Treasurer's Report

It was a difficult year from a logistics perspective. The combination of a change in ownership of the Treasurer portfolio, changes to accounting software and processes, removing financial reporting responsibility away from the Magpies Sports Club and the change from cash to accruals reporting in 2018 accounts caused a significant delay in getting oversight of the football club's financial position. This delay led to several important financial decisions being made without reference to the final 2018 financial position. These included, but were not limited to, increasing player payments and medical expenses for the 2019 season. The loss posted in the final 2018 accounts was \$26,096.26.

The loss posted in the final 2019 accounts is \$73,292.18. this is a terrible outcome for the football club. The challenge is set for the Board and the Executive of the Board to set a strict budget in 2020 and slowly rebuild the football club's net asset position. Another year with losses on the same scale of 2019 and 2018 would be disastrous for the future of the Belconnen Magpies Football Club.

Items in the Profit & Loss Statement warranting further explanation are listed below:

- Gain/(Loss) on Disposal of Non-Current Assets - (\$2,553.00): The ANZ stadium tickets taken up as an asset on the Balance Sheet were not renewed and as a result the asset was removed from the Balance Sheet.
- Gate Takings Nil: The decision was made to not charge entry to Belconnen home games as this significantly reduced the ground hire rate charged.
- Abnormal Item \$26,013.76: These expenses are related to the 2018 season and should have been accrued in the 2018 accounts.
- **Bad Dets Written Off** \$4,381.81: The decision was made to write off an

amount of debt that was outstanding for longer than twelve months as it was viewed unlikely to be paid.

Sponsorship is the biggest contributor to the club's fundraising revenue. It's been disappointing to hear reports of player behaviour negatively affecting sponsors and potential sponsors views of either continuing or starting to sponsor the Belconnen Magpies Football Club. The football club cannot afford to miss out on sponsorship opportunities due to the behaviour of any individual. The onus is on the Board and the leaders within the Belconnen Magpies Football Club community to drive appropriate behavioural standards in 2020 and beyond.

Thank you to all the wonderful people that volunteer their time and effort to help run the Belconnen Magpies Football Club. Thank you to all the people that have supported me in my first year as Treasurer of the Belconnen Magpies Football Club. Thank you to both the members of the Executive and the members of the Board for supporting me in my transition to the role of Treasurer. Thank you to Glenn O'Sullivan, Ethan Bartlett and the team at SPA Accounting for their continued accounting support. Thank you to my workplace, BellcambersBarrett for encouraging me and supporting me in taking on this role. Last, but not least. Thanks to my wonderful wife Olivia for supporting me through all the challenges this role has thrown at me.

I look forward to the challenges of 2020 and returning the Belconnen Magpies to a much more prosperous financial position in the future.

Senior Football Co-ordinator's Report



A year that truly had everything. I want to thank the Board of the Belconnen Magpies Football Club for the continued support for myself and for giving me the opportunity to be the manager of this football club again this past season. It was a season that fluctuated with highs and lows and one that produced a lot of learnings for all involved.

Season 2019 was the club's most successful season in the past decade. Five out of our six teams made finals, four of those five made the Grand Final and one of those four, the Regional Men, won the Premiership and brought home the big prize.

To have four teams play in Grand Finals, we had the largest representation of any club in AFL Canberra over the Senior Grand Final days showing the depth, and the quality of the depth, we have at BMFC. We are a young club with lots of growing yet to come, but after the year we have just finished I am confident the club, as a whole, is going to become a dominant force in the near future.

In saying this, to have the majority of the 2019 Senior squad already sign back on for the 2020 season, and for the club to appoint a new Senior Coach in Brock Weston, the excitement and drive for the players is there to go one step better and bring home to the Adero Law Nest what we have all been chasing. The development of certain players over the past season has been incredible and to be able to see these players find another level in their own ability has been exciting to watch. Players such as Brad Hoffman, Tariku Firtzgerald-Holmes, Max Monaghan and Rhys Hartwig have proved they are dominant in their roles and when it's their time to go they are four of the best one-on-one players in the League.

The second grade men enjoyed a successful year finishing as minor premiers but unfortunately taking the hard road in the finals after losing the first Semi

to Eastlake and then eventually meeting them again in the Grand Final two weeks after beating Queanbeyan in the Preliminary final. It was a tough day at the office in the Grand Final, a low scoring affair eventually losing by 3 points to Eastlake 33 - 30

The Rising Stars had a difficult year, narrowly losing a number of games by less than a couple of goals which ultimately left them short of making finals. A tough year for a young group that consisted of only 4-8 top age players throughout the year means, like the club in general, there is room for the young players coming through to grow into leaders and senior footballers in the next couple of years as they naturally get older and gain more experience playing Rising Stars and Senior football.

Our Women's teams are continuing to improve. The first grade side, similar to the Men's, experienced some tougher challenges throughout the year with injuries and not as consistent performances it was as if they were timing their run to get it right at the back end of the season. It was all going to plan until like the other senior teams we hit a wall on Grand Final day, unfortunately losing to the favourites in Queanbeyan, 55 - 7.

Our 2nd grade women's team overcame a lack of numbers throughout the year, sometimes playing with only fourteen, and charged into the finals with an immense amount of excitement and adrenaline. Unfortunately a tough Eastlake team stopped the pursuit of the premiership in the second semi-final.

The Regional Men. This is the team that was able to get the job done on Grand Final day. This is the team that turned around a 100 point loss to Cootamundra in the early rounds of 2019 to end up beating them in the Grand Final by 8 points (46 -38). With a turnaround that started halfway through the season, we were still the underdog going into the finals series. Players such as Connor White, Connor Lee, Sam Telfer, Aidan Wenke all had outstanding seasons. Jace lemma finished third in the League's best and Fairest count again showing his consistency throughout the year. Personally I want to say a huge congratulations to the Regional Men's team and specifically the coach Brendan Trevaskis. Hurdles were jumped over and challenges were beaten all through the year, Congrats.

1st Grade Report

Another great year of on-field performances saw us again fall just short at the final hurdle. We again finished 2nd on the ladder after the home and away season with an 11-3-1 record and a percentage of 173. We established ourselves as a top-2 team in the competition and it always felt like we would be facing Ainslie at the business end of the season.

Unfortunately, and as we have experienced too often in recent times, we were not good enough in the Grand Final. Our performance in the Grand Final was nowhere near our best and came after one of our best wins of the year in a 10-point preliminary final victory over Queanbeyan.

With the benefit of some time, I have managed to move on from the disappointment of our Grand Final day performances and have taken the opportunity to refocus on the things that make our club such a successful place. It makes me so proud to be part of this football club with our on-field success and competing for or winning premierships across all our grades.

And I feel that off field, our club is in a great place with the feeling amongst our teams and our club. The genuine care and support we had for each other as we prepared for and played in our grand finals was a great example of this.

We had 33 players take the field in our first grade side this season, including debutants Sam Glyde (#584), Max Monaghan (#585), Zac Lindsay (#586) and Max Harper (#587).

We were led well by Captain Beau Walker and Vice-captain Ryan Turnbull. Beau was rewarded for a great season by winning his second Mulrooney Medal. We also had Beau Walker, Lex Bennett, James Bennett, Luke McKay and Isaac Taylor selected in the AFL Canberra Team of the Year.

We also have a number of players retiring or leaving our footy club and I'd like to recognise the contribution that they have each made over their careers:

- Blake Talsma played his 100th First Grade game this season, which is great recognition for a strong career at our club including the 2009 Premiership.
- Jeff Dowdell finishes with 41 First Grade games with a retirement in-between. We hope there is another comeback on the cards.
- Beau Walker one of our best players in recent times - Club captain, best and fairest and two-time Mulrooney medallist. We wish Beau all the best in Western Australia and hope he returns to BMFC one day soon.
- Chris York ends with 238 First Grade games. The 4th most in our Club's history, including the 2009 Premiership. A foundation block of our club over the last 15 years and a reason that guys have joined our club and a big reason why they have stayed.
- Lex Bennett ends with 266 First Grade games among 327 Club games, including the 2004 and 2009 Premierships. Lex was Captain for a record 9 seasons and the footy club wouldn't be where it is today without Lex's contribution.

As much as the players deserve recognition of the outstanding seasons they put together, it is equally important to recognise the outstanding contribution of so many of our volunteers and support staff who make this club what it is.

A very special thank you to the team managers - Terri Jamieson and Phil Batten. These two have, for a number of years now, made my life as a football coach so much easier by taking care of all the details so I could focus on football. I really appreciate the work both of you have put in over these years, the love and support you have given me, and the many laughs we have shared.

I'd also like to say a special thankyou to the rest of the first grade support team with Pete Dunn, Paul Gunn as timekeeper, Dyl Valentine and Sam O'Sullivan as our runners. There are also the various guys I roped in to do stats, the trainers and water runners. Thanks to you all.

We were again very lucky to have a great physio

and fitness team lead by Liam Slater and Liam Phillips. They were very well supported by Nic Rowston, Rob Jamieson and Dom Turner. These guys have prepared us so well and have shown a great commitment to our club and in seeking success with our playing group. Thanks guys.

As second grade coach he has been busy with his own side, but he has provided a huge amount of support to the First Grade team with his game day role, video reviews, stats and game planning, A great clubman.

The biggest reason I am stepping back from the coaching role next year is to have some more time to spend with my beautiful wife Sophie and daughter Poppy. Thanks to Sophie for all of her support over the last few years.

It's amazing how such a small change in the trajectory of the footy can have such a profound impact on the memory of a season. If a shot on goal in the last quarter grips slightly more in the grass, or comes off the boot at a marginally different angle, this review is likely written about a premiership winning team. Instead, the ball somehow doesn't move off the straight, cannoning into the post and here we are having lost a Grand Final by less than a kick.

In all honesty, we should not have put ourselves in that position. We had controlled the majority of the play, but that means nothing if that dominance is not reflected on the scoreboard. Maybe we got a bit overwhelmed on the big stage, thinking ahead instead of staying in the moment.

Whatever the reasons, throughout the Grand Final we struggled to play our best football consistently. We allowed Eastlake back in to a game that should have been out of reach. And it's a loss that is going to haunt me, and those involved and invested in the second grade side, for a while yet.

But at some stage, the pain from that day in September will subside, and we'll be able to look back on 2019 in a more rational way and see it for the successful season that it was. With a small injury list, particularly compared with 2018, the 2nd Grade side was able to get continuity in the playing group over the second half of the year, and developed into a tight-knit team as the season progressed.

For the first time in a couple of years, numbers were not an issue and it became very competitive for spots. This combined with several veteran First Grade players returning from injury through 2nd Grade, and the fantastic efforts of leaders Tom Baker and Carl Wenke, saw training standards a level above what they had been in 2018.

While there were some experienced heads guiding the way, the side was predominantly a young one. The enthusiasm that the younger brigade brought to the team was infectious, and was a key part in making the side such an enjoyable team to play with and a very easy team to coach.

On the development front, first year players out of the Rising Stars such as Tom Fekete, Tynan Doyle, David Sim and Alex Wenke all integrated seamlessly into the second grade side and ended the year as much better footballers than they started. Young interstate recruits also performed well, with, in particular, Nick Hay, Benson Ochieng, Max Harper and Oscar Smyth showcasing their considerable potential. Also pleasing was the improvement from established players such as Nick Kelly and Tom Baker, who put together career best seasons and are capable of finding further improvement in the coming years.

Luke McGilvray's match-winning ability was rewarded with him being named league Best and Fairest, with Tom Baker coming second, a fantastic effort from two guys who have been heavily involved in the second grade side over the past few years. It was great to see three 2nd Grade players, Henry Gowers, Joel Crakanthorp and Joey Pisciotta feature in Regional Grade's fantastic premiership win against the previously undefeated Cootamundra.

As many of you would know, the Grand Final also marked my last game as coach of the 2nd Grade side. I have thoroughly enjoyed the

experience, and a number of people deserve to be recognised for their efforts and guidance they have given me over the past two years.

First of all, thanks to Pete Dunn and Phil Batten, two volunteers who have put in countless hours at trainings and on game day over many years. Terri Jamieson as First Grade manager and Paul Gunn as the timekeeper again performed their duties with distinction. The club is lucky to have volunteers as reliable and experienced as these four, and they have made my role much easier than it could have been.

Our medical and conditioning staff, led by Physio Liam Phillips and Strength and Conditioning coach Liam Slater, were again instrumental in ensuring players across the Senior Squad were fit while also minimising injuries and getting players to return to the field as quickly as possible.

Thanks also to the 2nd Grade coaching staff in Chris Calvert, John Gregory, Carl Wenke. Being a playing coach, it's essential that you have complete trust in the people who are making decisions from the box, and with those three at the helm, I had nothing to worry about. The First Grade coaching staff (Tim Garrett, Dave Bennett, Lexie Bennett, Tom Fisher and Aaron Tyndall) have also taught me plenty and provided considerable support.

Thanks to all those injured players who fulfilled game day roles when required, but particularly to Michael McQueen, who ran the rotations from the bench on game day, giving us some much needed continuity in that role.

President Scott Reid, Football Director Glenn O'Sullivan and Football Manager Jack Harper were always available to help with any issues that arose, and I'm thankful for all their assistance and support over the past two years.

A big thank you also must go to First Grade coach James Bennett. James has been a huge influence on my own footy career over 20+ years, and his advice and leadership over the last two years have taught me so much about coaching also. He has been a fantastic asset for this club for a long time and hopefully the switch back to being just a player can lengthen his career by a few more years!

As usual, my partner Erin offered me fantastic support. She was always understanding of the significant time commitment that coaching can be, while also being a great source of advice and a loyal supporter.

Lastly, thanks to all the second grade players. We were tough to play against, trained hard and celebrated each other's success. While we just missed out on achieving the ultimate goal, the last two years have been an immensely rewarding experience for me and hopefully you've all enjoyed it as much as I have.

Rising Stars Report



Coach - Bobby Moroney Manager - Emma Simpson

The 2019 Rising Stars season can best be described as a development year for our club. Following a challenging 2018 where we succeeded beyond expectations despite more than half the squad coming from the Magpies Junior Club, it was identified early that we were going to field an even younger side in 2019. With only six true Under 18 players, and two over age, we needed to create a system and culture with a vision beyond 2019. Knowing that the majority of players in 2018 were playing 2-3 games a week, the club created a Rising Stars Football Charter with a focus on player welfare and player development. In line with our new football charter, there were three goals for 2019:

- Ensure we had a balanced approach between supporting our player's desire to play as much football as possible and monitoring their welfare throughout the season;
- Create opportunities to develop their skills alongside our First and Second Grade players; and,
- Establish an enjoyable environment where our players felt like they were contributing towards the future successes of our club.

Our values for 2019 were captured in one word – TEAM. We broke this into four key areas; Teamwork, Enjoyment, Accountability, and Maximum effort. We agreed that if we collectively excelled in each of these areas then we would give ourselves an opportunity at success. Finishing the season with a 4-12 record may suggest that we were unable to live up to these values. And at times it was a challenge getting the majority of our group to buy into the values at the same time. But I believe that for most of the season our boys gave everything to not only play by the values we set but to also represent the Belconnen Football Club with pride. On average we were within two goals at 3/4

time in 10 of our losses. This effort can not be understated when 76 per cent of our squad were under 17 years old, and eight players were under 16. The ability for our boys to train with the senior group at times, particularly prior to finals was extremely beneficial. Most importantly, thank you to Emma Simpson for her commitment and support as our team manager. Emma worked tirelessly to ensure not only that the boys were ready on game days, but their personal wellbeing was always monitored. Her compassion, empathy and patience were critical enablers for me all year.

WOW, WOW, WOW WHAT A YEAR OF FOOTBALL

This year the team played in a Regional competition, which saw us up against Cootamundra, Goulburn, Cooma, Yass and Murrumbateman. This meant that there was a little bit more travelling than normal, which meant more team bonding on the bus.

Round one saw us have our first bus trip travelling to Cootamundra. The season didn't start the way we would have liked. It was a similar result to the scores we had in a number of games in the previous year, it was 109 point loss. The next couple of games were losses as well but only by about 20 points. Round four was our first win, playing Yass at Yass with a 45 point win. By the half way mark of the season we were 2 wins and 5 losses. After the Cooma match, Round seven, I had a discussion with the team on where we were heading for the rest of the season. We just seemed to be turning up to each game and not playing to the best of our ability. I think that they had fallen into a bad routine: thinking that they were going to get beaten every week like last year. I said to the team that they needed to start believing in themselves, as they had a lot more ability than they were showing on the field. After that talk we won the next three games. Round ten saw us having to forfeit to Cootamundra due to a number of players being away or injured. We won the next two games, even the game I had to pull my own boots on to play to have enough numbers. Round 14 was a loss to Yass. This was a wake-up call to us if we wanted to play finals this year. With a better second half, the end of the season we ended up with 8 wins and 7 losses.

We ended up third on the ladder which meant that our semifinal would be against Goulburn at the Adero Law Nest. Goulburn had already beaten us once this year so I knew this game wouldn't be easy. To the boys credit they went out and played the best game of footy they had played in the two years I had been coaching them. I didn't even have to move a magnet on the board the whole game. The rotations and match-ups worked out perfectly. The team played to our game plan and we came away with a 104 point win (Belconnen 19.9-123 to Goulburn 2.5-17). As a coach these are the days you remember, the team was so clinical with the ball and didn't let their opponents back into the game at any point

The preliminary final was against Cooma at Football Park, Phillip. Cooma had beaten us twice during the season and only one win to us in a close game. We got a little jump on them in the first quarter, being up by 9 points. Second quarter saw us go to sleep and Cooma had got right back into

the match and lead at half time by 19 points. It was going to take a big effort from the team to turn the game around as we usually don't come from behind to win matches. The third quarter the team turned it around to be in front by the end of the third quarter by 4 points. The final quarter could have gone either way with both teams playing some fantastic football. In the end we prevailed with a hard fought win by 14 points. Our kicking in this game could have let us down but the hard work and persistence of the team on the field got us the win. This meant that we would be up against the undefeated Cootamundra in the grand final.

During the season we played Cootamundra twice with one forfeit. The first game we were beaten by 109 points. The second game was a lot closer with Cootamundra only winning by 11 points at the Adero Law Nest. They only won that game because we switched off in the last five minutes of the game. In that game, I made some significant changes to the team to get the right match-ups on the key players. These match-ups seemed to have worked in the second game as it was a big turnaround from our first game against them.

Grand Final Day: the day players and coaches live for, whatever grade of football you play. In a grand final you can only pick 22 players to take the field, so there were players that were going to miss out, but to win a grand final it's not just about that one game, it's the whole season. Jack Sheers tore his hamstring the week before against Cooma so he was unlucky to miss out on a spot. Todd Trevaskis was an emergency for Geoff Jones who had dislocated his knee the week before against Cooma. To play Geoff needed to pass a fitness test the morning of the grand final, which he did so Todd missed out as well. Aiden McShane, Brendan Hiscock and Sean Perrett were all very unlucky to miss a game as well, these players trained and played all year. Thanks to all of these players who played this year for us and helped us get to the grand final.

The day of the grand final was a good day for football, nice and sunny with a slight breeze. The first quarter was a hard fought quarter with neither team taking any real advantage (Belconnen 1.4-10 to Cootamundra 1.2-8). Second quarter was much like the first with the ball rebounding from one end of the field to the other. Scoring opportunities were hard to come by with both teams putting pressure on the ball carrier and not giving an inch. At the end of the second quarter the score read Belconnen 3.4-22 to Cootamundra 2.8 -20. It was still anyone's game. Third quarter saw Cootamundra come out and hit us with both barrels. To the team's credit they were able to focus on their football and not get drawn into Cootamundra's style of play. At the end of the third quarter Cootamundra had edged their way in front by four points (Belconnen 4.8-32 to Cootamundra 4.12-36), again at this point it was still anyone's game. Whoever was going to win this game was going to be the team with the best fitness, the most determination and the biggest heart. This game was not pretty to watch as it was a fight till the very end, how any grand final should be. The final siren sounded, and we had beaten the undefeated Cootamundra by eight points (Belconnen 6.10-46 to Cootamundra 4.14-38). As you can tell by the low scores and many more points than goals, it was a hard fought match to the end. All I asked of the team at the beginning of the game was to play a full four
