# Treasurer's Report



In 2014, the Club had a new President, Treasurer and General Manager. The Club operated for eight weeks without a General Manager which tested the effectiveness of our administrative processes and procedures.

In setting the 2014 budget, the aim was to continue to reduce retained earnings to ensure the Social Club grant was maintained and didn't reduce because of our level of retained earnings.

The budget was set to run at a \$67,400 loss. The year ended with a \$31,800 loss, an improvement on budget of \$35,600. Income for the year was \$14,300 below budget and expenditure was \$50,000 less than expected.

Revenue for 2014 was \$589,700 (2% under budget and 19% down on 2013). This was mostly due to a reduction in the Social Club grant by \$100,000 or 21%.

- Functions generated \$31,500 (down 27% on budget and down 21% on 2013). The Race Day and Long Lunch were down on attendance and profit.
- Canteen contributed \$4,500 (35% down on budget and 83% down on 2013). This was due to extra finals' games at Kippax in 2013.
- Gate takings were \$1,050 (79% down on budget and 78% down on 2013)
- Registration fees raised \$39,500 (10% down on budget and 15% down on 2013)
- Sponsorship revenue was 106,000 (4% up on budget and 3% up on 2013)
- Raffles raised \$15,000 (7% up on budget and similar to 2013)

Expenditure for 2014 was \$621,500 (8% under budget and 11% down on 2013). Categories of expenditure were generally in line with budget with the exception of player payments, which were 26% down on budget and 27% down on 2013). This was due to limited recruiting and injuries to key players

early in the season. Uniform/apparel expenses were 136% over budget due to over ordering.

The Club is fortunate to have many dedicated volunteers who give their time across all areas of the Club. Thank you to the Committee for your contribution and guidance. To Scott Reid, who took over as President from Peter Bradley early in the year, thank you for your drive and enthusiasm. To Jo Foster, thank you for the time you give and your hard work across many areas of the Club.

Thank you to Peter Young and Stephen Coate for your contribution in the administration of the Club. Stephen is quickly learning about the diverse roles involved in football administration. 2015 presents Stephen with the opportunity to development his skills and I look forward to working with him.

Thank you to Katrina Gallway, Stephen Coate and Paul Netting for your efforts organising and running functions. A special thanks to Paul Netting for his dedication and commitment to raising sponsorship funds for the Club. Sponsorship is the single biggest fundraising contributor to the Clubs' revenue. To all sponsors thank you for your continued support. The Club appreciates your contribution and looks forward to having you on board in 2015.

The Sports Club offered great support during the year. Thank you to Nick Condell, Stephen Oh, Marie Bartlett and Ray Baguley for their assistance.

2015 will be a year of change. The Boards' decision to opt out of NEAFL in 2015 due to increasing costs and the uncertain future composition of the competition is positive for the Club. The opportunity to play three grades at the same ground on the same day will enable us to manage our resources more efficiently and generate increased revenue from gate takings and catering. The year will bring many challenges, both on and off the field. The best way to tackle these challenges is by having a united approach where all areas of the Club work together.

### **NEAFL** Report

To The Belconnen Faithful,

The 2014 NEAFL season was one full of enjoyment, challenges, high points and like any season some testing times. I feel as if it had the lot.

The group started it's pre season in early November and in a unique scenario the announcement of myself as coach came once training had already started in preparation for the 2014 season. The professionalism of the coaching staff to plan and coordinate the pre Xmas phase was top shelf and I was happy to arrive post Xmas and be greeted by an enthusiastic group of players who were keen to get the best out of themselves and see where it took the group in the newly structured NEAFL competition.

Our pre season included our One Club camp which was incredibly well run and all who attended enjoyed the weekend immensely.

Unfortunately we were only able to play in two external practice matches, which on reflection, did compromise our preparation in what was already a pre season phase which had it's challenges. Although Ainslie knocked us off in our final trial, we were optimistic that we were heading in the right direction and with key players up our sleeve returning from long term injuries there was a healthy optimism that we would be a competitive unit throughout season 2014.

We travelled to Queensland to play Aspley for a Foxtel Cup birth and while we knew it was going to be a tough game nothing prepared us for what was to come. A 150+ point defeat in a game where we were barely competitive made us realise that we were playing a new ball game in a landscape that had changed immensely and was going to be incredibly tough. I look back on the first two games of the season in which we lost our second by over

100 points to the GWS and am thankful that it came when it did. Having the understanding that we had so much work to do from an early part in the season gave us the chance to push our standards higher, not accept efforts that weren't going to improve us and to be harder on each other in general, all of which assisted us as we moved through the year.

Without sugar coating things we experienced some really disappointing performances early. The losses to Queanbeyan and Hills Eagles in successive weeks were low points to the season and both from an individual and team perspective we were underperforming without doubt. This brought the best out in some and seeing the development of Damien Hector and Chris Jansen through this tough time was incredibly pleasing. Some of the group struggled to appreciate the fact that they weren't operating at the standard that the NEAFL demanded and this was challenging for many during the year and led to inconsistency in both individual performances and team results.

Our tough win against Sydney Uni was a beauty and one that gave us a much needed morale boost and some confidence that we could mix it with the better teams within the competition. Ryan Turnbull's portion of the season was pretty special and he played another massive role in this win.

As the season went on we steadily built on each performance and while we no doubt had some setbacks I thought by about 3 quarters through the season we could lay claim to seeing some significant improvement. Lexie and James Bennett's return was crucial and Nabako Stow and then Simon Curtis joining the group made us feel as if we had a team that could turn up and expect to be competitive. Again, we must be honest and at times some of us flirted with this confidence with mediocre training efforts and struggled to come to terms with being held accountable for poor performances and making the changes that were required to get better. This is an important part of all players development and I look forward to working with everyone again on this next year.

The final part of the season was enjoyable and came with enough success to keep us ticking. Multiple wins over Queanbeyan and Eastlake gave us the opportunity to call ourselves the second best team in Canberra and the win over

Southport was an incredibly special moment in our season. At the time I genuinely felt as if I hadn't been apart of too many wins that were better than this one and felt incredibly proud of the Belconnen Magpies team that took to the field that day.

Despite my comments in regards to some inconsistent training etc I appreciated the buoyant mood that remained within our group for the whole season. Belconnen is a great club with a great culture and I feel as if the players don't take this for granted. It's a place where people love to be and this was noticeable throughout the good times and the tough.

We were represented by many in 2014 with over 40 players representing us at NEAFL level. A crazy number. We debuted a solid amount of players which will hold us in great stead for the coming years. Well done to Rhys Healy, Ryan Bradley, Tom Brown, Ben McCabe, Mark Smith, Luke Wharton, Sam O'Sullivan and Adam Lamb who are all local products to taste NEAFL action. The group was also was strengthened by TJ Adams, Luke Vearing, Ryan Blundell and Nabako Stow as new players to debut for the club.

How do we sum up our year? We are all competitors so to finish where we did was disappointing. Thanks to everyone for making my entry into the footy club so enjoyable, I am very happy and proud to call myself a Belconnen person.



Throughout the season there were some really good results go our way. We had 5 players represent the club in the game at Manuka Oval against AFL Sydney and they all played well. The Div 1 side also had a number of players go on and play NEAFL throughout the year and also got to have a look at the future of our club with some U18 players playing multiple games and showing some really encouraging signs for the club going forward.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone that has helped out throughout the long season that was 2014. Thank you to Calvo, who gave up his time to help out throughout the year as my assistant coach and also to Jeremy and the NEAFL assistants for the encouragement and direction that was given to me this year. I would like to make special mention of Ned Gatenby who was the official captain of the Div 1 side and also went on and played a handful of NEAFL games for the year, your support and leadership was brilliant. Good luck with your new adventure to Melbourne and I hope to see you back around the BMFC in the near future. I would also like to thank the medical staff and all volunteers involved with the BMFC that


have done a fantastic job across all grades in 2014. I hope to see you all again in 2015.



with dignity and respect. Let's hope that we all stick together and come out the other side a much stronger, tighter knit unit.





2014 has been the most successful season for the BMFC Women's team since the ACT Women's League started playing 22-a-side. In the past two seasons we have gone from a team who could put up a fight 'on our day' to a strong, powerful and consistent team that is hard to beat.

The elusive premiership was within our grasp however a 3 point loss in our Second Semi against Premiers Tuggeranong and a week later a 1 point loss against Riverina Lions brought a premature end to our 2014 season.

This season we had a great mixture of returning players that formed a strong core who were well supported by gutsy and determined newbies. We welcomed players from other clubs, players from other codes (who have now seen the light) and players new to the game.

From a Women's team perspective no other season can compare to what we were able to do as a team this year, a few of the highlights include:

- We defeated every team in the competition at least once;
- Winning by a team high 189 points in a game when we defeated ANU 28.21.189 to 0.0.0;
- Hannah Wallet kicked 14 goals in a game (previous highest was 9) vs. ANU;
- 16:3 win/loss ratio for the home and away season;
- Third season in a row the league Best and Fairest has been a Belconnen Magpie (2012 Elise O'Dea, 2013 & 2014 Heather Anderson); and
- 2<sup>nd</sup> season in a row the league leading goal kicker has been a Belconnen Magpie (2013 Zoe Cooke, 2014 Hannah Wallet).

 We finished 2<sup>nd</sup> on the ladder. We had the toughest draw of any of the teams in the league and we still finished with the same win/loss ratio as Tuggeranong and Riverina – only percentage separated the top 3 teams;

- Our lowest score all season was 12, every other team in the league had scores lower than this; and
- We kept opposition to less than 10 points on 7 occasions (this includes against 4 Division 1 sides);
