFL to the children. I would like to thank Cameron James and staff from AFL NSW/ACT for all their assistance throughout the year without them we could not have had such an impact in our area. I would also like to thank all of the School Ambassadors, they make life easy when it comes to getting into our schools. This year we had 18 Ambassadors which is an increase on last year.

Development

It was a great year for development for both junior clubs, we successfully ran Auskick centers throughout the year. Two new Auskick Centres were introduced. One Centre was held at Latham oval and the other at St Michaels Primary, there was a total of over 45 partciapnts across the 2 centres. We also co-ordinated and ran a very successful 3 day holiday program in the October holiday period and had over 60 participants exposed to a variety of sports including basketball, soccer and AFL. It was great to see the children enjoy the program and im sure there will be many future junior players come from this program. A special thank you must go to Sophie O'Dea and the team mascot for making the event such a hit. Preparation has started already for 2012 and we expect to have 2 school holiday programs. The addition of our Academy program last year was fantastic initiative, the program was aimed to give the players that had missed out on representative teams a chance to be exposed to the best coaching and improve themselves as footballers. The program was spearheaded by John Harper with assistance from Andrew Ainger, Cameron Campbell and Senior Players. The Academy will be back in 2011/2012 and will start on the 17th of November. The program will be open to all players in the Belconnen Region from 11-17 years old. We also rolled out two "Kids first programs" one with the Magpies and one with the Cats they were both well received and will be back next year. Early in the season we introduced an umpire education session for selected teams from Cats and Magpies, we had positive feedback from all teams so you can expect to see this again in 2012.

2011 was perhaps the most turbulent season in our clubs proud history with plenty happening both on and off the field. As most seasons do, the season started with plenty of hope. The senior group had a strong pre-season under the watchful eye of a newly appointed coach in Michael Horne and by his side, a club champion and newly appointed reserves coach in Rowdy Williams. We had a wealth of young guys trying to break into senior footy and a plethora of new comers to the club hopeful of being the recruit that made the difference.

Round one was a wake-up call for any at the club that thought we going along ok and things didn't get any better over the coming weeks. In our seventh game of the season the stars and planets aligned and we were able to turn around our 123 point round one defeat to Queanbeyan into a 14 point win. Relief.

After a 6 point loss to Tuggeranong in Round 16, our 13th game, both Michael Horne and John Williams turned their back on the playing group and walked away from the Belconnen Football Club. This was a massive shock for both myself and the playing group, especially considering

the difficulties we were experiencing on the field. It was important however that this drama didn't affect the playing group or the club, and to our credit we responded in typical Belconnen fashion and banded together in a difficult time. While on paper the last 5 games will reflect only one win, the final game against Tuggeranong, a resounding victory, will be remembered as the most important of the season and proved just how much this club means to everyone involved. The character shown by the group and their willingness to work and play as a team, was instrumental in us finishing off a disappointing season in memorable fashion.

I was conscious of trying not to turn this report into a 'thankfest' but I feel it's necessary as there are so many individuals that contribute to our club to help make it the great organisation it is. The greatest of my thankyous needs to go to the playing group, both senior and reserves, for accepting both myself and Justin Lalor into caretaker roles. It would've been easy for you to go into self-preservation mode in this difficult time but to your credit you all stuck together and played out the season strongly. You all embraced my focus of enjoyment and played some exciting football. I know the whole group will be chomping at the bit to redeem themselves and I can foresee a much improved effort in 2012.

Our semi-final clash a week later against Eastlake then saw us chalk up our fifth straight win to take us within two games of the ultimate reward.

Expectations were high going into the Preliminary Final against Queanbeyan and I still firmly believe that our footy was good enough to beat any side in the competition. Our

passion for the contest, our hardness at the footy and our willingness to run and support a team mate had become real trademarks of our game-style and these generally stand up well under the pressure of finals footy. Scott Smith and Rowan McIntyre also deserve a big thank you for their diligence and professionalism in managing player rehabilitation during the season.

Thank you to Daryl Read and to the Football Club Committee for the enormous amount of work you've undertaken this season. It's a huge task to support six teams each year and the effort that occurs behind the scenes to make this happen is greatly appreciated by the players and coaches.

My wife Shae and my two girls Charli and Eva were a huge support. They put up with me when I was stressed, provided me with plenty of perspective and believed in me the whole way—so I am eternally grateful for that. Thanks also to all of the other supporters, family and friends who cheered the boys on during the year and allowed them to commit the time to their training and game day responsibilities.

I'm sure there are some really exciting times ahead, so lets hope the Reserves can take those couple of extra steps towards Premiership glory in 2012.

I would like to thank the Board and the Canberra Districts playing group for allowing me to take on the role of coach this year. In the 10 plus years that I have spend at the Magpies, being able to coach close friends and committed footballers has provided me with some of the greatest memories.

The 2011 season marked a transition period for the 4th grade side and new opportunities arose for previously fringe players to make their mark. On the back of the third grade's premiership win last year, the Canberra District group saw the retirement of all but three players from the third grade side. This resulted in nearly fifteen 2010 fourth grade players steeping up a grade, and paved the way for the 4th grade side to welcome in a similar number of new players to the Magpies fold.

With a new group of players and leadership group, the 4's started the season with great energy and hunger. The quality preseason efforts were on display in the Cooma Cup, which the Magpies won for the first time in the competition's history.

Unfortunately, 4th grade was not able to take this energy into the first part of the regular season with the newly blooded Magpies losing momentum and falling to the more experienced and harder bodied sides of ANU, Tuggeranong, ADFA, Cooma and Goulburn in the first five rounds. eyes of at least five new recruits, brought home to me the sense that the team could not be broken. The game against Cootamundra (lost 25 points) also deserves special mention as the team chased down a 42 point margin to be one point up in the last five minutes.

The 4's are set to have a great 2012 season. The playing group remains proud and has put every team on notice in 2011 that Magpies have a never say die attitude and will fight back. To succeed from here we will need to nurture the new players introduced to 4's and secure two to three key position forwards and midfielders. After Round 11 the team had beaten both of last year's grand finalists, Ainslie and Tuggeranong. We had narrow losses to the eventual 2011 grand finalists, Eastlake and Riverina, by 10 points and 1 point respectively. Every indicator pointed to a successful year but injuries and player absences soon started to take their toll. As the injury toll mounted the results got worse. In Round 17 against Gungahlin 10 of the team's best 18 players were unavailable and we were beaten, pushing us out of finals contention.

This year it soon became evident that there were 5 teams in contention for the finals. In previous years the finals system was a final 8 which meant there was no pressure on most sides to make the finals. This year the system was changed to a final 4. As a result, the top teams didn't go easy on the bottom teams as percentage was important. The Belconnen women's team percentage was healthy all year with our biggest loss was to Riverina by 67 points in round 14 when we were missing quite a few players. Our big wins were in the early rounds. In Round 5 we beat ANU 142 to nil which was the biggest score in the team's history. We lost a number of games by narrow margins which meant we were under pressure to win nearly every game in the second half of the season. The women's team had 32 registered players this year which was a substantial increase on previous years. Despite that big number, there were a number of games late in the year where we couldn't field 22 players. There were only 4 players in the team who played every game for the season.

Of the 32 registered players, 10 were first year players. There was a steep learning curve for the first year players as many had never kicked a ball before the season began. This will remain a perennial problem in women's football if there is no pathway for young girls to play football, through to the senior grade. With the introduction of a youth girls competition in Canberra there is an opportunity for young players to come through adding depth to women's teams but as Belconnen doesn't have a youth girls team yet we are disadvantaged relative to other sides.

Training attendance varied during the year. Prior to the season the highest attendance was 27. During the season, the lowest attendance was 7. On average, the team attended 60% of training sessions. There were a core group of 6 that attended over 75% of the sessions. Attendance suffered partly due to playing a number of games on Sunday and then being sore for Monday training. Attendance was helped by the Club organising indoor facilities when the weather was terrible. This occurred three times during the year and was appreciated by all concerned.

The pre-season results were mixed. The Cooma Gala day grand final was called off when the Tuggeranong team walked off the field after two of their players were sent off following various altercations. The next week we played the Balmain Tigers in Bargo. This was a terrific match with Balmain winning narrowly but the new Belconnen players were able to get some valuable game experience.

During the year, one of the senior players, Mercia Smith, reached her 100 game milestone. Three players, Elise O'Dea, Hannah Wallett and Heather Anderson represented the ACT at National championships with one player, Elise O'Dea being named All-Australian, one of the highest honours in women's football. Three players, Sophie O'Dea, Jenna Girvan and Heather Anderson, represented NSW/ACT at the Youth Girls National Championships where Heather Anderson was named in the All-stars.

Overall the competition was well organised although the League's practice of using Club, rather than independent umpires created significant issues on occasion and led to unnecessary conflict and tension during games. Perceptions of bias, whether real or not, influenced the outcomes and those games were spoilt as a result.

Many thanks to Petra Bright who did a great job as Manager. Thanks to Judy Henson who filled in for Petra when she was away. Thanks to Lancelot Yu who was assistant coach but also performed different duties to help the team every week. Thanks to all the Belconnen trainers who were magnificent as always. A special thanks to Nicole Wood who was there every week. Thanks to Lyall Camp who helped the team each week by providing essential equipment. Thanks to Cameron Campbell (Belconnen football manager) who provided excellent support and was a pleasure to deal with. Thanks to Paul Netting and John Harper who took some of the sessions during the year.
